





# Proposed Railway Line through Crowmarsh

Mr Stephenson had visited the area around Wallingford in early 1846 to survey the proposed route for a railway line from Oxford, to the Great Western Junction at Moulsford. In 1846 there was no station at Cholsey, the station was at Moulsford near the Waterloo Bridge. His original planned route was entirely on the Oxfordshire side of the Thames. This had the advantage of not having to cross the Thames with an expensive bridge, as the line would join the G.W.R. line just below Moulsford Bridge, however the disadvantage with joining the line here would be that it would require a very large and expensive embankment to be built. The proposed line would have cut through Mongewell Park - and it was thought there would be considerable opposition from the owner, and cut Crowmarsh in half, passing just north of Benson Lane missing Howbery Park, although doing that was not considered a problem. An alternative route that would circumnavigate the Mongewell Estate, would have added nearly two miles to the line and this was thought to be too expensive.

Mr. Stephenson's second route (which was planned on his second visit in September 1846) was from Moulsford across Cholsey field and continuing to the west of Wallingford Workhouse, where a Station would be built. Building a station near Wallingford Market Place had been abandoned some time ago. The line would then cross the Thames between Wittenham Wood and Shillingford, passing Dorchester roughly where the by-pass is today, and continue between the Baldons on to Cowley and then Oxford, a total distance of about 14 to 15 miles. The only cutting needed would be through the Wittenham Hills.

An application would be made to Parliament in November, and provided the bill met with no

opposition, the expected finish date would be December 1847. Much of the land belonged to Oxford University, and it was expected the University would not oppose the building of the line.

However, the capital could not be raised, and the planned line was abandoned. The line was finally built from Didcot to Oxford instead.



# Stag beetle summer: help this endangered beetle in June & July

Stag beetles are Britain's largest land beetle with males reaching up to 7.5 cm in size. They are also one of the most spectacular looking insects, with a male's huge mandibles (antler-like jaws) making them easy to spot! Despite their appearance, stag beetles are harmless if left alone, and can be seen from mid-May, as warmer evenings draw them above ground to find a mate and reproduce.

During June and July, wildlife charity People's Trust for Endangered Species (PTES) is asking for volunteers in the UK to record sightings of stag beetles on six summer evenings, as part of an ongoing European study.

Taking part in the European Stag Beetle Monitoring Network couldn't be easier; all volunteers need to do is walk 500m, six times between June and July on warm, summer evenings, counting and recording any stag beetles they see. So whether you're on your evening dog walk, a post-work jog, or walking to your local pub, you can help!

Laura Bower, Conservation Officer at PTES, explains: "Loss of habitat and lack of dead or decaying wood are just two of the reasons why stag beetles need our help. Stag beetles are completely reliant on dead wood (either partially or completely buried) and are part of the process of recycling nutrients back into the soil, making them a very important part of the ecosystem. We hope that by taking part in this survey, the public can help reverse the decline of this iconic insect."

#### Top tips for gardeners

- 1. Create a log pile: One of the major problems facing stag beetles is a lack of rotting wood to lay eggs in or near, and for larvae to feed on. By creating a log pile (or a log pyramid, if you fancy a challenge!), you can provide stag beetles with habitat for the future. Log piles are also great habitat for other invertebrates and they in turn provide food for hedgehogs and birds.
- 2. Leave dead wood in your garden: Leave old stumps and dead wood alone, as these provide the perfect habitat and also a food supply. If you want to make the stumps more attractive try growing a climbing plant such as clematis up it.
- 3. Reduce dangers: Be vigilant when mowing your lawn and be alert for predators; try and scare away magpies and keep your own pets indoors during warm evenings when stag beetles are flying. Also, make sure any open water has an exit point, and if you see a dead-looking beetle in water, please take it out they often revive!
- 4. Record your sightings: Let PTES know where you've spotted a stag beetle via the Great Stag Hunt! Sightings are key to finding out where populations are thriving, in need of help, or non-existent.

Kevin Barton will talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) about the 'inner secrets' of Wallingford Castle Inner Bailey. In 2001, Kevin founded 'Landscape & Geophysical Services' to provide archaeological geophysical services in Ireland and overseas. Recently his broad experience of remote sensing has assisted communities in exploring their local heritage.

Much detailed historical and archaeological research has been carried out on the Anglo-Saxon establishment of Wallingford and the Norman construction of the first Castle. The most up-to-date research has been published with significant input by volunteers from Wallingford Museum and TWHAS. The research results have revealed that the Inner Bailey, the heart of the Royal Castle, included at least three halls and associated kitchens, a church and other buildings with a large garden area surrounding the church.

Remote sensing with associated visualisation techniques can image archaeological features from above - in the air, and below - on the ground. The talk will introduce the Castle and review the questions relating to the Inner Bailey and with the help of TWHAS volunteers, some secrets of the Inner Bailey may be revealed in the presentation of preliminary results.

# Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at North Stoke Village Hall on Thursday 3rd May

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Francesca Jones, Andrew Johnson, Elizabeth Ryall, Nigel Hannigan, David Rowley, David Topliss, Denise Hall, Stuart Soames and Stephen Sherbourne, plus Sue Rance (Clerk) and Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer).

