#### Get help with home repairs

Mrs K who lived in Cherwell District Council, who had a cardiovascular disease had her ageing heating system assessed as causing a danger to her health. The draughty doors and windows with rotten wooden frames were doing little to keep out the cold weather, making house freezing cold. She accepted a referral to an organisation who helped with getting her heating system replaced along with new windows and doors. # Temporary footpath closures in Crowmarsh

Oxfordshire County Council has issued an order relating to the temporary closure of footpaths Nos 181/3 & 2, to the east of Benson Lane. Closure Order no 2020 notes that these footpaths will be closed because of housing development work being carried out that will affect them. The closure will take effect from 1st February 2020 and will last for six months, or until works are completed, whichever is the sooner. For clarification, there are maps on the village notice board and the Parish Council web site.

#### The SODC Offices at Crowmarsh

The 15th January 2020 is the fifth anniversary of the burning down of the SODC offices, which I'm sure we all remember. I was woken up at about 3.40am by the blue lights flashing through my bedroom windows that looked towards Benson Lane, and from the window looking towards the SODC offices there was an orange glow coming through the curtains.

I woke my wife, Ann, who had somehow managed to sleep through the sound of sirens and flashing lights and we watched the Fire Brigade remove planks from the boundary fence near our house, to gain access to the hydrant in Winter's Field as they were unable to find one on the SODC site.

I decided to dress and with my camera I wandered around the grounds taking photographs of the Fire Brigade in action. When I walked down the lane to the recreation ground, I sensed I was being followed by what I thought was a squirrel walking along the fence on one side of the lane. On looking up I was somewhat surprised to see it was a chicken walking along the top of fence to the end of the lane with me, where he very obligingly stopped and allowed me to take a photograph.

It was very lucky the high winds that night were blowing to the north, driving the flames



and smoke away from Crowmarsh. If they had been blowing in the opposite direction, the risk of the fire spreading to houses nearby would have been high. By eight o'clock the fire spread along the whole of upper floor in the north wing. The funeral parlour next door was also set alight and a thatched cottage at Roke was badly damaged by fire.

The fire brigade slowly brought the fire under control although they were there all day damping down. Incredibly many residents of Benson Lane slept through the whole incident. The next day a fire broke out in the roof of the south wing but was brought quickly under control.

Andrew Main was arrested and charged with starting all three fires but was found to be mentally unfit to stand trial and was sectioned under the Mental Health Act. Since 2015 the building has been demolished and we now wait for the return of SODC to the site, maybe.



Many people will now be aware that The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS), a group of local volunteers, has been honoured with the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, the highest award a voluntary group can receive in the UK.

The award is to TWHAS for 'Engaging the community with local history through research, archaeology, publications and its museum.'

The Museum is now closed for its annual refresh but will re-open on 3rd March with a brand new local exhibition 'Plague, Pus and Pills - the history of Wallingford's hospitals', which will trace the story of caring for the sick from medieval times to the present day'.

In addition, there will be special events during the year - watch out for the Easter workshops 'Can You FACE It?' (which will appeal to ages 7 to 99!). With an introduction to forensic science and plenty of imagination you too can make your own facial reconstruction, complete with eyes, eyebrows, nose, lips, hair and ears.

Think penicillin is just thanks to Fleming? Think again!

When Alexander Fleming was awarded a Nobel Prize in 1945, he shared it with Howard Florey and Ernst Chain. Why? Because while Fleming first observed and named penicillin, it was Florey, Chain and a group of scientists working in Oxford who developed it into a viable drug. In this talk our 'Curator Without Museum' will tell the story of the life saving work carried out in the Dunn School, the wartime struggles the scientists faced and the experiences of the first patients to be treated with penicillin.

Our speaker, Marie-Louise Kerr has over 15 years' experience of working in the heritage sector, including 10 years as a curator looking after museum collections and developing exhibitions. She has cared for a wide variety of collections such as regimental, textile, social history, archaeology and the history of science.

