

## New Safe Places scheme

Shops and other premises in Wallingford and Didcot have joined a new scheme to provide a safe location for vulnerable people, including those with dementia, learning disabilities or mental health issues, to go if they're feeling lost, worried or threatened.

Look out for premises displaying this orange and yellow Safe Place logo - they've been given approval by Thames Valley Police to join the scheme.

# The Better Housing Better Health (BHBH) service

Residents in southern Oxfordshire concerned about keeping warm and managing their energy bills are being encouraged to contact an advice service for help.

The Better Housing Better Health (BHBH) service, funded by South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils alongside the county's other district councils and Oxfordshire County Council, helps people who are vulnerable to the effects of living in cold homes over the winter period.

The advice service offers free, impartial advice on staying warm and managing energy bills. Residents can find out if they qualify for a grant to install energy saving improvements to their homes or a free home energy visit to look at ways to save energy to bring their bills down.

The service is run by the Affordable Warmth Network, which all local councils are part of. It offers direct referrals to a growing network of support organisations, including the fire service, falls prevention service and befriending and advice services. All of which aims to ease the pressure on other health services during the winter months.

# Update: the new Crowmarsh play area and adult gym project

Through the summer and autumn we have developed further our plans for an ambitious new play area and adult gym to replace our existing 25-year-old facilities.

We received many suggestions from locals on the sort of facilities they would like, including more ambitious climbing nets and a zip wire, which we would like to fulfil. We still have three bidders who have produced some exciting plans. We are currently applying for planning permission and hope to hear back in early January.

### **Christmas Day in the Workhouse**

When we think of Victorian Christmases, what will often come to mind is Christmas Day in the Workhouse, which is an old cliché that conjures up images of a very bleak and cold Christmas. But in Wallingford that may not be true.

If we take 1901 as an example, the morning started with a service conducted by the vicar of St Peter's, the Reverend Alfred Babington, who was the Workhouse Chaplin. This was followed by the children of the Cottage Homes singing carols. The Workhouse dining hall and the infirmary had been decorated by the assistant matron, Elizabeth Cawse, daughter of the Master, William Cawse. All work for the day was suspended and little extras were added to each meal time.

For breakfast, coffee was available to all. For dinner there was sufficient roast beef and plum pudding for all, as were second helpings, as much as 1lb of plum pudding per head was prepared and most of it was eaten. The dinner was followed by tobacco, snuff, oranges and sweets. 126 inmates participated in the festivities, and some 30 inmates in the infirmary were also given a Christmas dinner.

As for the 32 children of the new Cottage

Homes, they were so excited about Christmas that they were out of bed and fully dressed at 3am! They were of course sent back to bed. The day when it did finally arrive started with boys, led by Master Longhurst with a cornet, singing carols at the Homes as well as the Workhouse.

At eight o'clock, the children were given breakfast of rolls and butter. At ten, the boys were each given a toy; at ten-thirty the boys attended the Christmas service at St Peter's Church, followed by a Christmas dinner. For the girls and younger children there was a large Christmas tree, and the children of Mr Newton of Crowmarsh gave nine dressed dolls for the children.

Many of the ladies of the district gave gifts for children: Miss A Hedges gave oranges and walnuts, Miss Fairthorne gave a packet of sweets, an orange and a book to each child, and the Berkshire and Wiltshire Toy Guild donated a large box of toys. Mrs Longhurst, the Matron of the Cottage Homes, sent each of the 32 children a Christmas card.

Although compared with today this may seem very little, it is lot more than many of the district's poor were having.



### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 14th December

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Andrew Johnson, Stuart Soames, Nigel Hannigan, David Rowley, Elizabeth Ryall and Stephen Sherbourne; Sue Rance (Clerk); County Councillor Mark Gray.

Apologies for absence from Councillors Francesca Jones, Denise Hall, David Mannering, Fleur Stevenson, and David Topliss, District Councillors Bloomfield and Pullen and Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer).

The meeting was preceded by a planning discussion with Mr Ian Nutt of Lister Wilder about their plans to extend the parts department at their Portway premises.

### Matters arising from the November meeting

Cllr John Cotton, Leader of SODC, had replied to Cllr Hall about traffic problems on the A4074, supporting the Parish Council's initiative in running a traffic survey.

Construction of a crossing on the main road there will depend on the decision on the Newnham Manor development, which is expected to be taken to the planning committee in February.

#### **Finance**

A schedule of payments was agreed, plus a cheque for £618.00 to Arrow Fencing for repairs to fencing at North Stoke. Income and expenditure for the new playground will be shown separately in the accounts, as will the neighbourhood plan accounts.

