

A Crowmarsh Hurricane?

It was about noon on Sunday 6th November 1861, after a morning of heavy rain and hail, when the wind increased considerably. The speed of the wind increased so much that it was described as a hurricane. In the Wallingford Castle Grounds it uprooted three large trees; from here it moved across the river into Howbery Park where two large elms lifted from the ground in the centre of the park. It then reached Benson Lane. Several more trees were blown down but as it left the Park it lost its power and did little further damage beyond there.

Just as one of the trees was falling into Benson Lane, a horse and cart driven by Mr Garrett, of Crowmarsh, with two passengers was passing. The cart was struck by some of the branches, and this, plus the force of the wind, turned the cart on to its side into the ditch by the side of the road. Mr Garrett was badly bruised; the other two occupants of the cart were unhurt, the horse pulling the cart also escaped injury. Because the hurricane was so localised there was very little damage elsewhere.

In 1934 what was described as a whirlwind travelled the length of the main drive of Howbery Park. It damaged the elms that lined the drive and uprooted a tree onto the Lodge at the main gate, causing considerable damage to the rear of the building

In October 1987 I can remember the high winds that struck the south of England, watching from the safety of the Reynold's Building as three large trees were blown down. In total, 54 trees of various sizes were lost on Howbery Park that day, all of which were replaced over the following 18 months.

A new history for Crowmarsh

The Oxfordshire Victoria County History Trust has launched its project of research on the last few remaining South Chilterns parishes, including our four ecclesiastical parishes of Crowmarsh Gifford, Newnham Murren, Mongewell and North Stoke.

The south Chilterns parishes, which occupy a loop of the Thames between Crowmarsh on the west and Shiplake on the east, will make up Volume 20 of the Victoria County History (VCH). Begun in the 19th century, the aim of the VCH is to publish, by County, a detailed history of every parish and town in the country. The topics covered are settlement, landscape and ownership, buildings, agriculture and trade, social and religious history. The research and writing will be carried out by a team of four professional historians who draw on local and outside expertise.

The first draft parish histories for the area will be added to the VCH website during 2016 (www.victoriacountyhistory.ac.uk/oxfordshire).

Historical research is very labour-intensive and progress is subject to the Trust's success in raising financial support; donations are very welcome.

Family Archaeology Day

On Saturday 23rd July from 11am to 4pm Wallingford Museum has organised another exciting Family Archaeology Day at the Museum.

An actual archaeological excavation will be taking place in the Museum courtyard and you'll be able to learn all about how archaeology is done from the experts. At last year's dig a rare medieval chess piece was discovered – now on display at the Museum!

You'll also be able to take part in some 'handson' work – pot-washing, sieving, and much more. Then you can find out how to begin to identify the sort of pottery that helps to date the finds from archaeology, and even try making your own pots for fun!

In addition our expert, Steve Head, will be on hand to identify your fossils and any other objects you might have dug up. Steve will also be able to show you some of his own fossil collection from around the world.

Also explore the delights of the Museum – find the Roman skeleton, the woolly mammoth bones, spearheads, daggers, stones from the lost Priory; handle the cannon ball, search the 'smelly-feely' drawers, and complete a quiz sheet.

Of course, you can also have a good look at this year's special museum exhibitions, including '300 Years of Cartoons!' which is a spectacular private collection showing interesting, and often hilarious examples of the development and use of cartoons from their origins and through the last three centuries. This is a place where children can be inspired to draw their own cartoon.

Then there is '1066: William comes to Wallingford' - why did William the Conqueror come to Wallingford after the Battle of Hastings? There are also displays about 'At home with the Queen of Crime: Agatha Christie', and

Midsomer Murders (Wallingford is Causton in the TV series).

So there's plenty of family entertainment for this special archaeology day!





Science Exchange Wallingford

Treating Autoimmune Disorders - the Good, the Bad and the Ugly!

A talk by Andrew Nesbitt, Field Medical Director, UCB

Good progress has been made in developing treatments for autoimmune disorders such as rheumatoid arthritis and Crohn's disease; the various approaches will be explained. However, the treatments do not cure the vast majority of patients and some do not respond at all for reasons which are unclear. In addition, various side-effects are associated with treatments and so Dr Nesbitt will describe and discuss possible treatments.

Andrew Nesbitt took a first degree in Biochemistry and a PhD in Cellular Immunology. Since then he has worked for Celltech and now UCB, researching potential treatments for autoimmune diseases.

Science Exchange Wallingford's next meeting is at 7.30pm on Tuesday 5th July in Wallingford School Library, St George's Road, Wallingford. Meetings are very informal. Speakers talk for about half an hour, then we break for refreshments and return for a lively question and answer session.

300 years of Capability Brown

The Capability Brown Festival 2016 celebrates the life, work and legacy of 18th century English landscape architect and Royal Gardener to King George III, Lancelot 'Capability' Brown, whose 300th anniversary falls this year.

Brown is associated with more than 250 landscapes across England and Wales, including the well-known estates of Blenheim Palace (Oxfordshire), Chatsworth (Derbyshire) and Croome (Worcestershire) to hidden gems such as Compton Verney (Warwickshire) and Milton Abbey (Dorset). His client list included one King, six Prime Ministers and half of the House of Lords.

The Capability Brown Festival unites 21 partner organisations in the UK's largest festival of its kind to date. The Festival is managed by the Landscape Institute and is funded with a £911,100 grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund, with additional match funding and funding in kind from the Festival's partners and supporters.

Many Brown sites, including those not normally open to the public, will host special events, tours and activities throughout 2016. Several events have already been hosted at various Brown's landscapes, and there are many more family-friendly events set to take centre stage over the summer holidays.

