



Pump Hunt for Sewage Station Owners

Next year, Thames Water is to take on the responsibility for around 4,000 sewage pumping stations from property owners and managers. The utility will take over electricity and maintenance costs under new legislation, potentially saving customers thousands of pounds.

However, it is now asking for your help in tracking 1,800 'missing' stations that are privately owned.

The utility, which serves 15 million customers across London and the Thames Valley, will take responsibility for these pumping stations in October 2016, but needs to track down the 1,800 that are currently off its radar.

New legislation means sewage pumping stations, which power wastewater away from properties and out into the public sewer pipe network, currently owned and maintained by customers will become legally owned and operated by the local water company.

The pumping stations are found in all shapes and sizes, and can be in places where there are a number of properties needing to connect to the public sewer network. Customers will know they have one as they'll be paying to maintain and power them.

Jerry White, of Thames Water, said: "This is really good news for customers. We'd urge anyone who thinks they may have one to get in touch so we can check they are eligible for the transfer of ownership. In some cases, as well as electricity savings, maintaining and replacing pumps can cost thousands of pounds so it's an excellent deal for them.

"We believe we know where approximately half of the stations we need to take over are, but really need help to find the other 1,800. Please get in touch if you think this applies to you and we can take on the responsibility forever."

The Case of Mr Coker's Forgetfulness

On Saturday 9th July 1921, at Caversham Petty Sessions, there appeared Ernest Coker, landlord of The Bell Inn, Crowmarsh. He was charged with supplying intoxicating liquor in an unsealed bottle to a person under the age of 14 years, and also for selling a quantity of less than a pint of stout, for drinking off the premises.

The facts of the case were that Crowmarsh's eagle eyed village constable saw the boy named Griffin, aged 8 and half years, leaving The Bell, with a half pint of stout in a unsealed bottle.

The constable took the boy back into The Bell, where Mr Coker's daughter admitted she had forgotten to put a label on the bottle (which went around the cap and thus sealing the bottle and making it legal to sell). She was also

not aware it was against the law to sell less than a pint for consumption off the premises.

Mr Coker in court admitted that he was unaware that it was against the law to sell less than a pint for consumption off the premises; the fact that the boy was only eight years old and it was illegal to sell beer to a child under the age of 14 seems to have been forgotten. The police superintendent stated that Mr Coker had kept The Bell Inn for over seven years and this was the first complaint against him. The Chairman said that because of Mr Coker's previous good record, the Bench decided not to place a fine.

Did Mr Coker really not know the law on selling beer for consumption off the premises or was Crowmarsh's village policeman being over-zealous?

Our Celebrating Agatha Christie Weekend

Building on last year's successful event, a second 'Celebrating Agatha Christie Weekend' throughout Wallingford and Cholsey will be held from Friday 18th to Sunday 20th September.

You can discover the real life of worldrenowned author Agatha Christie in the ancient town of Wallingford and the neighbouring parish of Cholsey, where she lived quietly as Mrs Mallowan from 1934 until her death in 1976 and wrote many of her novels.

Your weekend could start at Wallingford Museum on Friday afternoon, viewing the 'At Home with the Queen of Crime' exhibition. Your Museum ticket includes this special Agatha Christie exhibition (including personal letters). This exhibition looks at Agatha Christie's home – Winterbrook House, and puts her quiet life in the town into perspective. It includes several original letters from her later life, connected with her role as President of the local dramatic society, The Sinodun Players, still thriving and now based in the Corn Exchange in Wallingford.

At the Museum, you could also enjoy great displays on Wallingford's amazing Saxon and Medieval Royal history.

Friday evening at the Corn Exchange will feature a short talk 'An interview with Agatha Christie - a Wallingford exclusive' by local historian Judy Dewey, followed by a showing of a vintage Agatha Christie film.

