



Deadline threatens mixed age couples' benefits

Legislation that will come into effect on 15 May 2019 could mean difficult choices for mixed-age couples, deciding whether to live together or separately.

The law has changed so that, from that date, a "mixed age couple" (in which one partner is a pensioner and the other is under pension age) will be considered to be a "working age couple" for the purposes of means-tested benefits. This means that if they apply for benefits after that date, they will need to apply for Universal Credit instead of Pension Credit, leaving them much worse off financially, as the standard rate of Pension Credit guarantee is paid at a higher level than the standard rate of Universal Credit.

From 15 May, both partners in a couple will need to have reached state pension age in order to claim Pension Credit or pension-age Housing Benefit. Mixed-age couples will face a stark choice between living separately so that one of them can receive Pension Credit or living together and claiming Universal Credit.

However, the new ruling only applies to NEW claims, so those already receiving pensioner benefits before 15 May will keep those benefits unless their circumstances change.

If you are in a mixed-age relationship and claiming or expecting to claim benefits, Citizens Advice encourages you to examine your financial situation before the crucial date of 15 May. However, claims for Pension Credit

can be backdated for up to three months, so on or before 13 August 2019 claimants can start to receive these benefits if they meet the entitlement conditions on 14 May.

Past Times: Fire at Newnham Croft

The picturesque house of Newnham Croft was located opposite St Mary Magdalene's Church, Crowmarsh. It was built in 1903, after the site had been purchased in 1902 by Mr John Whittaker-Ellis, Lord Mayor of London in 1881. Newnham Croft was built by his relative Mr Corbould-Ellis. His wife, Mrs Eveline Corbould-Ellis was an excellent miniaturist painter, and her cameos of Queen Victoria and George V were exceptional. In June 1904 she gave an exhibition at Newnham Croft.

In 1909 the house was being rented by an author named Mr E le Breton Martin. On Monday 13th October, shortly before 9 o'clock in the morning, the kitchen chimney caught fire. The roof was made of thatch and Mr le Breton Martin used his garden hose to spray water onto the roof, but was unable to stop the fire spreading. With the help of employees from Wilders, Phillips and Bowden's, they started to remove the furniture from the bedrooms.

Mr le Breton Martin had a narrow escape: when attempting to remove some of his bedroom furniture he was struck on the back by a burning rafter, which also cut off his escape route through the bedroom door and he was forced to jump out of the window, a drop of some 15 feet.

Finally, the Wallingford Fire Brigade was called and they connected their hose to the South Oxford Water Company water main that was laid along the Street. Meanwhile, much of the furniture on the ground floor had been removed. By about 1pm the fire was put out, but most of the thatch had been destroyed and the rafters were exposed.

The fire damage had been confined to the roof, but there was a lot of water damage to the bedrooms and ground floor. The cost of the damage was put at £550.

The house was quickly repaired and the roof was tiled with slate. Newnham Croft was demolished in 1967 to construct the entrance to Thames Mead. This was a very attractive house and today its demolition would not have been allowed.



Wallingford U3A

In the 1920s London Underground posters advertised all day countryside outings to Edgware and Hounslow. At our March meeting, we learnt about more than just posters when Dr Graham Twemlow spoke on the Golden Age of Posters in Great Britain.

Coloured picture posters appeared first in Paris in the late 19th Century. Although they were difficult to produce, they rapidly became popular worldwide, bringing bright sheets of colour into grey urban life. Artists like Toulouse -Lautrec, Graham Sutherland, Eric Gill and Paul Nash designed some, reproductions of which can now be found for sale in Ikeal

Advertisements were not always accurate. One railway poster in the 1920s made Southport look like the French Riviera. A contemporary photograph of the huddled reality showed it differently! "Skegness is so bracing" was cheerfully more honest.

Wonderfully illustrated, Dr Twemlow's talk kept us fascinated and laughing through this slice of British history. We are grateful to him.

On 3rd April our speaker is His Honour Patrick Eccles QC, a former Judge, who will talk about his work in the judiciary.

On 25th April we visit Bletchley Park, the home of the WWII Code Breakers and birthplace of the modern computer. There are also interesting gardens and several cafes on site.

