

Hare Coursing is still an issue

Thames Valley Police report that Hare Coursing remains a problem and have asked us once again to raise public awareness of the issue. With the introduction of the Hunting Act 2004 in February 2005, all forms of hare coursing are banned in the UK. Hares are in decline and their destruction is a concern. But with hare coursing there is also associated criminal damage - to fencing and hedging to gain access, and to the land with the indiscriminate use of vehicles. It is also not unusual for hare coursers to intimidate landowners and other users of the land, such as ramblers.

If you believe hare coursing is taking place, please call the police (on 999) from a safe location to report what you have seen and where you have seen it. Say how many people are involved and give a good description, if you can , and describe any vehicles you have seen. if possible, state how many dogs are involved. If the suspects leave, try to determine their direction of travel. But DO NOT approach the offenders yourself or put yourself at any risk.

Christmas 1918

December 1918 was the first month of peace after four years and four months of the most terrible warfare. It was a month of major events both nationally and locally. Spanish Flu was at its height, and more people died from Spanish Flu world-wide than died in the Great War.

One victim was Ernest Latter of Wallingford, who could be considered to be a local hero; he had fought right through the war with the Canadians, achieved the rank of Captain and was awarded the MC. During his next leave he was to be married, and on leaving the Army he and his bride were to emigrate to Yorkton in Canada where he was to become the Chief of Police. He died of Spanish Flu in Namur, Belgium on 5th December.

John Godden of Ewelme fought with the 7th Hussars in South Africa in the Matabele Expedition in 1896-97 and right through the Boer War. In 1904 he transferred to the Transvaal Town Police. In 1914 he tried to join his old regiment but was unsuccessful and joined the Royal Field Artillery instead. He fought at Ypres, but while fighting on the Somme he and his section were buried by a German shell.

Although he was dug out alive he never fully recovered from being buried and was declared unfit for service abroad. In late November he contracted influenza and died in Middlesborough Military Hospital on 1st December. He is buried in Ewelme Cemetery.

Sergeant Robert Bruce Lindsey of Ipsden, died of Flu at St Pol in France on 20th December. For William Hockley of Moulsford, having lost a son in action in 1917, you would think the family had suffered enough, but on 1st November 1918 his grandson died of the flu, on 2nd November his eldest daughter died of the Flu, and on 11th November his eldest son died of the Flu. It is hard to imagine how Mr Hockley dealt with that amount of grief.

In the *Berks and Oxon Advertiser* on 6th December, it was announced that the Defence of the Realm Act (DORA) was being relaxed.

This Act had given the Government control of lighting restrictions, trading hours, food prices, press reporting of the war and much more. White bread was becoming available again; tea was no longer rationed; eggs were cheaper and a certain amount of meat was available without coupons, but there was still a shortage of coal.

In mid-December there was the first sale of draught horses that had been requisitioned by the Army. Then on Saturday 14th December there was then a General Election. The counting of the vote was not held until 28th December, and this was the first time that women were able to vote, provided they were over 30. Also all men over 21 were able to vote for the first time. The Conservative coalition continued in Government with Lloyd George as Prime Minister.

Christmas Day at the Cottage Homes was as usual and the children visited the Workhouse to sing carols to the inmates. At 7.30 am they were served breakfast with all the inmates (whatever time were they singing carols in the infirmary?).

At noon they were given their Christmas dinner and, with relaxing wartime restrictions, there was plenty of beef and pork for all the children and the inmates of the Workhouse. After the dinner, the children received a visit from Santa Claus and each child received a gift. It's interesting to note that two old boys serving in the Army and Navy spent their Christmas at Cottage Homes. Most of the food and treats were given by the townspeople of Wallingford.

That first Christmas after the war must have one of great relief and rejoicing, but in many homes there were empty chairs at the Christmas table. It must have very hard to come to terms with this.

I started out to write a happy and cheerful story but I must have picked the wrong subject as it didn't turn out like that.

I'll try again in the new year.

Notes of the Crowmarsh Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 11th December 2014

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames, Faye Cheeseman (part of meeting), Francesca Jones, Andrew Johnson, plus Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer) and Susan Rance (Clerk) and County Councillor Mark Gray (for part of meeting)

Apologies: from Councillors Anne Lowes, Stephen Brown and Fleur Stevenson and District Councillor Kristina Crabbe

The meeting was preceded by a presentation about a proposed new planning application for development at the CABI site to include a new headquarters building and up to 150 houses, instead of the retirement complex that has outline planning permission. An exhibition with further details will take place at CABI in January.

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Cllrs Griffin and Hannigan attended the Town and Parish Forum at SODC. Trees will be planted at Jethro Tull Gardens during the next week. Police updates are now being received. A response is awaited from Dave Baldwin (Monsons) about a possible flood compensation scheme for the new access road to Riverside Park.