On Saturday morning there will be a 'Guided Agatha Christie Walk – Wallingford to Cholsey'. Your guides will be Judy Dewey and Tony Raynor (local historians / authors). You will arrive at Cholsey churchyard where Agatha Christie is buried, and can then view the special exhibition of 'Agatha Christie and Cholsey' including photographs and documents, and take refreshments at the Old School, Cholsey. Your return to Wallingford will be by the Cholsey & Wallingford Railway.

For Saturday evening there is a very special event at St Mary's Church, Cholsey with a

musical presentation 'A concert with a touch of Agatha Christie!'.

On Sunday morning the 'Guided Agatha Christie walk' and the 'Agatha Christie and Cholsey' exhibition will be repeated. In addition, there will an opportunity to walk from Cholsey to Wallingford instead, returning to Cholsey by train. Additionally, cream teas will be available on the The Forty, provided by the Cholsey Women's Institute celebrating 100 years of the WI.

Cholsey & Wallingford Railway will be running heritage trains between Wallingford and Cholsey throughout Saturday and Sunday.

Thames Valley Police Open Day – 8 August

The Thames Valley Police Open Day takes place annually at the Force's training centre in Sulhamstead, and last year over 5,000 people came along to find out what really goes on behind the scenes in policing.

This year's event is on Saturday 8 August and carries a theme of 100 years of Women in Policing. It will include talks from a female senior officer from the South East Counter Terrorism Unit and from two retired female police officers about their experiences of serving with TVP.

This year's event is between 10am and 4pm on Saturday 8th August and will be bigger and better than ever, with more exhibits to see and activities to take part in as well as displays from departments including the Dog Section, the Mounted Section, and Berkshire Search and Rescue dogs. There will also be a chance to visit the retired police dogs.

As well as seeing what our animal police friends are capable of, visitors will be able to look around the high speed vehicles used by the Hampshire and TVP Joint Roads Policing Unit, tour the police helicopter with the pilots who fly it from the National Police Air Service, and hear a talk from the Firearms Team about the dangers of replica weapons.

Throughout the day there will also be talks on wildlife crime and on a historical case, otherwise known as a 'cold case'. There will also be an opportunity to take part in Crime Scene Investigation activities with the Forensic Investigation team.

If you've still got any energy left after all that, there are over 40 police departments and external agencies taking part in the day, including the Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service, various search and rescue charities, the Chiltern Air Ambulance Trust, and Recruitment.

The Force Museum will feature vintage and modern police motorbikes. There is also the shop, with all profits going to the museum, and a raffle with excellent prizes, such as a

Vodafone Prime 6 tablet, Whirlpool microwave, £100 Hotelopia voucher, Bobby Police Bear, Sytner Affinity track day and much more.

This year, Thames Valley Police will be supporting two charities: Care of Police Survivors (COPS) and Domestic Abuse Stops Here (DASH), who will both have stands at the event.

Doors open for the event at 9.45am (last entry is at 3.30pm). Parking at the site is limited and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

No dogs are allowed on-site except for guide dogs. Entry is free for adults and children. Food will be available to purchase all day – cash only.

Coping with mobile phone contracts

I bought a new mobile phone six months ago. Before doing so I consulted the online signal checker, but I never have any signal at home or at work. I want to cancel my contract and go back to my old mobile phone company as I always had good service from them, but my new provider says I'll have to pay all 18 months of the contract remaining even if I want to cancel. I can't afford to pay that all at once as well as pay for a new contract, but I also can't have a mobile phone that never works when I need it. What can I do?

Most mobile phone contracts last 24 months, but often they don't specify minimum standards of service, so it can be tricky to get out of them without having to pay for the unexpired part of the contract. Your best bet is to keep a log of times when your phone doesn't work, then contact your service provider and ask them if there is anything they can do about it. This might resolve the problem without any need for cancelling.

Your contract might say something about how much reception you should get: if so, you should be able to cancel the contract without paying. Unfortunately, you can't rely on what online coverage checkers will say as they are just a guide and will only ever give an idea of the average signal someone can expect outside in that area.

