

Update on the 134 bus

GoRide CIC (Community Interest Company) carried on running the 134 Goring-Wallingford bus service through North and South Stoke when the County Council withdrew its subsidy earlier this year. Thanks to the timely intervention of Mike Ward, a Goring resident, GoRide have agreed to continue the service until the end of January 2017.

This will give Mike Ward time to set up his own CIC to take over the service from 1st February. Mike plans to take over one or two of the current minibuses. Go Ride's main driver has also agreed to stay on, so we hope that the current timetable will continue. We will keep you informed when we have more news.

Planning applications

Two (probably three) major planning applications have been submitted around Crowmarsh Gifford. They will be considered at the Parish Council meeting on Thursday 8th December.

A special meeting will be held at Crowmarsh Gifford School, Old Reading Road, on Thursday 1st December from 7pm to receive presentations from each of the developers. This will not be a meeting for discussion, debate or decision, so members of the public are welcome to attend to hear more detail about the proposals but it is not the occasion for supporters or objectors to speak.

The discussion and the opportunity for public speaking will come at the Parish Council meeting on Thursday 8th December, when members of the public may be invited to make comments in the usual way when planning comes up on the agenda.

There will be a presentation on the proposed Bloor development off Benson Lane at 7pm; we have invited Lightwood Strategic, who want to develop land south of the school, to present at 7.30pm; if the application for the Newnham Manor development has been submitted, we will invite them to make a presentation at 8pm.

Priority Service Register

SSE are operating a Priority Service Register for people within Crowmarsh parish who may require a little extra help or assistance should we suffer a power outage in the forthcoming winter months.

Registering means SSE can come out and ensure you are looked after during a sustained outage. It is a free service, and whatever information you provide is strictly confidential.

Working closely with local councils, SSE have registered more than 700 people in the last 12 months within Oxfordshire, but are aware there are many more vulnerable people who are not registered.

People who are registered will be highlighted to Helen Vass, Customer and Community Advisor with SSE and her team, should there be a power outage affecting them. The SSE team will go out and visit each person and, depending on their needs, provide assistance. This can range from generating their house to offering hot meals, drinks and reassurance. In addition, SSE's Emergency Service Centre will call them during the outage, checking they are OK and giving them updates on the estimated time of power restoration.

Helen is happy to come and talk to any groups that meet in the parish about the service and register people on the day.

The Closing of Estate Mongewell School

The Estate School at Mongewell (the building is now a private house, and is located about half way up Constitution Hill) was opened in 1888. It was built and paid for by Alexander Fraser of Mongewell House.

When the Estate School closed on 1st August 1903 there were more than 40 children attending. The Headmistress was Miss M Wilder of Crowmarsh. A new council school was built on the Goring Road in North Stoke which was large enough to accommodate children from North Stoke and Mongewell.

On the school's final day, a presentation of an illuminated address to Mr and Mrs Fraser was made by the parents and scholars, as an

acknowledgement of their support and interest in the children of the Parish.

Owing to Miss Wilder being ill the address was made by the monitoress, Miss Rose Hilton. Mr Fraser in replying complimented Miss Hilton on her work. One of the younger children, Katie Strohmeyar, presented Mrs Fraser with a large bouquet of flowers from all the children. Mr and Mrs Fraser then presented each of the 40 scholars and the monitoress with a bound leather Prayer Book.

Miss Wilder was presented with a silver ink stand and a large family Bible by Mr and Mrs Fraser and the North Stoke scholars presented her with a silver-plated cruet stand.

Don't rush into Christmas!

I trust you will read this in early December, which is the season of Advent rather than Christmas. As any child who has had an advent calendar knows, waiting patiently in anticipation for something increases the joy when it finally arrives. In church, the advent wreath has the same effect, as we light a new candle each Sunday of Advent and the story gradually unfolds.

The history of the Advent wreath is interesting: it is thought to have begun in its present form in the early 19th century, from an idea of a Lutheran pastor called Johann Wichern. He was ministering in a mission house during Advent and the children would each day ask the same question as they ask on any long journey: "Are we there yet?" (I can't help thinking of the donkey in *Shrek 2*!).

