Parking in our village

Many of our residential areas were not designed for the number of cars we now have and there are sometimes problems with parking, some (but not all) caused by visitors to the parish.

The main guidelines are the Highway Code and showing consideration for other people. This includes only parking on the road, never on the pavement; do not park within 10m of a junction (e.g. on the white lines at the entrance to Thames Mead); do not obstruct entrances or access for emergency vehicles (e.g. on the approach to the recreation ground); don't park in a turning area or bus layby, or beside drop kerbs or on private roads.

Parking on the streets is not reserved for residents except in some marked bays: we do not own the road space outside our house, even if we are used to using it.

The Annual Parish Meeting – report

The Annual Parish Meeting was held at Crowmarsh Gifford School on Tuesday 19th May, starting at 7.30pm.

Light refreshments were provided and there was a talk by Richard Neale on Crowmarsh archaeology of the Anglo-Saxon period. We heard from representatives of Thames Water and Thames Valley Police, and several issues were discussed for the Parish Council and other authorities to address. These included speeding traffic and mains drainage.

Benson Community Health Fair a great success

"It was huge success" said John Reid, Chair of Benson Patients' Panel. "I heard complimentary remarks from many people from the village and from outside."

Benson Patients' Panel and Mill Stream Surgery were delighted with the support shown to the Benson Community Health Fair held on 25 April at the Parish Hall. They were very grateful to the Parish Council staff for help in setting up the hall, and to RAF Benson for help in erecting the marquee used for the outdoor events.

Around 300 visitors came to the Fair, where there were over 40 stallholders and many

health related activities taking place.

A wide variety of talks in the Parish Hall Lounge and Committee Room included "How to use the NHS" and "NHS Career choices" given by medical staff from Millstream Surgery. A practical demonstration and talk about "Essential First Aid" was given by St John Ambulance and there was so much interest in first aid skills that we plan to arrange some longer First Aid courses in the Village.

MacMillan Cancer Support gave a supportive and informative session on "Living with Cancer" and a local deputy headteacher gave a reassuring talk on "Parenting Teenagers". There were also sessions on "Mental illness" and "Eating for Health".

Stalls in the Parish Hall and outside offered everything from blood pressure testing by surgery staff to the Alexander Technique, and from Mental Health to Accident Prevention Advice. The Fair covered a very wide range of health related topics from the directly medical to the role of music, art and dance in promoting good health. Local schools took part in a poster competition on Healthy Living and their work was displayed in the hall.

There were plenty of opportunities to have a go at practical activity sessions – a rowing machine, Nordic walking, health walks, running, circle dancing, table tennis, Tai Chi and Powerhoop fitness. Several visitors came along on their bicycles and Dave Curl the Bike Repair Man was on hand to offer free bike checks.

The Benson Guides, led by Helen Stevenson, served free healthy refreshments to visitors. "I thought the Guides and Brownies were delightful - especially that they came and served you at your stand" said Carol Pedrick of the Citizens' Advice Bureau.

"I was knocked out by the scope of the whole organisation" said Janet Burtt from the village. "I talked to lots of the organisations taking part and they thought it was quite brilliant, and a great opportunity for getting their message out widely from one location. It has also put our Patients' Panel and Benson's Mill Stream Surgery on the map."

Of the many complimentary remarks from our stallholders from outside the village, one message kept coming through. "What a fabulous community spirit you have in Benson - everyone seemed so keen to get involved."

We plan to follow up with some smaller events around specific interest areas – Carers, Mental Health, First Aid, and we are optimistic that the Benson community will support these initiatives too. Thank you for your interest in the Community Health Fair – and watch this space.

Garden Party at Newnham Manor, 1925

Thanks once again to the generosity of Mr Livingston-Learmonth, the beautiful grounds of Newnham Manor provided an attractive setting for Crowmarsh Parish Church Patronal Festival on Wednesday 15th June 1925. The Parochial Church Council organised the event, particularly Mr H Dean and Mr E Ponking. The object of the party was to raise money for the Church Funds and provide a treat for the children of Crowmarsh and a trip to Wembley for the older ones.

On a very sunny day the Vicar, the Reverend T.W.L. Caspersz RN (a former Royal Navy Chaplain), gave a speech of thanks to Mr Livingstone-Learmonth for allowing the Party to be held in his grounds. Miss Livingstone-Learmonth opened the proceedings and also said how pleased she was that so many people had attended the garden party. She was then presented with a bouquet by Dorothy Honey.

The Church Missionary Society had a number of stalls; the Fancy Goods stall was run by Mrs and Miss Pettit and Mrs Percy Turner, the Bookstall by Miss Phyllis Woodley and Mr A Thorpe. Of the sideshows, Bowling on Squares was in the charge of Miss Jakeman and Mrs Keen; Hidden Card, Mr H Parrott; Crazy Golf, Miss Chapman; Hoops-in, Mr F Emery, assisted by his son William Emery;

Pennies on the Square, Mr J Harvey. There was of course a Palmist, a Madame Zora. The teas were provided by Mrs Muggleton (of Benson Lane) and Mrs Parrott. The imposing figure of Mr Mulvaney rendered sterling service on the gate.

