

# Science Exchange Wallingford

The Challenge of Antimicrobial Resistance and its Relevance in the Environment: a talk by Dr Andrew Singer at 7.30pm on Tuesday 11th July.

Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) in the clinical setting has received increasing coverage in the media in the past few years. However, emerging research shows that it is more than just the overuse of antibiotics which leads to AMR. The use of biocides and heavy metals contribute to the global problem of AMR and targeting antibiotic overuse alone will not solve it

The talk will highlight the complexity of the drivers and pathways involved in the current global problem that is Antimicrobial Resistance.

Andrew Singer is a molecular microbial ecologist with expertise in pollution chemistry and water quality assessment and mitigation based at the NERC Centre for Ecology and Hydrology in Crowmarsh Gifford.

Science Exchange Wallingford's meeting is at Wallingford School Library, St George's Road, Wallingford. Meetings are very informal. Speakers talk for about half an hour, then we break for refreshments and return for a lively question and answer session.

#### **Prize Fights around Wallingford**

Prize fighting or bare-knuckle fighting had been banned in England from the mid-19th century. This was because of its association with heavy gambling and the brutality of the fights where eye gouging and wrestling were allowed. Very often if the man who won was not the favourite with crowds, rioting would follow.

Following the ban, promoters of the bare-knuckle fights held fights at secret locations in the country. The newly formed rural police forces would try their best to stop these fights, with limited success. These bare-knuckle fights would often last over 100 rounds, permanent injuries were common, and sometimes death. Buried at Hanslop, Bucking-hamshire is Alex Mackey, a fighter who died from injuries he received in a fight in 1830. In 1867, the Marquess of Queensberry drew up his rules for boxing, which are the basis of the rules used in boxing today.

A fight was planned for July 1860 in a meadow near Wallingford Road Station which had become a favourite site to hold bare-knuckle fights, as this was the second one held here in two months. A special train from London arrived at Wallingford Road Station at five in the morning, bringing the two contestants, Crutchley and Goss, and their supporters and

a large number of gamblers.

Word soon got around and a large number of spectators came to witness the contest. Some of the Berkshire police were there, but as the fight was held in Oxfordshire, they were powerless to stop it, although they were able to watch the contest from the Berkshire bank. The fight lasted some 3 hours, 35 minutes; after 115 rounds, Goss was declared the winner, because Crutchley's eyes were so badly damaged he was unable to see clearly.

That October, another bare-knuckle fight was arranged in a field near Crowmarsh, but the Berkshire and Oxfordshire Police Forces were better organised this time. The fight was stopped before it began.

The managers then caught their hire train at Wallingford Road Station and proceeded towards Didcot with the police in hot pursuit. At Didcot they were able to change to the down line, returning to Wallingford Road Station, leaving the police stranded at Didcot.

But like an episode from a Keystone Cops movie, the police were able to commandeer an engine and returned to the Wallingford Road Station and they were able to stop the fight, which lasted half an hour.



Thank you to everyone who supported our Flower Festival and Summer Fete last month which raised more than £1,300. Our next fundraising event will be on Friday 7th July at 7.30pm for which we welcome the return of Felicity Burrell and Glynne Stackhouse to entertain us with "Music for a Summer's Evening" on the piano. Along with our Quiz Nights, these events provide significant funds for the running of our church. Indeed, last year we had a deficit of over £6,000 and so clearly this is not a sustainable position for the future.

So, where do we go for help? Contrary to what many people believe, the church receives no income from the state. We rely entirely on our parishioners to fund our work and Christian witness, and for the maintenance of our Grade I listed church building. We apply for grants when we have major repairs and building works, but our normal running costs are around £34,000 each year, with around two-thirds of this coming through the giving of our congregation.

That still leaves a significant gap and so we're looking at ways of encouraging others who

appreciate the existence of the church in the village to help ensure our future presence, not only on Sundays but for the occasional services such as funerals and weddings. I am sure that we could raise the necessary funds by declaring "a state of emergency" and warning of the threat of closure, but that is certainly not yet the case – at least whilst we have the support of our wider Anglican team in Wallingford and especially Brightwell-cum-Sotwell. Also, a one-off appeal would only be a temporary solution.

In the past, my predecessors have held annual "Gift Days"; another option might be to launch a "Friends of St Mary Magdalene" scheme, where parishioners pledge a monthly donation. Either option allows us to reclaim the Gift Aid of 25p for every £1 given by a taxpayer.

I would welcome your views, thoughts and suggestions and hopefully a group may be formed to lead any such initiatives.

Then you can identify the sort of pottery that helps to date the finds from archaeology, and even try making your own pots for fun!

There'll be a display of things found in past years in the Museum courtyard, including pictures of the medieval fireplace found in 2016 and the rare medieval chess piece.

We have details of the recently found Roman villa site at Cholsey (excavated by Foundation Archaeology) and the archaeology happening under the old Waitrose site in St Martin's Street (excavated by Cotswold Archaeology).

Come and explore the delights of the Museum - find the Roman skeleton, the woolly mammoth bones, spearheads, daggers, stones from the lost Priory; handle the cannon ball, search the 'smelly-feely' drawers, and complete a quiz sheet – plenty to interest the whole family!

This year's special museum exhibitions include what Wallingford Castle looked like, 'Pettits: past to present' exhibition, and the 'Ways to Wallingford' exhibition looks at the development of transport in the town over the ages, including the importance of RAF Benson. We also have displays about 'At home with the Queen of Crime: Agatha Christie', and Midsomer Murders (Wallingford is Causton in the TV series).

There's plenty of family entertainment for this special archaeology day!

Entry is by Museum ticket at the door - £5 per adult (which gives unlimited entry until 30th

#### **Finance**

#### **Annual meeting**

The Chairman reported on the Annual Parish Meeting, held on 18th May. Six feedback sheets had been received from residents who attended the meeting.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan**

A map of the Neighbourhood Plan area (which covers the whole parish) will soon be approved by SODC, and a baseline report is being prepared.

#### **Environment and Recreation Committee**

The committee had met on 22nd May. Chris Strange hopes to obtain a net for the basket-ball post. The company that installed the facilities has gone into receivership.

Fences at the play area adjoining Cox's Lane and at Howbery Farm had been repaired.


