#### Local Plan exhibition

More than 60 residents came to the latest Local Plan exhibition run by South Oxfordshire District Council and Crowmarsh Parish Council in the Pavilion on Saturday 14th March. Thanks for all your comments and ideas about the shortlist of sites proposed for housing over the next 15 years. The District Council will consider all these local views in drawing up detailed plans for the village. SODC is looking to allocate land for at least 48 homes at Crowmarsh Gifford.

The short-listed sites are the Newnham Manor caravan park (site ref. CRO6) and the land south of that (CRO7 – using only part of this site). Both these sites proved the most popular for development with local people at the last two exhibitions, and they were again well received this time. The main comments raised were support for re-using this partly brownfield site close to the centre of the village, and suggestions about access options to the A4074 to avoid adding to road safety concerns outside the school.

The consultation runs until Thursday 2nd April. The next stage after this will be a consultation on preferred options in the autumn.

# Parish Council elections – could you join the Parish Council?

Alongside the General Election on Thursday 7th May, we will also have elections for South Oxfordshire District Council and Crowmarsh Parish Council (which includes Crowmarsh Gifford, North Stoke and Mongewell).

The parish council has 12 seats: nine for Crowmarsh Gifford plus three for North Stoke and Mongewell. All 12 are up for election this year and anyone on the electoral roll in the parish, working in the parish or living within three miles can be eligible.

If you are interested in becoming a parish councillor, nomination forms (available on the District Council website) need to be handed in by 4pm on 9th April at the Old Abbey House, Abingdon. This is not as convenient as usual since the SODC offices in Crowmarsh were destroyed. If you require any advice or a copy of the form, please contact me or look on the SODC website,

Voter registration has changed, so there is extra publicity about how to make sure you are registered to vote in all three elections. Do contact the District Council if you have not had a confirmation letter.




#### The 1926 General Strike

The 1926 General Strike lasted nine days, from Tuesday 4th to Thursday 13th May. The strike was called by the General Council of the Trade Union Congress in an unsuccessful attempt to force Stanley Baldwin's Government to prevent wage reduction and the worsening of conditions for 800,000 locked-out miners. Their wages had been reduced since the end of the First World War, from £6 a week to £3 18s (£3.90p) a week. In fact the Samuel Commission, (a Royal Commission that looked into miners' wages and conditions) recommended a wage reduction of 13.5%.

The Government had prepared for the strike over the previous nine months. They used the Army and raised large numbers of volunteers, largely from the middle-classes, who were able to maintain the essential services. Unlike the miners' strikes of the 1970s, there was little violence, in fact there were several accounts of football matches being played between the strikers and the police. There were society girls peeling potatoes and running soup kitchens in Hyde Park, Oxbridge undergrads and retired army officers driving trains and trams, but England-Australia Test matches carried on as normal.

On 12th May, the TUC visited Downing Street and stated that they would end the strike if the Government would make the employers take back the striking miners. This, the Government refused to do. Thus, the TUC was forced to end the dispute without any such agreement.

The first thing that happened in Wallingford was that Special Constables were called out to patrol the town and Crowmarsh throughout the night. The railway workers at Wallingford Station ceased work on Monday night, but reported for work after a few days on strike. Wallingford Grammar School's annual sports day was postponed indefinitely. On 5th May, a Food and Coal Committee was formed in Wallingford for the whole Borough and Crowmarsh. Major Hugh Rankin was the Officer in charge of securing voluntary assistance. After three days he had secured the services of 42 ladies and 99 men from Wallingford and Crowmarsh.



As the rail workers were on strike most goods had be transported by road; all the lorries were driven by volunteer drivers, usually during the night. It was found necessary to set up a canteen in the Market Place which was open from 11pm until 6am, and was run by Mrs Rogerson, Mrs Hedges, Mrs Nelson and Miss Hendley.

The Emergency News bulletins were broadcast to the public from loudspeakers set up on the verandah of the Berks and Oxon Advertiser's Office (next door to the Dolphin Public House). The larger shops in Wallingford also had wireless loudspeakers set up inside. Arthur Jenkins, the news agent, put loudspeakers on a van and drove around Crowmarsh; this allowed the news to reach the villagers.