If the mobile phone doesn't work in your house or work place but does work outside, there might be a problem with those buildings themselves. In that case you wouldn't normally be able to cancel the contract without any kind of penalty. It might be that the signal just isn't strong enough, so you should ask your provider to carry out a signal strength check.

If there is no signal anywhere in your area, you might be able to cancel your contract under the Supply of Goods and Services Act. If there is very poor service most of the time, this

might mean that the network is breaking your contract. Some contracts set terms and conditions allowing them to not provide a service sometimes, so you need to get advice to see if this applies to you.

Before anything else, contact your service provider, share any evidence of poor service and explain why you should be let out of your contract early. They might well allow you to cancel without any financial loss.

Local mental health support service

Oxfordshire Mind's specialist Benefits for Better Mental Health team give anyone with a mental health problem expert advice and guidance to help them navigate the complex benefits system.

Now the Oxfordshire Mind Benefits team are working more closely with Didcot Citizens Advice Bureau, as part of the Tap-In Advice Service across South Oxfordshire and the Vale of the White Horse. David Bryceland, Oxfordshire Mind's Benefits Project Service Manager, explained what the team can do to help people having problems with their benefits:

"We often get people visiting our service who are very confused about the benefits system and who are worried that their current benefits could be taken away. Our team will work one-to-one with that person to give them a thorough 'benefits health check' to make sure they are claiming everything that they're entitled to. We can explain what the letters they receive actually mean and resolve any problems they might be experiencing. We can also help them complete the right forms and make difficult phone calls.

"As we work with people with mental health problems, we have a lot of experience in helping people apply for Employment Support Allowance (ESA) and Personal Independence Payments. We also have an excellent track record of winning appeals when people have been turned down for ESA."

The Benefits team will be working out of the Didcot CAB twice every month. Anyone who has a mental health problem and would like their advice should make an appointment by either contacting their local CAB.

Families adopting under IAAM are given a range of interventions geared to supporting adoptive parents, including training in therapeutic parenting tailored to the specific needs of the child and 24-hour support during the first two years after adoption to reduce the risk of placement breakdown.



Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at North Stoke Village Hall on Thursday 2nd July 2015

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Stephen Sherbourne, Francesca Jones and Stuart Soames; Sue Rance (Parish Clerk), Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer) and County Councillor Mark Gray.

Apologies: from Councillors Francesca Jones, Andrew Johnson, David Mannering, Fleur Stevenson and District Councillor Richard Pullen

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

County Councillor Gray and PCSO Sue Harris will investigate the car and caravan parked next to the A4074 between the turnings to Mongewell and North Stoke.

Cllr Griffin has been in touch with grass-cutting contractors Scofell about a number of areas that have been missed, including the verge by the path from Crowmarsh Hill to Botany Gardens. Cllr Soames has been in touch with Scofell about North Stoke recreation ground to make sure it would be cut before the village summer event.

Litter bins had been requested at each bus stop on the A4074 at Mongewell, plus a dog bin by the underpass at Mongewell and a litter bin by the bus stop at the Howbery Park entrance.

The Clerk would ask the Town Council to return the flower tubs so that alternative arrangements can be made in future. Some residents near the mini-roundabout were willing to water tubs placed near them. Future planting will be discussed further.

Finance

Payments made in June were approved, including First Aid Training for our recreation

ground manager Chris Strange.

The accounts at 30th June were broadly in line with the budget. The solar panels are working so well that British Gas had asked for a photograph of the meter reading before they would pay the feed-in tariff.

Employees' salaries were reviewed and increased by 1% from 1st April 2015. Salaries will be reviewed annually in March in future.

Chairman's report

We still have four vacancies for Parish Councillors. The vacancies have been advertised in the school newsletter and in *Crowmarsh News*.

Planning

SODC decisions:

P15/S0947/FUL (Full Application): Erection of a two-storey, four-bay building to be used as a maintenance shed, garden machinery store and garage for two cars on the ground floor and storage for the kennels business on the first floor. Avalon Kennels Ltd, OX10 6PP: PERMISSION GRANTED.