An outdoor wireless set was installed by Mr F Walker, with a powerful speaker which allowed people to listen to programmes being broadcast by the BBC. During the broadcasts a collection was made for the Daily News Fund, for providing wirelesses for the London Hospitals. £2-16s-3d (£2.82) was collected.

The Whist Drive was won by Miss Lois Giles for the ladies and Mr A Barrett for the men. The raffle was won by Mr Percy Messenger (a ham) and second prize was a smaller ham won by Mr Charlie Durham (of Fish and Chips fame); Miss Bessie Crook won a tea service on the Hoops-in stall, and Mrs Brown of Crowmarsh won at the Hidden Card stall.

In the evening a dance was held, and 160 people danced on the illuminated lawns to the music of Optimists' Band, finally finishing a little after midnight.

The Garden Party seems to have been a great success and over £50 was raised for the Church Fund.

History and Wallingford in June

There are several amazing events in Wallingford during June, which should tempt you to make your way to Wallingford Museum to find out more about the Town's history.

On Saturday 13th June there will be a peal from the bells of St Mary's Church from 12.30pm for about three hours, in commemoration of the signing of Magna Carta. This peal is an initiative which will be happening nationwide during that weekend. As well as listening to the peal, why not come along to the Museum that day to see the 'Magna Carta and All That!' display, highlighting Wallingford's role in the events of 1215, and why it is one of only four towns mentioned in Magna Carta.

Then on Sunday 21st June there is the Town's inaugural 'Festival of Cycling' - a day celebrating many forms of cycling including community events as well as competitive cycling. It will be based around the tight streets of the town.

One of the races will be the 'Agatha Christie Youth Girls' race! Use that as an opportunity to visit the Museum to see the exhibition 'At Home with the Queen of Crime' which presents Agatha Christie's life of 42 years residing in the town. There is also the 'Midsomer Murders' display, showing the Wallingford connections with this popular TV series.

The weekend of Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th June will bring many visitors to the town to experience Wallingford at the time of the Civil War and to witness a re-enactment battle by the English Civil War Society. What better occasion to learn about Wallingford Castle's role in the Civil War – part of the acclaimed new exhibition 'Wallingford's Royal Castle Revealed' which has fresh historical research into the life and importance of one of the greatest royal strongholds of Medieval England.

A £4 ticket will give adults (children free) unlimited access to the Museum for the whole 2015 season. It is open as follows:

The Origins of Wessex

June's talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) will be by Professor Helena Hamerow. She will present 'The Origins of Wessex: re-shaping identities in the Upper Thames Valley, 5th-7th centuries'.

The Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Wessex is popularly assumed to have originated around its later capital, Winchester. In fact, its origins lie in the Upper Thames Valley (stretching roughly from Lechlade to Reading), with the emergence of a people referred to in early sources as the Gewisse, who, by the end of the 7th century, had come to be known as the West Saxons.

This talk considers how new, post-Roman identities and forms of authority developed in the Upper Thames Valley with the emergence of the Gewisse. Drawing mostly on archaeological sources, the talk examines the formation of a 'Gewissen' identity and the British contribution to it, and how leading families of the Gewisse used material culture and the landscape itself to establish their position.

Helena Hamerow is known within the town, as she was a member of the project team which has researched Wallingford for the 'Burh to Borough Project'.

This talk will be held on Friday 12th June, 7.45 for 8pm at Wallingford Town Hall.

Make tracks for Wallingford's first model railway show

Wallingford will host its first ever model railway exhibition on Sunday 21st June. The event is being held at St John's School, Wallingford.

More than 15 model railway layouts, along with a number of trade stands, will be on show in a variety of scales from tiny Z gauge to garden-sized G scale.

The exhibition is being well supported by clubs and modellers from around Oxfordshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Hampshire, and many of the layouts are new to the exhibition circuit.

Of particular interest is Kuritu Line, a twodimension layout of both rural and urban Japanese scenes. There will also be a selection of layouts: Plas Halt, Dawes Creek and Halland. 

Chatsworth and the Cavendish family

At our May meeting we were delighted to welcome back Dr Gillian White who promised us some history, some architecture and some scandal associated with Chatsworth and the Cavendish family between 1550 and 1850. This she delivered at a cheerful speed, quite wonderfully illustrated. The story of the Cavendishes embraces some very strong women, some very charming men and a fair measure of good luck and timing.

The first of the many William Cavendishes was an auditor from Suffolk, who rose to become Treasurer of the King's Bedchamber to Henry VIII. He became immensely rich, and he and his wife bought the Estate at Chatsworth in Derbyshire. Unfortunately, post mortem, he was charged with embezzling £60,000, a huge sum those days. His wife, Bess, took over the Estate.