To help with the shortage of coal, two trees were cut down in the Kine Croft, and the wood was distributed to houses throughout the town. Sir George Rowley, of Riverside, Wallingford, who was enrolled as special constable, placed his car at the disposal of the police. The car was used on two occasions to take a prisoner from Wallingford to Oxford jail.

When the Strike ended, a service of Thanksgiving was held at St Mary's Church.

The miners, however, continued with the strike until November, when most went back to work. They were forced to accept lower wages and longer hours, and many were not offered jobs and so were unemployed for many years. The strikers must have felt they had achieved nothing.

The answers to these questions, and many more, can be found at the Benson Community Health Fair to be held on Saturday 25 April from 10-1pm in the Benson Parish Hall. We are looking forward to an informative, entertaining and fun event, with opportunities to ask questions of health experts, find out about healthy living, and have a go at various sports and activities. There will be a treasure hunt around the Fair and free refreshments.

It is never too early to start thinking about our health, and the Fair will provide something for everyone aged from 0 to 100. There will be short talks from surgery staff and representatives of health related organisations, on topics ranging from A Day in the Life of Millstream Surgery to Emergency First Aid, Mental Health, Parenting Teenagers and Living with Cancer. There will be activity taster sessions, from the gentle Tai Chi and Exerstrider, to the more active Zumba and Nordic Walking. A Health Walk and a Benson Striders run will take place during the morning and there will be table tennis and tennis, a rowing machine, Tai Chi, Zumba, Nordic Walking and more.

The Fire Service plan to bring a Fire Engine and Thames Valley Police will bring a police car; they will be sharing the Parish Hall Car

Park with the Bicycle Repair man who will be offering bike health checks.

It's important to keep our brains healthy too, and the Fair will also focus on mental, emotional and social health. Local clubs and groups have been invited to display publicity information, and some of them will take an active part in the event. For example, the Roke and Benson Brass Band will join us, and they are keen to attract new players. Research shows that playing a musical instrument can bring physical and mental health benefits – it can lower blood pressure, decrease heart rate, reduce stress, and lessen anxiety and depression – to say nothing of the potential social health benefits of playing in a band or orchestra and making new friends.

Look out for the full programme which will be available from early April in the Benson Library, Millstream Surgery and Lloyds Pharmacy. Entrance to the fair is free, and whatever your age we are confident that you will find ideas, information and opportunities. We hope to see you there.

Our March speaker was Jill Carey, who was one of "Three Birders in the Bush". She began by assuring us that she was not a "Twitcher". Twitchers, she said, just count birds they have seen, whereas Birders observe and study wild birds in their natural habitat, (the birds' habitat that is).

This intrepid trio took their camper van, binoculars and cameras for six months on a

great sweep round Northern Australia, from Perth to Broome to Darwin, with a diversion to Alice Springs, and on to Brisbane. The result, for us, was a panorama of how amazingly beautiful Australia is, even away from the coast and into the vast Interior.

Mrs Carey's pictures of mountains, rivers and huge skies and spaces were remarkable. Brilliantly coloured birds came as startling extras, as did close-ups of plants, fruits, flowers and termites. A wonderful and exotic reminder for those of her audience who had been to Australia of what is there, and an incentive for those who had not been to get up and go if possible.





#### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 5th March 2015

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Stephen Brown, Francesca Jones, Andrew Johnson, Anne Lowes, Stephen Sherbourne. Stuart Soames and Fleur Stevenson, Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer), Susan Rance (Clerk) and County Councillor Mark Gray.

Three members of the public attended part of the meeting.

Apologies: from Councillor Faye Cheeseman and District Councillor Kristina Crabbe.

#### Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Cllr Sherbourne reported a leaking water pipe at the allotments. Mr John Bellamy has been re-appointed as a trustee to the Wallingford Bridge Estate Charity.

#### Finance

Payments made in February were agreed. £1014 was paid to Arrow Fencing for work on the children's play area. £1752 was paid to Tom Cottrell for work on the allotments.

An enquiry had been received from a prospective allotment holder. There is a plot that could be made available after removal of tree stumps. It was agreed to obtain a quote from Dave Cottrell for carrying out this work.

The financial report showed total funds at 28 February of £126,455. The estimated figure at year-end was £124,549. Interest received on the deposit account was £194 for the year to date. A breakdown of administration costs was presented. A recent £818 solar electricity rebate will bring the total rebate for the year to over £2000, in line with the budget.

#### **Grass-cutting contract**

Three quotes received for the main grasscutting contract were discussed in detail.