So in 1839 he used a large cartwheel to make a 'wreath' with 19 small red candles for the weekdays and four large white candles for the Sundays, which were then lit through Advent to help the children count the days. The custom was copied by others in Germany and evolved into a wreath of four red candles and one white candle that we know today.

The lighting of candles on the Advent wreath speaks powerfully of the natural symbols of light and darkness that run through this season. As we prepare for the coming ('adventus') of Jesus the 'Light of the World' we are reminded of those who came before us who prepared for the Messiah's coming: the Patriarchs, the Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary, Jesus' mother.

Their example of faith, often in situations of extraordinary difficulty, remind us in the business and busyness of the modern commercial season, the importance of sharing the truth about God's love shown in Jesus with others we meet and particularly the next generation.

I commend this custom to you, both as Advent calendars and to see each candle lit in church and to share the biblical story of God's long-awaited plan of salvation to unfold, beginning with God made man, or God 'incarnate' – "now in flesh appearing... O come, let us adore Him!"

Christmas Tree Festival at St Mary's, Wallingford

This year's Christmas Tree Festival in St Mary's Church will be from 7th to 10th December. Look out for posters about it around the town, and check the display board outside St Mary's Church for details of events. There will be a joint raffle in aid of St Mary's Tower Fund and the Sue Ryder Hospice in Nettlebed. You will be able to buy tickets for the raffle inside the Church and at the Sue Ryder Shop.

Visitors to the Festival can enjoy refreshments

while listening to carols, performed this year by Cranford House School Choir at 1.15pm on Thursday 8th, and by the Thameside U3A 'Singing for Fun' Choir at 2.30pm on Friday 9th.

On Saturday 10th at 11am, Derek Nightingale will be giving a short Christmas organ recital. That evening, Wallingford Parish Choir will also be singing 'Carols amongst the Trees' at 7pm. Come and join the fun!

Treasures Beneath our Feet

James Mather will talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) about local metal detecting finds from Oxfordshire and Berkshire dating from modern times to the Bronze Age.

His most significant find, "The Watlington Viking Hoard", with its amazing selection of King Alfred the Great coins, is covered comprehensively from its discovery to display at the Ashmolean.

By the end of James's presentation, attendees will have seen many beautiful images and have a clear idea of the contribution that responsible metal detecting can make to the nation's heritage. James has been detecting for over 25 years, and is a member of the Archaeology in Marlowlocal society.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 3rd November 2016

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Andrew Hermsen, Andrew Johnson, Francesca Jones, David Mannering, Ann Sharp, Stephen Sherbourne, Fleur Stevenson and Stuart Soames; Sue Rance (Clerk), District Councillor Richard Pullen and County Councillor Mark Gray.

Matters from previous meeting

Since the last meeting, Kieran Moloney, the recently appointed Finance Officer, had decided he was unable to fulfil this role and had resigned. Fortunately Mrs Yvonne Peet, who had been short-listed and interviewed, has accepted the post.

Concerns from a resident were discussed that filling in the ditch on the north side of The Street could lead to flooding and hazardous conditions for pedestrians and road users if the flood water then freezes. Action can be taken if riparian owners do not fulfil their responsibilities. County Councillor Gray will take this forward.

Cllr Sherbourne reported further work to cut back the overgrown roadside vegetation near the Crowmarsh roundabout. The tap at the allotments has now been turned off for the winter.

Finance

A schedule of payments made in October was approved. Because of the unexpected change in finance officer, consideration of strategic spending priorities was deferred and the budget for next year will be based closely on this year's.

Requests for donations had been received from the Oxfordshire Association for the Blind, Oxfordshire South and Vale Citizens' Advice

and the South and Vale Carers' Centre.
Consideration of these was deferred, but it
was agreed to make two donations of £100 to
the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal
(Crowmarsh Gifford and North Stoke).

Cllr Hermsen will research suitable laptop computers for use by the Finance Officer and the Clerk.

County Councillor's Report

County Cllr Gray is taking on the role of local authority governor at Crowmarsh Gifford School. It was noted that some school responsibilities were to have been taken away from the county council but have now been retained, e.g. exclusions, transport and admissions.