An apology for absence was received from Councillor Fleur Stevenson. We noted with regret that David Mannering has resigned because of work commitments.

Neither County Councillor Mark Gray nor District Councillor Felix Bloomfield attended the meeting.

Cllr Griffin was elected as Chairman and Cllr Hannigan as Vice-Chairman for the coming year. There will be parish council elections in May 2019.

# Matters arising from the 29th March meeting

The Finance Officer has informed BT that the telephone at the Pavilion is no longer required.

Cllr Soames reported that a temporary barrier had been placed round an exposed culvert at North Stoke but as yet there is no agreement on how it may be repaired.

The Chairman had written to SODC about possible community facilities that could be provided at the SODC site on Benson Lane when the offices are rebuilt.

Allotment invoices will be sent out in the near future: rent will be £15 per annum. There are two vacant plots, which will be advertised in

Crowmarsh News, asking interested residents to contact the Clerk.

#### **Finance**

A schedule of payments made since the last meeting was presented and approved.

A request for a grant of £760 for North Stoke Village Hall for grass cutting and hedges was approved.

The accounts for the year ended 31st March 2018 were discussed and approved. It was agreed to reappoint Mr Roger Symes as our internal auditor. The accounts will be available for inspection after they have been audited.

The precept was £38,201 for the year (which will continue at the same level). Pavilion income had increased slightly. Total reserves are currently £151,585.

Grants were made during the year to the Corn Exchange roof project and to North Stoke Village Hall for redecorating. Expenditure on gas was less than the previous year but income from the feed in tariff for the solar panels was also less. It is hoped to make savings on electricity now that LED lights have been installed at the pavilion. A grant of £645.55 was received from the County Council towards grass cutting.

# Appeal APP/Q3115/W/17/3186858 / SODC 5-year Housing Land Supply

The Chair of Planning has received a communication from the Planning Inspectorate regarding the recent appeal inquiry and SODC's 5-year housing land supply. The new housing land supply figure of 5.4 years has a significant impact on the outstanding decision of the appeal, but the figure was withheld from the Inspector. We have asked the Secretary of State to review this matter and determine the appeal in the light of all the information.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan**

A £10,000 grant has now been received from SODC. The revised draft policies are now on the Parish Council website

# **Environment & recreation ground committee**

An electrical safety check has been carried out at the pavilion. The damaged low wall outside has been repaired satisfactorily. The estimate for supplying and fitting a smart (code controlled) door lock has been approved. Quotes are needed for movement sensors on the internal lights and for modified doors wide enough for wheelchair access.

It was agreed to ask Mr Strange to strim around the daffodils near Wallingford Bridge which the contractor Berinsfield Community Business have not done. The Finance Officer will speak to them.

#### Update on playground project

A vote of thanks was made to Cllrs Rowley and Johnson and to Mrs Reynolds for their work on the SODC grant application. A decision is expected by 30th June.

Meanwhile a grant application will be made to the landfill tax charity, WREN, by 13th June. The total cost of the playground will be £180,000 plus £9,000 for the gym.

Letters and messages of support have now been received from 169 children and 36 adults, but more messages are invited from older children / teenagers.

Another exhibition of the proposal will be held at the May Fair at Crowmarsh School on 20th May.

#### Replacement noticeboards

Cllrs Jones and Hall have researched this further and the estimated cost per noticeboard is £500. Cllr Soames requested a half-glazed board for North Stoke Village Hall. Four or five firms will be asked to quote for supply and installation.

#### Traffic and transport committee

Cllr Jones reported that Benson Parish Council do not wish to take any action to improve the bus stop at the end of Benson Lane on the A4074, which was requested by Howbery Park.

A meeting of Parish Transport Representatives is scheduled for Monday 4th June at 1.30pm at County Hall: Cllr Ryall offered to attend.

Quotes are being received for radar speed signs and a decision will be made when all quotes have been received. Permission is still needed from the County Council.

#### **Review of strategic priorities**

It was agreed that the top priority is safety and the main local concern is speed and volume of traffic. Cllr Sherbourne therefore recommended focusing on these three major priorities:

- Crossing on the A4074 Portway
- Pedestrian crossing in The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford.
- Traffic calming in North Stoke

A full list of priorities is to be circulated for discussion at the next meeting.

#### Correspondence

Invitations to the RAF Annual Reception on Thursday 24th May: Cllr Ryall and her husband will attend alongside Cllr Hannigan and the Clerk.

The Chairman will attend the Mayor of Wallingford's inaugural service on Sunday 20th May.

#### Other business

The District Council is planning a deep clean in the Parish to be carried out at the end of May. It was agreed that Meadow Lane and Old Reading Road should be included.

A number of potholes in the parish have been marked with white lines but not yet filled.

Cllr Sherbourne has arranged for geraniums to be planted in the wooden tubs at the Benson Lane junction with The Street. One of the tubs needs replacing and Cllr Sherbourne will contact a local supplier.

Quotes will be obtained for removal of the diseased ash tree at Jethro Tull Gardens. A decision will need to be made on replacement planting.

#### Date of next meeting

The next meeting was scheduled for 7th June. There will be a by-election for a District Councillor on that day so both village halls will be in use as polling stations. After discussion it was agreed to hold the Parish Council meeting on 7th June at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome.
