The Life of James White


There have been many characters living in Wallingford over the years. One of the most notable was James or Jimmy White, who spent much of his adult life living in Wallingford Workhouse or in prison. Between the years of 1863 and 1893, he was arrested no fewer than 69 times, usually for assault fuelled by drink. During this thirty-year brush with the law there were some years when he was only arrested once or twice. This was because for most of that year he was serving a prison sentence!

Jimmy was born in 1838, the second son of William and Hannah from Witney. He had little education. At the age of nine he started work, helping his father selling earthenware. In 1859 Jimmy met Susan Rusher from Eynsham. Susan's brother was James Rusher, who later moved to Wallingford and opened a china shop on the corner of St Martin's Street and the High Street (the shop has since been demolished).

Their relationship blossomed and they married in 1860. They moved to Wallingford soon afterwards, living in Wood Street, and Jimmy worked for brother-in-law James selling earthenware. Their first child, Sarah, was born in 1864. Six more children followed, the last being born in 1876.

In 1863 Jimmy was arrested twice for assault, once for assaulting a police officer from Cholsey. By 1867 he had served several sentences for assault or being found drunk.

James Rusher, after showing considerable tolerance, sacked Jimmy. It wasn't long before he and his family were evicted from their Wood Street house. Four times in 1886 he was arrested for sleeping in the open air, twice under a wall in Wallingford Cemetery, once in the Kine Croft and finally in October, under an arch of Wallingford Bridge, with his wife and six children. As he had no visible means of support the family were accepted into the Workhouse. At Christmas time he applied for permission to have a day out from the



Workhouse, but this was refused.

He applied again in 1887. As it was Queen Victoria's Jubilee year and due to his good conduct he was allowed a day out this time. He repaid the Guardians' trust in him by arriving back at the Workhouse during the Sunday Church service wearing only his under clothes, barefoot and drunk. He had sold his boots and clothes, the property of the Workhouse, to buy more drink. Another prison sentence followed. When he was released he returned to the Workhouse, before absconding and being arrested for fighting in the Market Place.

Jimmy and Susan's eldest son, George, had left the Workhouse having found employment and lodgings. In 1887 he applied to take one of his brothers out of the Workhouse. The application was refused because it had not been made in a satisfactory manner.

Sadly in July 1897, Susan died in the County Asylum, Cholsey, aged 57 years. Jimmy's life continued in the same manner until 1915, when on the 2nd December (which would have been his 55th Wedding Anniversary) he died, aged 77 years. In the following year a memoriam to Jimmy was published in the Berks and Oxon Advertiser from his son Arthur on behalf of his brothers and sisters. It also appeared in 1917 and 1918. So despite all that had occurred during their childhood, his children still had fond memories of him. Perhaps that's all you can ask....

It is 950 years since the last time England was successfully invaded by a foreign army. Most of us know there was a great battle in 1066 at Hastings where the English (Saxon) King Harold was killed by an arrow in his eye (probably) and some may even know that William the Conqueror came to Wallingford after the battle to cross the River Thames with his army!

But why did he choose Wallingford? What was happening here at the time to make him come? What effect did it all have on the people living here? There is certainly an intriguing story to tell and in Wallingford Museum's new exhibition – '1066: William Comes to Wallingford' – all will be revealed. "All" will be based on the very latest research and evidence. This ia an exhibition that is definitely not to be missed!

You'll also be able to see some of the latest discoveries from our recent archaeology, including the smallest medieval chess piece ever found in England - a beautiful little object made of antler, discovered behind the Museum in the dig last summer.

But this is not all...!

There's also a brand new special exhibition presenting '300 Years of Cartoons!' This spectacular private collection has been brought together by Dr Steve Head to show wonderful examples of the development of the use of cartoons in the last three centuries. Featuring about a hundred cartoons of all kinds, the exhibition allows you simply to look at the cartoons and enjoy them for themselves, or to take time to read a little about each one and learn a great deal - a very special experience.

And if you come early in the season, your £5 entry ticket will give you terrific value, as you'll be able to return as many times as you like for no extra cost. The Museum will be open from

1st March. Children under 16 get in free, and there's lots for the family to enjoy throughout the rest of the Museum too.

Look out for special events this year, including Town and Castle history walks (2nd April), A Night at the Museum (13th May and 28th October), Family Archaeology Day (23rd July), a William the Conqueror event (20th August), BunkFest offers, and the Agatha Christie Weekend (9th-11th September).

Our church in Crowmarsh Gifford has existed since at least 1140 when it was used as a fortified post by King Stephen in his wars with Matilda, who held Wallingford Castle. During the Civil War it was used by Cromwell's men to shelter from the Royalists.