Budget cuts are continuing and will affect day time activities for the elderly and those with special needs. Consultation is taking place on the Oxfordshire website about this cut, which would affect six hundred people. The proposals are to scale down services and for services to be shared. Vulnerable people will be assisted to complete the survey.

There have been 17 offers from community groups to take over children's centres. OCC will not charge these community groups rent.

The scrutiny committee reports that the Police Commissioner and the Chief Constable have done a good job in difficult circumstances. More funding is now available from central government, so no further cuts to the police service are planned at present.

The police have the responsibility to levy fines on those parking on double yellow lines but in practice this power is not often used.

District Councillor's Report

Cllr Pullen recommended that the Parish Council should make a neighbourhood plan. Many planning applications are currently going through on appeal because SODC lacks a five-year housing land supply – the target number for Oxfordshire had risen.

If Crowmarsh does produce a neighbourhood plan this will form part of the SODC local plan. Cllr Griffin had received expressions of interest from four or five residents but no decision had been taken. However, the Parish Council is consulting all residents about their views on housing development and the results will be analysed for the next meeting.

There is no news about the future of the former SODC offices site. There are covenants on the land, which relate to the use of the site for community or employment use. The chairman had questioned the SODC leader again at the recent parish forum, but no decision is expected before next spring.

Environment and recreation ground

SODC's grant scheme has been suspended until next spring. However, the preferred supplier of the half-court for basketball practice is available to carry out the work at the agreed price and it was agreed to proceed with this project from our own funds and to apply for a grant for the children's play area when the scheme re-opens. Maintenance work will be carried out as soon as possible on the play area to comply with the recent RoSPA safety report.

Footpaths at the nature area have been improved with bark chippings. It was noted that Agrivert has offered to help with community projects. Grundons will donate a sack of daffodil bulbs for planting in the parish.

Traffic and transport

Cllr Gray will investigate why the County Council's contract with GoRide for school transport was cancelled and replaced with a taxi service.

It was thought that GoRide would cease to run the 134 bus between Wallingford and Goring through the Stokes, but not until January 2017 when it is anticipated that a new community bus operator will start to run this service.

The Chairman will write to Oxfordshire

Highways, enclosing a copy of the survey report on the A4074 Portway pedestrian crossing, to obtain costings for the project.

Correspondence

Letters had been received from residents about a variety of local issues, including air quality, poor consultation about the closure of Wallingford Bridge, housing development proposals (including in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty), the speed of traffic in Wallingford Road (North Stoke) and neighbourhood planning.

Southern Electricity have written to us about assisting vulnerable people during any loss of power. Cllr Jones will publish a notice in *Crowmarsh News*.

SODC advertised the next round of their grants scheme in March and April 2017. Individual councillor grants of up to £5000 are being introduced.

An invitation was received to the Oxford Victoria County History Trust meeting to be held on Tuesday 6th January 2017.

The Chairman will reply to the organisers of the Head of the River Race, scheduled for 4th December, asking that their marshals ensure considerate parking that does not cause obstruction to traffic or anyone's access/ entrance. It is still possible to use some of SODC's former car park.

Website

Cllr Hermsen presented a proposal for improvements to the website and recommended consulting residents. It was recommended that a record of the number of visits to the site should be collected. Cllr Hermsen will publish a notice about the website consultation in *Crowmarsh News*.

Other business

Cllr Johnson reported that the Emery Owen Trustees (who own the allotments behind Thames Mead) met on 27th October and resolved to increase their annual allotment fees to £15. Charitable donations had been made amounting to £1500 while £2000 was

spent on maintaining the allotment land.

Cllr Mannering reported from the River Users' Group. The Environment Agency has a budget shortfall of £1 million. Riparian owners are being reminded about looking after their trees that overhang the River Thames.

Next meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Thursday 8th December at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

Three developers who have put in planning applications for housing around the village will each be invited to give a short presentation on their proposals at a special meeting on 1st December at the School, but no discussion or decision will happen then.

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council. If you think you might like to join the Council please talk to the chairman, the parish clerk or any councillor.
