Here is the latest Wallingford Area neighbourhood update from Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Nikki Leese and PCSO Emma Wilkes.

Local Priority

We have received two reports in recent weeks of bag snatches in the Wallingford area. As we take this type of crime very seriously, the Neighbourhood Policing Team has decided to focus on patrolling our local parks and Town Centre in an effort to deter any criminals from committing further offences of this nature. If you see anything untoward or anyone acting suspiciously please contact us on the non-emergency number 101, or if a crime is in progress dial 999.

Theft of Vehicles

Although this type of offence does not occur often we have received two reports of Theft of Vehicles in and around the Wallingford area. Please check to make sure that you secure your vehicle and once inside your home hang the keys away from the letterbox as it has also been known for offender/s to use an unknown instrument to hook them off sideboards and key hooks to steal vehicles. If you see anyone looking out of place or acting suspicious in the area please contact us on the non-emergency number 101 and report it.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

We have noticed an increase in ASB, along with criminal damage, around the area of Walter Bigg Way, Wallingford. Young people are starting to congregate under the archway or hiding in the bin store and then committing the offence of criminal damage to garden ornaments and fences. We will now be stepping up our patrols in this area and will be asking for all names and addresses of anyone hanging around.

Criminal Damage

An increase in criminal damage has occurred to the garages along Allnut Avenue, Wallingford. It looks as though the offender/s have used some form of instrument to prise away the locks located on the garage doors. Thankfully the owners of the garages have put substantial bolts on the doors so no offender/s have gained access into the garages. This area will be patrolled on a regular basis. If you do see anything suspicious then I am urging you to contact us on the non-emergency number 101 to report it.
