

Neighbourhood planning – how can it help Crowmarsh?

SODC strongly supports neighbourhood planning to help local people to shape the way their communities grow and develop.

A neighbourhood development plan is written by local people, 'made' or adopted by the district council, and becomes part of the development plan that helps to decide planning applications. It takes national planning policy and guidance into account and is 'in general conformity' with the district's planning policy. It is not able to say no to any development, but can make sure local views are taken into account in what type of housing is built and where, as well as facilities and infrastructure.

Wallingford, Benson, Cholsey and other parishes are embarking on neighbourhood plans. Sheep Stealing in Mongewell

The night of the 8th January 1854 was very cold and because of this Mr Giles Painter, of Mongewell, moved his flock of 92 Down sheep into his fold at Mongewell for the night.

At some time during the night, John and Mary Ann Townsend, with William George (who lodged with the Townsends), stole an ewe teg from the fold. (An ewe teg is an ewe in its second year of life.) They slaughtered and skinned the ewe in Mr Greenwood's field nearby, then carried the carcass to their home near Ewelme, arriving at about 2am. There the carcass was cut up.

Everything would have been well for our three sheep stealers, but for William George's feeling of guilt. This apparently became so strong that when he applied for relief from Mr William Franklin, the overseer of Ewelme, on the 16th January, he confessed to the sheep stealing and named the Townsends as his accomplices. He made the same statement to the police. PC Lock searched the Townsends' house and found a bowl of melted mutton fat and two sheep leg bones.

The case was heard on the 9th March 1854 at Caversham. John Townsend pleaded guilty and offered no defence. William George and Mary Ann Townsend pleaded not guilty.

Mr Painter gave evidence that he had penned 92 sheep in his fold in Mongewell. The following morning he found one Down ewe was missing. Acting on information received later in the morning he went to Mr Greenwood's field, which was only 30 yards from his fold and found the skin of a sheep under an oak tree.

This was the only evidence presented and the Judge in his summing up said there was no evidence against Mary Ann Townsend, other than George's statement, which was not sufficient, and the Judge duly acquitted her and found George guilty of being an accessory after the fact. Both John Townsend and William George were sentenced later. Townsend received three years with hard labour and George one year.

On Saturday 20th August, 11am to 4pm, there will be another lively family day at Wallingford Museum with themed activities and entertainment for our own 'William the Conqueror' event.

There will be a Norman knight there all day, showing weapons and armour and talking about the things he displays and letting people try holding the items.

For children there will be a competition for the best dressed Saxon Warrior or Lady, Norman Knight or Lady (you can choose which side you wish to be!).

Have a go at drawing and cutting out figures for our own version of the Bayeux Tapestry which depicts the events leading up to the Norman Conquest of England, culminating in the Battle of Hastings.

There are two new special exhibitions at the Museum this year. One is "1066: William Comes to Wallingford" describing how William the Conqueror came to Wallingford after the Battle of Hastings to cross the River Thames with his army! But why did he choose Wallingford? .The other is "300 Years of Cartoons!" a spectacular private collection, featuring about a hundred cartoons of all kinds.

Of course, our ever popular archaeology sandpits and 'smelly/feely' drawers will be in the museum as usual, to enable children to sample the fun of discovering things from the past!

My experience of previous communities is that August can be a bit of a slow month... it is assumed that families jet off to find some sun and all regular activities and groups are put on hold.

That can make it quite a lonely time for those who can't get away for whatever reason, and this year Brexit and the resulting weak pound will mean that more will be "holidaying at home" than usual. So, it is good that some activities continue throughout August and I'm pleased to say that our church services will carry on largely as usual – you will, of course, be most welcome to join us!

This brings me onto my longer term hope of "staying open". The church building has been locked since it suffered some petty vandalism, but I hope that this could change, so that we could re-open it as a community resource every day.

It certainly offers a cool space as an oasis when the temperature is soaring outside, but more importantly, it is a spiritual oasis which refreshes the soul – we are reminded that Jesus stood up in the temple in Jerusalem and proclaimed: "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink" (John 7:37).

One of the questions that children ask me these days is "Do you own the church?" The answer is, "No, it belongs to you as much as me!" It is Crowmarsh Gifford's Parish Church.

Villagers have prayed in St Mary Magdalene's Church for at least the last 800 years. My role is the same as the earliest recorded vicar called Hugh who was appointed in 1212, to enable and encourage people in faith and to worship God in this place. Therefore, I am happy to open up on request, but...

... it would be much better if we could have a rota of a dozen or more volunteers, not necessarily church members, who would be prepared to watch over the church for an hour or two on a weekend afternoon, with a "Church Open" sign outside the gate.

A number of visitors during summer holiday weekends would provide a strong reason to update the church's facilities with a toilet and a proper area for refreshments. Who knows, we may even be able to encourage Pokemon-Go players to look beyond the PokeStop at the LychGate War Memorial...

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at North Stoke Village Hall on Thursday 7th July 2016

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Andrew Hermsen, Andrew Johnson, Francesca Jones, David Mannering, Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames and Fleur Stevenson; Sue Rance (Clerk) and Mel Malcolm (Finance Officer); County Councillor Mark Gray.

Apologies were received from Councillor Ann Sharp.

Matters from previous meeting

The parish noticeboards are in a poor state and consideration will be given to repairing or replacing them. Quad bikes had damaged a stretch of the Ridgeway in the parish.