It was agreed that a budget meeting will be held in January in order to set a precept to SODC for our share of money from the Council Tax.

Requests for grants from Sue Ryder and the Chilterns Conservation Board were deferred to the next meeting. North Stoke Village Hall had been unsuccessful in their bid for grant funding from WREN. Cllr Hannigan proposed a grant of £1,000 from the Parish Council (20% of the total cost) towards re-decoration. A decision on this was deferred to the February meeting.

### **Planning**

P17/S3807/HH: Ground floor rear extension and partial garage conversion. Proposed pitched roof over. 5 Murren Croft, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8EZ.
PERMISSION GRANTED.

P17/S2848/HH: Raise roof with additional first floor accommodation, rear extension, front porch and garage conversion. 6 Wallingford Road, North Stoke, OX10 6BD.

P17/S4145/PDH (Permitted Development): Proposed conservatory: depth: 4m, overall height:3.35m, height to eaves: 2.25m. 2 The Limes, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8HF. RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P17/S4253/LB (Listed Building): Install multifuel stove (log burner) into existing large open fireplace and run a high grade (904) stainless steel flexible liner through chimney. Replace existing anti-bird cowl on chimney pot for new one (stainless steel). 19C Foundry Cottage, The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8EA. RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P17/S3807/HH: Conservatory replacement. 35 Park View, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8BL. RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

#### Application withdrawn:

P16/S3800/O (Outline): Re-development of CABI site with a care home and new offices. CABI International, Nosworthy Way, Mongewell, OX10 8DE. This application has been withdrawn by the applicants and no further action will be taken. Note that this is not the application including 91 houses: that one was approved after an appeal.

Appeal ref: APP/Q3115/W/17/3186858 under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act

P16/S3608/O: Outline planning application for up to 150 dwellings with associated access, public open space, landscaping and amenity areas. Land to the east of Benson Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8ED.

An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against SODC's decision to refuse the above application. The appeal will be determined on the basis of an inquiry. All representations made to determine the application have

been forwarded to the Planning Inspectorate and the appellant. These will be considered by the Inspector when determining the appeal.

It was agreed that the Parish Council will apply for a Rule 6(6) designation so that a councillor may represent the council at the appeal hearing. It was agreed to seek quotes for legal advice on what grounds for appeal might be best pursued.

### Neighbourhood plan

The Strategic Environmental Assessment questionnaire has been submitted. An application is being made to SODC for a grant of £10,000. Central government funding may be applied for in April 2018.

Cllr Griffin attended a workshop on survey design at SODC with other parishes at a similar stage. More volunteers may be needed to assist with our plan – please contact him or Dr Nick Robins. The initial landscape survey of potential sites will be carried out, and a traffic survey will be done after the school holidays. In addition another household survey will be needed. A habitat impact assessment will be carried out through Natural England at a later stage, needed in view of the proximity of nationally-important nature reserves at Wittenham Clumps and Aston Rowant.

#### **Environment and recreation committee**

Pavilion and recreation ground

Cllr Johnson reported that extra maintenance work is needed at the nature area. The blackthorn near the path around the area needs cutting back and the area next to the river needs clearing of fallen branches and brush. A quote of £619 for this work was accepted. Later on, wood chippings will be added to the path through the nature area to the campsite car park. Daffodil bulbs will be planted on the verge close to Wallingford Bridge.

#### Play area action group

Cllr Johnson reported that grant applications now need to be prepared, in particular for WREN and SODC, for which similar information will be required. Volunteers will be very welcome to help with this work. It was agreed to put an article in *Crowmarsh News*, giving an update on progress with a request for volunteers to assist.

Cllr Rowley had been asked to provide information to Sport England on how the recreation ground sports fields relate to the proposed playground area and one of the flood compensation areas.

### **Report of County Councillor Mark Gray**

The County Council is consulting on the 2018-19 budget: council tax is likely to rise by 5%.

County Highways had carried out extensive gritting in the recent freezing conditions.

The children's centre in Cholsey is doing very well. A number of Crowmarsh families are currently joining in activities there.

The County Library at Westgate is to re-open with improved facilities: the family history section is now based there.

Superfast broadband is now available in 95% of the county. Over 50% of households now have fibre broadband.

The Government's Oxford to Cambridge expressway project is being debated by OCC and most councillors oppose the scheme because of concerns that it will lead to overdevelopment.

The new minerals and waste strategy is now in place. However, the application for gravel extraction between Wallingford and Cholsey was approved recently.

### **Next meeting**

The annual budget meeting will be held on Monday 15th January 2018 at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School, starting at 7.30pm.

The next full Parish Council meeting will be held on Thursday 1st February 2018 at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome.