Know this isn't Love – coercive control campaign

Victims First, which supports victims of crime and abuse across Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire, has launched a campaign to raise awareness of coercive control and emotional abuse in relationships.

The campaign is called 'Know this isn't Love' and focuses on early warning signs of controlling behaviour and emotional abuse to help victims identify any potential signs within their own relationships and seek support.

Coercive control became a criminal offence in 2015 and involves an act or a pattern of acts of assault, threats, humiliation and intimidation or other abuse by a perpetrator that is used to harm, punish or frighten their victim.

Although many people associate domestic abuse with physical violence, coercive control recognises the damaging impact of other forms of abuse in relationships as well.

Some examples of this type of abuse include: isolation from friends and family, depriving someone of basic needs such as food, monitoring their time and activities, taking control over aspects of their everyday life (e.g. where they can go, who they can see, what they can wear and when they can sleep), repeatedly putting them down, such as saying 'you're worthless', humiliating, degrading or dehumanising them, controlling their finances, as well as threats or intimidation.

The campaign focuses on various aspects of emotional abuse and controlling behaviour, told through both male and female examples and including examples from same-sex relationships.

Victims First is managed by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for the Thames Valley and supports all victims of crime regardless of whether the crime has been reported to the police.



The turbulent lifetime of **Thomas** Vachell

Tony Hadland will talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) on Wednesday 10th April about the turbulent lifetime of Thomas Vachell.

Thomas Vachell was the heir of an old Reading gentry family. His wife was a Reade from Abingdon. His story spans five monarchs and four changes of religion. He became the most fined man in Oxfordshire, his wealth was seized in a government raid and, as a result of 'swimming against the tide', he fell out with his wife. Thomas Vachell's story illustrates some of the huge changes England went through in the Tudor and early Stuart era - but it has a fairly happy ending!

Our speaker is a retired chartered building surveyor, information scientist and operational risk manager. Today, Tony is a historian, writer and broadcaster specialising in bicycle history and various aspects of local and family history. Since retiring the first time, he has been administrator of the Vale & Downland Museum and editor of Oxfordshire Family Historian.



Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 7th March

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Denise Hall, David Rowley, Stephen Sherbourne, Andrew Johnson, Francesca Jones, Stuart Soames, Liz Ryall, Fleur Stevenson and Patricia Millar, Sue Rance (Clerk) and Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer), County Councillor Mark Gray and District Councillor Sue Cooper.

An apology for absence was received from Councillor Topliss.

Matters arising from the previous meeting

The replacement noticeboards have been installed and Cllr Jones was thanked for all her hard work on this project.

The Finance Officer confirmed that the new grass cutting contractor has sufficient public liability insurance cover. A new online payments system allows the Finance Officer to put invoices onto the system but all payments must be authorised by two councillors.

A useful meeting was held to discuss plans for the District Council's new offices and to express our wish for high environmental standards and flexible community facilities, as well as parking for weekend events.

Finance

Payments made in February were approved including £810 to Arrow Fencing for installing new noticeboards and £480 for new arches at the playground. Two payments to Eibe for £36,000 and £34,000 for the new playground were discussed but not confirmed for payment until itemized invoices are received.

The financial summary for the year to date showed income £178,000 and expenditure £202,000. The playground project affected the

figures significantly.

It was agreed to donate £100 to Clean Slate, an organisation providing support for victims of abuse in Oxfordshire.

Allotment invoices for the coming year will be sent out in April. There are three vacant plots and applications are invited.

District Councillor's report

Cllr Sue Cooper reported that Bin Zone recycling wheels, giving information on recycling and waste, will be distributed with Crowmarsh News. The SODC council tax levy is to increase by about £5 per annum for a Band D house.

The Newnham Manor development application, the Parish Council's preferred housing site, is expected to go to committee in April. The Oxfordshire Plan 2050 consultation will finish on 24th March.

County Councillor's report

Cllr Mark Gray reported that the OCC council tax levy is to increase by about £42 for a Band D house. This is regrettable but necessary because of cuts in funding from central government.

Street lamps are to be replaced over the next 3-4 years with lower energy LED units, giving savings within the next four years. The new ones will have electric car charging points. It may be possible to switch them off at night if appropriate.