Contractors Scofell have now started grass cutting, but the contract will be reviewed at the end of the summer to ensure that grass cutting will get off to a prompt start next year. Cllr Sharp has contacted Scofell about problems with the grass cutting contract to negotiate additional cuts in some areas where it was particularly poor.

Cllr Gray will investigate the reason for the continuing delay in opening the road leading to the riverside park, which has been built but not yet adopted.

Cllr Gray has spoken to Mark Francis of OCC Highways to discuss highway safety improvements at the former Springs Hotel if the redevelopment goes ahead. A site meeting with Cllr Soames suggested that a chicane at the entrance to North Stoke would not be practical, as there is no street lighting in this wooded area.

Speed bumps are a possibility or the speed limit could be reinforced with white gates or 30mph roundels in the road.

Finance

Cllr Johnson reported that councillors had rated traffic issues as the highest priority of the strategic priorities for capital expenditure, followed by improvements at the recreation ground. Cllr Stevenson will post the list of identified projects on the website as a guide to possible spending priorities. Costings will be added in due course.

A schedule of payments made in June was approved, including £816 for tree work at the Recreation Ground and £272 for geraniums planted at the Queen's Head roundabout.

A new pair of defibrillator pads will be purchased at a cost of £74.95 plus VAT.

A grant of £100 was agreed to Home-Start, which supports families in South Oxfordshire and is based in Didcot.

County Councillor's report

County Councillor Gray reported that services for elderly people are now being consolidated under one roof and this is working well. Cllr Gray and Cllr Griffin had attended the recent unitary authority meeting. Feedback and a copy of the presentation had been issued. The aim of a unitary authority would be to save money and to be more democratic. Any proposal would have to be approved by central government.

Planning

SODC decision:

P15/S3387/FUL: Demolition of existing buildings and creation of a new headquarters for CABI, erection of 91 dwelling houses, comprising open market and affordable housing, provision of open space, landscaping and parking and other associated works. The residential part is made in full while the CABI headquarters part is in outline with all matters reserved for future consideration, except

access. CABI International, Nosworthy Way, Mongewell OX10 8DE. PERMISSION REFUSED.

Parish Council responses to SODC:

P16/S1250/HH (Householder) and P16/S1251/LB (Listed Building) Extension and refurbishment of stable block, amended to increase the height of the extension by 200mm. Chaise House, 67 The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8EF. NO STRONG VIEWS.

Consultation on South Oxfordshire Local Plan 2032

SODC will be holding a "Drop-in" Public Event at Crowmarsh Village Hall on Friday, 15th July between 3 – 7 pm on their Preferred Options Document with SODC staff on hand to answer the public's questions.

Environment and Recreation Ground

The Recreation Ground Management Committee had met and the minutes were circulated. The following points were noted:

- There are still some problems with grass cutting and Chris Strange is researching the possibility of purchasing a mower for the cricket outfield.
- The hard court area is underused and it was agreed to advertise the facility at a cost of £30 per annum or £4 per hour. There is now a keypad on the gate (the code is changed regularly). Cllr Soames had researched online booking systems but these are very expensive, so telephone booking will continue.
- It is hoped to install basketball practice facilities at the recreation ground. Three quotes have now been received: the preferred option is for a 7 x 7m court at a cost of £6000 plus VAT. This will be brought to the Parish Council for approval in due course.
- Consideration will be given to improving the children's play area, which is about 25 years old. It was noted that the wood chips needed replacement or topping up frequently and a rubber surface might be more effective.
- Drainage improvements have been carried out at the nature area and will be monitored when there is heavy or prolonged rain.

- Playing Fields in Perpetuity: a letter has been received about a scheme to dedicate playing fields in memory of the dead of World War I a hundred years ago, requiring that the land will be kept for recreational purposes. The Clerk will research this further.
- A complaint has been received from a resident of Jethro Tull Gardens about the large ash tree on the open space there, but this had been professionally pruned recently and, following an inspection by councillors, it was felt that no further action was needed.
- Cllr Sherbourne was thanked for planting and maintaining the geraniums in the flower tubs at the Queen's Head roundabout.

Traffic and Transport

Cllr Jones reported that the new bus timetable starts this month. After 20th July the County Council subsidies will stop. There are changes to some Thames Travel buses and the 125 service to Watlington has been discontinued. The commercial services to Reading and Oxford are unaffected and some services will actually improve in frequency.

The 139 bus from Wallingford to Henley will be re-routed via Crowmarsh Gifford again. The 136 bus will serve both Wallingford to Cholsey and Wallingford to Benson. Timetables and fares might change. Look out for new timetables and notices at bus stops and on Thames Travel's website.

As reported, the 134 GoRide bus service through Crowmarsh Gifford and North Stoke will operate without subsidy from 21st July with a reduced timetable and higher fares (see last month's *Crowmarsh News*). Cllr Soames had reported that the revised timings for the North Stoke bus did not fit the school timetable and it has been agreed that, from September, the first bus will run earlier and the last bus later, in order to drop off and pick up from Wallingford School.

Cllr Sherbourne reported that Peter Brett Associates had been commissioned to carry out a survey and initial design for the proposed crossing of the A4074 Portway. This will be done in the next few weeks.

Crowmarsh School has bid successfully for funding for a school crossing patrol through

the Churchill Insurance Lollipoppers campaign. The county council has expressed concern about the safety of a patrol officer operating at Portway (which supports the case for a crossing there!). The Clerk will keep Cllr Gray informed of progress.