Fortunately, Bess was a confidante of Queen Elizabeth I who ascended the throne in 1558. The Queen cancelled the bulk of the debt. Bess' second husband paid off the rest, and then, conveniently, died. Bess then married George Talbot, Earl of Shrewsbury. This marriage failed. Bess was ejected from Chatsworth, and built Hardwick Hall. Chatsworth was inherited by Henry, the eldest son, but Henry had no money. He sold Chatsworth to his younger brother, William, Bess' favourite son. So the Estate and Bess' money were reunited.

King James I needed money. The Cavendishes were in the position to provide £11,000, and William Cavendish became 1st Earl of Devonshire. At the Restoration, William Cavendish (4th Earl) carried the Royal Train at the Coronation. But James II sailed too close

to Catholicism and cozied up to Louis XIV, so in 1688 the 4th Earl supported William of Orange, (William and Mary). William thus elevated William Cavendish to a Dukedom. The newly created Duke of Devonshire retired to Derbyshire and spent the next 20 years recreating Chatsworth as the magnificent baroque palace we now know.

There was scandal too. The 4th Duke married Charlotte Boyle, heiress to the fortune of the Earl of Burlington. Through her, the Devonshires inherited Chiswick House, Burlington House, Bolton Abbey and Landsborough Hall in Yorkshire, and Lismore Castle in Ireland. But Charlotte's sister, Dorothy, had married Earl Euston whose crude brutality to his teenage wife was very public, and horrifying, and the Cavendishes were appalled by the association.

Then the 5th Duke of Devonshire lived in a 'menage a trois', openly with his wife Georgiana and his mistress Lady Elizabeth Foster. Unusual at the best of times, but the two women were close friends. There were three legitimate children, but the Duchess had an affair, and a child, with Charles Grey. She was exiled to France, and the Lady Elizabeth went with her. Georgiana came back to die at Chatsworth, and the Duke married Lady Elizabeth.

The 6th Duke, son of Georgiana, never married, although he had close and much discussed relationships with many, including the unstable Lady Caroline Lamb and the tragic Princess Charlotte. He also had bizarrely close friendships with Nicolas I of Russia and with his step-mother the Lady Elizabeth. The 6th Duke extended Chatsworth, employing William Paxton, of Crystal Palace fame, to transform the gardens. Paxton asked to be buried nearby.

Sadly Dr White had decided to stop her narrative at the year 1850, so she did. We eagerly await her next visit.





Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 14th May 2015

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Andrew Johnson, Stephen Sherbourne, Fleur Stevenson and Stuart Soames; Sue Rance (Parish Clerk), Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer), County Cllr Mark Gray (for part of the meeting).

Apologies: from Cllr Francesca Jones

John Griffin was re-elected as Chairman and Nigel Hannigan as Vice-Chairman. (Please see the note on page 3 about the annual elections to the Parish Council.)

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Cllr Gray had been in touch with some North Stoke parents and put them in touch with County Council officers about their choice of secondary schools.

County Councillor's report

Clacks Lane is to be closed for carriageway widening and resurfacing work. The Wallingford – Goring 134 bus contract is to be extended but there is still uncertainty over which contractor will run it. The Parish Council will send a letter of support for GoRide, the current providers. Mark Gray and Nigel Hannigan will consult local contractors about a pedestrian crossing in The Street.

Finance

Payments made in April were agreed. A new finance system is now in place. It was agreed that the new system was an improvement and would enable better reporting.

The accounts are currently with the auditor and the audited accounts will be presented for

approval at the June meeting.

A strategic review of proposed expenditure will consider some major projects:

- Traffic calming on A4074 Portway
- Internal improvements at the Pavilion
- Pedestrian crossing in The Street.

Grass cutting

A meeting has been held with Scofell to discuss some gaps in the first cuts, and agreed an annotated map of all the areas included in the contract. Cllr Soames will contact Scofell about the grass cutting at North Stoke recreation ground. Cllr Johnson will be the contact for grass cutting in Crowmarsh Gifford.

Chairman's report

We hope to co-opt some new councillors at the June meeting to fill the current vacancies on the Parish Council. An announcement will be made at the Annual Parish Meeting on 19th May and Cllr Griffin will draft an advertisement.

The bus shelter by the church had been vandalised but the police had made arrests. The Clerk would obtain an estimate for repairs and pass this on to the police.

Retiring councillor Anne Lowes had requested two additional dog bins and a litterbin for Mongewell.

Wallingford Town Council will no longer plant and maintain the flower tubs at the roundabout near the Queen's Head because of an unspecified health and safety issue: the Clerk will ask again what that issue was.

A camper van and other vehicles have been parked in Bellamy Way, which is a private road. When the access road to the Riverside Park is completed (which we strongly hope will be this summer) it will need to be kept clear of parked vehicles.

Cllr Hannigan will ask Mrs Barton, the Headteacher, to contact the police about this problem. Noise from motorcycles is a continuing problem on the main roads and through North Stoke.