It was decided that Scofell be awarded the contract for one year. This includes the recreation ground and other areas in Crowmarsh Gifford, Jethro Tull Gardens and the grass outside the school, plus the North Stoke recreation ground, which should be cut five times per year and CIIr Soames notified after each cut. The grass cutting contract for Newnham Murren churchyard was treated separately and Tom Cottrell is the contractor preferred by the church: his price was higher but includes removal of the grass cuttings.

It was agreed to appoint Roger Syms as our internal auditor at a cost of £480, a saving of £120.

The publications scheme under the Freedom of Information Act was approved with three minor amendments and will be posted on the noticeboard and the website.

#### **Grants and donations**

North Stoke Village Hall Committee: a grant of £760 was agreed for grass cutting and grounds maintenance.

Enrych Oxfordshire (formerly Ryder-Cheshire Volunteers), who support adults with a physical disability to enjoy leisure, learning and sport: a donation of £250 was agreed.

# South Oxfordshire Local Plan 2031 Refined Options

# Community Infrastructure Levy Draft Charging Schedule

South Oxfordshire District Council have considered the representations from the earlier

Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule and are now asking for comments on the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Draft Charging Schedule, which sets out the proposed charging rates for developments in South Oxfordshire to pay for infrastructure. The consultation runs until 26th March 2015.

# **Environment and Recreation Ground Committee**

Plans were discussed to change two unused changing rooms at the pavilion into meeting space. Some councillors had visited the pavilion to view the facilities, but more detailed information was needed about the likely demand for additional bookings. After discussion, it was agreed that a pedestrian crossing for The Street should be a higher priority for the council's expenditure. The management committee will discuss options for use of the space at the pavilion at their next meeting in May.

Cllr Lowes requested litter bins at the foot of Constitution Hill, Mongewell, near the bus stop on the A4074 near CABI and a litter bin and a dog bin are needed near the A4074 underpass. Cllr Brown requested deterrent signs to discourage anti-social behaviour with regard to dog fouling.

#### **Traffic and Transport Committee**

Cllr Sherbourne reported on the Truvelo speed camera system. It was hoped that the police would provide support by enforcing this as necessary to slow speeding traffic on the A4074 Portway. Cllr Sherbourne is liaising with Superintendent Andy Boyd and will keep County Cllr Gray informed. Cllr Jones hoped to obtain a quote for a pedestrian crossing at the Portway.

#### **County Councillor's report**

Mark Gray reported that the County Council is considering devolving some services to parishes. It is hoped to resurface the A4074 at Benson. 91% of students are now getting into their first choice of secondary school.

Cllr Gray will send the specification for the proposed pedestrian crossing to Cllr Brown. The report on the public transport review

should come before OCC very soon and Cllr Gray was urged to support the hourly 134 service, which is of great value to the local community, and report back to Cllr Jones.

#### **District Councillor's report**

District Councillor Crabbe submitted a written report on meetings with Thames Water. Council officers met Thames Water for a progress meeting on 22 January, where John Backley reiterated the request for a follow-up public meeting to discuss the results of the sewer flow monitoring. The timing is in Thames Water's hands while we await the conclusion of the work and the analysis of the data.

The key actions for Thames Water in Crowmarsh Gifford are to do a 'look and lift' survey, to carry out a CCTV drain survey by the end of May, to do flow surveys and to monitor through the winter to assess infiltration and provide a summary report. They are being urged to respond to Cllr Crabbe and residents soon.

#### Correspondence

The Chairman and Clerk had received invitations to a reception at RAF Benson on Thursday 21st May.

Mr Richard Neale wrote asking to give a presentation on a proposed radar survey of archaeological features in Crowmarsh. The chairman would invite Mr Neale to speak at the Annual Parish Meeting, but it was noted that the parish council could only give grants to societies and organisations, not individuals.

The Riverside Meadows and Castle Meadows consultative group was meeting on Tuesday 17th March at the headquarters of the Earth Trust, who manage the sites for SODC.

The River Users Group (RUG3) met on 26th February. The walkway across the weir at Benson (part of the Thames Path) is now open again after repairs.

#### **Next Parish Council Meeting**

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday

9th April, starting at 7.30pm. The Annual Parish Meeting will be on Tuesday 19th May, starting at 7.30pm, either at the school or at the village hall.