Every object holds a story, and the love of discovering this information and sharing it with others is what drives a curator. Researching artefacts is the area of museum work that Marie-Louise enjoys the most and is one of the reasons she decided to follow this career.



#### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 5th December 2019

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames, David Rowley, Ken McCrea, Liz Ryall, Andrew Johnson, Fleur Stevenson, Jon Grove, Gaynor Hopkins and Julian Park, Sue Rance (Clerk), Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer).

Apologies were received from Councillor David Topliss and from our County and District Councillors.

#### Matters from the previous meeting

Daffodil bulbs donated by Grundons have been planted at the pavilion and village hall, Cox's Lane and Robert Sparrow Gardens and other places around the parish.

Quotes are in hand to clear overgrown vegetation at Cox's Lane and Robert Sparrow Gardens and this work should take place soon.

#### **Finance**

Payments made since the last meeting were approved. The draft budget for the year 2020-21 was discussed and approved with some minor changes. It was agreed not to increase the precept (our share of the Council Tax), which will remain at £38,201 for another year.

#### **District Councillor's report**

The District Councillor's report had been circulated.

Key points were that the District Council Local Plan remains "frozen" while the holding order from the Secretary of State remains in place; most small grant funds have been allocated for this year; a workshop on affordable housing is planned for the end of January; work has begun on the design specification for the new council offices in Benson Lane; the Climate

Emergency Advisory Committee has recommended goals for the council to achieve carbon neutrality, and the Council is looking into decriminalising parking offences and taking control of enforcement, so they would receive income from parking fines and have control over all parking restrictions in our towns and villages.

#### **Review of strategic priorities**

Cllr Stevenson circulated the results of the survey so far. It was agreed to keep the survey open and to advertise it in the January *Crowmarsh News* (see page 3). More responses are welcomed to help the parish council update our strategic objectives in 2020.

#### Neighbourhood plan

The pre-submission version of the Crowmarsh parish neighbourhood plan had been circulated by Mr Nigel Hannigan and Mr Nick Robins, who attended the meeting. They have spent a long time developing the plan (which looks forward 15 years to 2034) and consulting interested parties including the District Council.

The plan provides for a higher level of housing development than is required under the SODC local plan. When the plan is made it will enable the parish council to receive 25% of community infrastructure levy (CIL) from developments and will defend us against future speculative development.

After discussion it was agreed to adopt the pre-submission plan to go forward for consultation. However, a subsequent response from the District Council means that consultation on the plan will not begin until further work has been done on the strategic environmental assessment that accompanies it.

### **Environment and Recreation Ground Committee**

Architects have been invited to visit the pavilion to draw up plans for modifications including toilets.

The next meeting of the Environment and Recreation Ground Committee will be held on

Monday 20th January 2020.

Funding may be available from SODC for tree planting, and ideas for locations and types of new trees will be welcomed.

#### **Traffic and Transport**

The speed indicator display in The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford, is not always displaying the message below the speed figure: the battery will be checked. We will continue to monitor all these devices and may consider new or alternative locations in future.

Cllr Ryall reported that a lorry had broken down across The Street opposite the entrance to Jewsons and the road had to be closed by the police.

Cllr Soames expressed concern about a planned four-day closure of the B4009 road in February 2020 to connect two new houses in North Stoke to the water supply. The Clerk will make enquiries about this and involve County Councillor Gray, with particular reference to the effect on bus routes and the school bus.

Cllr Grove suggested installing white gateway markers at the entrances to North Stoke village on the B4009. Cllr McCrea reported that this was being done on the main road through Ipsden parish at a cost of £10,000. County Councillor Gray will be asked about this.

#### Accessibility of our website

Cllr Grove has taken advice from Christine Lalley of OALC about how to ensure our website is accessible to visually impaired people and those with other disabilities.

There is an online training course available at a cost of £95 + VAT. It was agreed to fund this course if Cllr Grove or another member can take part.

#### Next meeting

There is no meeting in January, so the next meeting of the Parish Council will be held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 6th February, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend.