Finance

The draft budget for 2015-16 was discussed and approved unanimously. This is a balanced budget with precept income of £36,500. The amount paid in Council Tax by each household is the same as this year. Council tax relief support grant received will reduce by 15% each year, but income continues from the electricity generated by the solar cells on the pavilion roof. The maintenance budget for the recreation ground is the same as last year.

There is money for some capital projects during the year. Maintenance costs include grass cutting, for which we now get less grant funding from OCC.

We agreed to provide computerised accounts software for use by the Finance Officer and three options were presented and discussed. After discussion, we selected the Rialtas Business Solution, which is used widely by Parish Councils and has a very good reporting facility and support network.

Payments from 6th November to 11th December were agreed including £337.50 for fitting cycle stands.

Tom Cottrell had carried out some work at the Botany allotments. There is one person waiting for a plot, which will be made available when the clearance work is complete.

Planning

SODC decisions:

P14/S2798/HH (Householder): 2-storey rear extension and single-storey rear extension to house and modifications to existing detached garage at Millstone Cottage, The Street, North Stoke:

PERMISSION GRANTED.

P14/S3092/HH (Householder): Demolition of lean-to garage and erection of a two-storey extension and a carport, plus replacement doors to free-standing outbuilding. Brook Cottage, The Street, North Stoke: PERMISSION GRANTED.

Parish Council responses to SODC were agreed as follows:

P14/S3544/HH (Householder): Hard standing area. Mulberry Cottage, 69 The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8EF: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P14/S3498/LB (Listed Building Consent):

Repair existing inglenook fireplace. The Mill House, The Street, North Stoke: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P14/S3579/HH (Householder): Single storey timber garage to replace dilapidated shed and garage. 70 The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

Environment and Recreation Ground Committee

Dog waste is still a problem at the recreation ground. Owners are reminded of their responsibility to clean up after their dog and use the red bins provided.

Trees and hedges have been cut back as necessary. Bark chippings have been laid along the footpath at the nature area and Chris Strange has planted bluebells, kindly donated by Grundon. Wallingford United are planning to replace the flood lights at their own expense.

The new heating system is running well in the Pavilion. Plans to turn two unused changing rooms into meeting space will be discussed at the next committee meeting.

Traffic and Transport Committee

Cllr Francesca Jones put up posters up about the 134 bus service consultation: there is a petition to Oxfordshire County Council to support the hourly Goride community bus between Wallingford and Goring via Crowmarsh Gifford and North and South Stoke.

Cllr Jones reported that more items now need to be included in the emergency plan and these will be incorporated into the next revision in 2015.

Reports of representatives on outside bodies

Cllr Stuart Soames is now chairman of the North Stoke Village Hall committee and a request for funding for refurbishment may be submitted to the parish council in the spring.

Community Information Network: Cllr Faye Cheeseman will represent the parish council

on this new initiative and will liaise with County Councillor Gray.

Emery Owen Trust: Cllr Andrew Johnson reported that this charity (which owns the allotments between Thames Mead and The Street) is now receiving requests for funding from local organisations. A fence has been erected alongside the path through the Emery Owen allotments land.

County Councillor's report

Cllr Gray reported that the county council budget is likely to be further reduced over the next few years. 40% of the council's total income has been cut and care for the elderly has to take priority over other areas of work. Children's centres are likely to be subject to cuts but disadvantaged families will be prioritised. The funding for roads is unlikely to cover more than filling potholes. Major highways projects (such as those on the Oxford ring road) are funded by central government, not OCC.

Cllr Gray will liaise with Cllr Cheeseman about the Community Information Network initiative to support older people in the community. A support group has already started in Cholsey. There is also a call for volunteers to help run the home library service — see https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/cms/content/home-library-service.

District Councillor's report

District Cllr Crabbe had submitted a written report:

- The next stage of the local plan consultation is due in February.
- Cllr Crabbe has written to the National Planning Casework Unit to request that the Carmel site planning application be called in on the basis of guidelines on a number of issues, including flooding.
- Thames Water has been carrying out work to reline the sewer that runs through Winters Field.
 - SOHA has applied for a repair and

renewal grant to protect the houses in Retreat Gardens from flooding.

- Flow surveys are being carried out to look at the capacity of the pumping station at Crowmarsh and the treatment plant at Benson.
- SODC's smokers' bin has been relocated further away from the children's play area.

The meeting was followed by a reception for Tim Owen, who served as our clerk and finance officer over 13 years. Councillors presented him with a picture in gratitude for his excellent work, good humour and helpful advice.

We do not meet in January, so the next Parish Council Meeting will be held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 5th February, starting at 7.30pm. A very happy New Year to everyone in Crowmarsh Gifford, Mongewell and North Stoke!