The results of speed checks last summer have now been received and need analysing.

The County Council will spend one billion pounds from borrowing and growth deals on infrastructure over the next ten years. This will focus on roads and schools. Contributions from developers will be used to pay back the money borrowed.

Councillor Gray is compiling a list of roads which are in a bad state and suggestions were put to him of several in the parish that need urgent attention.

In future when utility service companies need to carry out work in the road, they will have to apply for permission from the County Council before they start, which should improve coordination. Cllr Gray will ask for details of expenditure of the contributions received from the Stephens Field developers in connection with the access and parking issues. Residents will be asked for their views before any decisions are made. Cllr Johnson asked for improved signage to the recreation ground from The Street.

A Community Transport Officer has been appointed. There is spare capacity for the Comet minibus service in the Wallingford area. Cllr Millar will report the untidy state of the grid over the culvert at North Stoke, and ask the County Council to remove the orange fencing.

Neighbourhood Plan

A meeting is to be arranged of the Steering Group to discuss the implications to the Neighbourhood Plan of the SODC Draft Local Plan 2011-2034.

Environment & recreation ground

The committee met on Monday 18th February. Quotes are being obtained for repairing or replacing the shutters and electrical safety work is to go ahead. The hard courts had been pressure washed. Consideration is to be given to converting one of the redundant changing rooms to provide a Parish Council office.

Update on playground and gym project

The play area is almost complete and most of the planting has been done. The Finance Officer has contacted the council's insurers to ensure that the necessary insurance cover is in place. The picnic benches near the zip wire need a suitable surface underneath. The temporary safety fencing will be kept up after handover to protect the grass until 5th April, just before the official opening.

A vote of thanks was made to Cllrs Johnson and Rowley and all those involved for carrying this tremendous project through to completion.

Councillor Lorraine Hillier, Chairman of SODC, will perform the opening ceremony on Sunday

7th April at 12.30 for 12.45. All are welcome. The cubs and scouts will run a barbecue, the pre-school will have a cake stall and the Roke and Benson Brass Band will provide music.

Traffic and transport

Cllr Sherbourne reported that signs powered by mains electricity would require an arrangement with Scottish and Southern Electricity and they could not be moved once fixed. After discussion it was agreed that two solar-powered signs would be purchased.

Cllr Jones was thanked for representing Crowmarsh as Parish Transport Rep for many years. Several points were noted from the meeting held on 20th February. Mr Chris Strange will obtain a quote from RefreshPro for cleaning graffiti from the three bus shelters in Crowmarsh.

Strategic priorities

The proposed pedestrian crossing at Portway on the A4074 remains at the top of the strategic priorities list, followed by a crossing in The Street at Crowmarsh. Cllr Sherbourne suggested that a residents' survey could be carried out inviting ideas for other projects: this will be discussed at the June meeting.

Outside bodies

Planning permission has been granted for an extension to the village hall.

Cllr Ryall had been unable to attend the River Users' Group 3 meeting on 28th February, but it was reported that a 5.7% increase in the licence fee has been approved for 2019 / 2020, the cost of the public moorings in Wallingford will go up to £10 per night and it has been decided to bring back resident lock and weir keepers at every lock.

Other matters

The revised emergency plan was approved and will be circulated to SODC, the County Council and to all listed in the document. Cllr Jones was thanked for her painstaking work on this. A new coordinator will be needed.

The District Council had asked for suggestions of street names for the CABI housing development: seven names were put forward.

Elections

Elections for parish and district councillors are to be held on Thursday 2nd May. Nominations are invited for new parish councillors: the deadline for submitting nomination forms to SODC is 4pm on Wednesday 3rd April. Forms are available from the parish clerk or SODC.

Next meeting

The next meeting will be on Thursday 4th April at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall starting at 7pm (note earlier start time). Highways officers Ian Marshall and Jason Sherwood will attend the meeting to discuss the proposed Toucan crossing at Portway.

The Annual Parish Meeting for all electors will be held at the school on Thursday 16th May at 7.00 for 7.30pm, subject to the school hall being available. All are welcome.