Most local to Oxfordshire are the events at Blenheim Palace on the weekends of 9-10 July and 19-21 August, when there will be Horse and Carriage rides. Travel across Brown's landscape at the Palace, just as Brown himself would have done in 18th century Britain!

The Festival has also launched a new education pack which can be used at Brown's land-scapes and in schools as part of Brown's ongoing legacy, or used at home over the summer holidays, when families can visit and explore some of Brown's landscapes. The pack is primarily aimed at children aged between seven and 11, but has suggested activities for all ages – from tots to teenagers.

Children can also learn about Brown himself, by reading passages of text from letters between Brown and his clients dating back to the 1700s and taking part in the 'visionary vs vandal' debate, aided by information cue cards.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 9th June 2016

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Andrew Johnson, Andrew Hermsen, Stephen Sherbourne, Ann Sharp, David Mannering and Stuart Soames; Sue Rance (Clerk) and Ms CM Malcolm (Finance Officer); County Councillor Mark Gray.

Apologies were received from Councillors Fleur Stevenson and Francesca Jones.

Matters from previous meeting

County Cllr Gray recommended consulting as soon as possible on use of Section 106 funds from proposed development at the former Springs Hotel site in North Stoke for improvements to road safety, such as a chicane at the entrance to the village. He would ask Mark Francis of OCC Highways to visit the site.

Contractors Scofell have now started grass cutting. The contract will be reviewed at the end of the summer to ensure that grass cutting will start more promptly next year.

The road to the Riverside Park has been built but not yet opened. Cllr Gray will investigate the reason for the delay in the county council adopting it.

Finance

Payments made in May were approved including £1118.34 for improving the drainage at the path across the nature area, £400 for repairs to toilets at the pavilion and £262.66 for fire extinguisher maintenance. £450 had been received from British Gas for the feed-in tariff for the previous quarter.

The annual governance statement was discussed and agreed. The audited accounts are available for inspection – see details on the website and noticeboard.

Four community events have been planned in the parish to mark Her Majesty's 90th birthday: The Parish Council's grant application had been approved and a payment of £672 will be received from SODC, to be divided among the organisers of the local events:

1st Crowmarsh Gifford Scouts: £86 Mongewell Street Party: £270 Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall Children's Disco: £239

North Stoke Street Party: £350.

A grant request from Home-Start will be considered at the next meeting.

County Councillor's report

The parish council should consult Keith Stenning at OCC about possible areas of work that we could undertake on behalf of the county council.

Parish Councils may make use of OCC minibuses (with drivers) when not being used for school transport, at a cost of £18 per hour, for example to take elderly people to day centres. This could supplement existing volunteer driver services.

There is a new initiative involving buying up beds in care homes in order to avoid bed blocking in hospitals.

Children's Services: most children's centres are likely to continue as a community initiative, with two new shared locality bases to supplement the existing provision. There will be a peripatetic service to provide children's activities in towns and villages.

SODC Planning Committee Meeting

The CABI planning application P15/S3387/FUL will be coming before the SODC Planning Committee on June 15th, starting at 6pm, at Didcot Civic Hall. Because of confusion over a withdrawal notification the Chair of Planning was unable to attend this meeting due to a prior commitment and County Councillor Mark Gray agreed to present the Parish Council's objections to this application.

Feedback from Annual Parish Meeting

The Chairman reported that although attendence was lower than last year, useful presentations had been given by SODC Planning Policy and Thames Water as well as

by County Councillor Mark Gray. A written report had been submitted by the District Councillors. Thanks to all who attended and gave feedback.

Environment and Recreation Ground Committee

The committee is due to meet in June. Scofell has carried out drainage improvements on the path at the nature area and trimming of the hawthorn bushes is in hand. A six-a-side football tournament had been held: parking was not a serious problem as the former SODC office car park was made available. Mr Strange has raised the question of the Parish Council purchasing a lawnmower and this is on the capital expenditure list for consideration.

Cllr Sherbourne reported that the geraniums are now available and will be planted in the flower tubs at the Queen's Head roundabout.

Traffic and Transport

Portway Pedestrian Crossing Project: Cllr Sherbourne reported on a meeting with Oxford City Council who have experience of this type of crossing and are prepared to quote. Two quotes have been received for a topographical survey and initial design. After discussion it was agreed to engage Peter Brett and to proceed with a topographical survey and initial design at an approximate cost of £2000.

Bus services: After 20th July the 139 bus service from Wallingford to Henley will be re-routed via Crowmarsh Gifford again. The 136 bus will serve both Wallingford to Cholsey and Wallingford to Benson. Timetables and fares might change.

As reported, the 134 GoRide bus service through Crowmarsh Gifford and North Stoke will continue with the current timetable until 20th July and then operate without subsidy with a reduced timetable and higher fares (see separate article).

Some Thames Travel buses will not run after 20th July, but the commercial services including the X39/X40 to Reading and Oxford are unaffected. Look out for new timetables and notices at bus stops.

Checks are being carried out to ensure that licences are paid for fishing and boating. A rowing event is planned for the near future.

North Stoke events

Cllr Soames expressed thanks to the 1st Crowmarsh Gifford scouts who have cleared the path down to the recreation ground at North Stoke to enable access by vehicles.

A very successful barbecue and bonfire was held on 8th June for the Queen's Birthday. Consideration is now being given to the use of the recreation ground as an overflow car park for the Open Gardens scheme on 26th June, expected to raise around £2000.

Next meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Thursday 7th July at North Stoke Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome, as usual.