Parish Council responses to SODC were agreed as follows:

P15/S1679/A (Advertisement): Erection of two mooring signs on the river bank at HR Wallingford, OX10 8BA, to alert visitors by boat:

RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

South Oxfordshire District Council Offices:

SODC would be applying retrospectively for the temporary security fence surrounding the fire damaged council offices in Benson Lane. It was decided to wait for a formal application before making any comments. The District Councillor's report (below) had no news about the future of the site. Lister Wilder appeal decision:

Following the Inspector's decision to dismiss Lister Wilder's Appeal with regard to the land-scaping of their site, it was agreed that the Chair of Planning would contact SODC to discuss the procedure for enforcement and Cllr Jones would draft a letter to SODC about the decision.

CABI:

Representatives from CABI had asked to address the Council about new proposals for development. It was agreed that they would be invited to address the parish council when a planning application has been submitted.

Traffic and Transport

The chairman had written in support of 'Go Ride' as the contractor for the 134 bus service and a meeting will take place with OCC's Allan Field, which our parish transport rep Cllr Jones and representatives from Goring and South Stoke councils will attend. The 134 service is to continue as at present on a short-term contract.

Cllr Jones recommended that everyone read the consultation document on bus services. She would attend the public meeting in Didcot on Monday 6th July. Consultation is currently open (until 14th September) on Oxfordshire County Council's service change proposals for subsidised bus services and Dial-a-Ride: find it online at

https://consultations.oxfordshire.gov.uk/consult.ti/stconsultation.

Cllr Sherbourne has drafted a letter to be sent to Thames Valley Police about the traffic problems on the A4074 Portway.

Correspondence

The Oxfordshire Association of Local Councils bulletin included:

- A recommendation that Clerks and Finance Officers should use dedicated computer equipment for Parish Council work. This will be discussed at the September meeting.
- Advice on Lone Working. Councillors were advised to read the advice given in the

bulletin and consider whether the Council have a Lone Worker Policy. This was referred to the Recreation and Environment Committee.

Winter preparedness letter from OCC: no additional road salt will be ordered as stocks remain from last winter.

There are three nominations for an Oxfordshire parish council vacancy on the Conservation Board for the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Cllr Griffin is the other Oxfordshire parish council member on this board.

County Councillor's Report

Cllr Gray suggested that parish councils might consider underwriting the 134 Wallingford-Goring bus service. Consultation on subsidised bus services and Dial-a-Ride will run until 14th September. Cllr Gray reported that the County Council has very limited resources and that further severe cuts are anticipated. There have been some redundancies and education personnel and finance services are to be provided from Hampshire County Council in future to cut costs.

Children's centres are to be reviewed and some non-statutory facilities are likely to be cut. Cllr Gray is working towards obtaining community funding to maintain the essential children's centre services.

Oxfordshire Highways would like parish and town councils to take over responsibility for some work such as grass cutting, but this is already being done in Crowmarsh. Another idea is for town and parish councils to keep street signs clean. Potholes will remain the responsibility of Highways. Cllr Gray reported how road sweepings are being recycled. Road works at Clacks Lane will be completed in the near future. He reported that Cholsey Parish Council are obtaining quotes for a shared cycle path along the Wallingford Road.

District Councillor's Report

District Councillor Pullen sent a short report: SODC staff are now fully moved into Milton Park. As yet there has been no news from the insurers as to whether the former offices will be considered beyond economic repair.

Reports from outside bodies

The River Users' Group 3 has met, and minutes are on their website at http://www.riverusergroups.org.uk/sandford-to-cleeve.php.

Cllr Soames reported that North Stoke Village Hall needs a new boiler and there are plans to renovate the kitchen.

Next meeting

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held on Thursday 6th August at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. The Clerk gave her apologies for this meeting: the Finance Officer will take the minutes. As always, members of the public are welcome to attend.
