District Council offices

The Parish Council has had a letter from John Cotton, leader of South Oxfordshire District Council, thanking us for our support following the fire and promising to keep us informed of their plans for the site of the offices on Benson Lane.

It is heartening to see both SODC and Chadwick's funeral service getting back to business again after the catastrophe that hit them so badly in January.

At the moment they are trying to find a temporary office home, probably at Milton Park, west of Didcot. After that they will have to decide whether to rebuild the offices or find another site, which we hope will be in Crowmarsh Gifford (SODC has been based here for over 30 years), but might be elsewhere.

Local Plan exhibition – have your say on housing sites

Consultation event in the Pavilion on Saturday 14th March

SODC is consulting on details of the revised Local Plan to run until 2031. As part of this consultation there will be another exhibition of proposed housing sites in Crowmarsh Gifford.

Parish councillors will be there as well as the SODC planning policy team, so do come along to the Pavilion on 14th March to see what is proposed, ask questions and express your views on the proposals.

The exhibition will be open from 10am to 3pm. You can see the full Local Plan consultation at libraries or online at

www.southoxon.gov.uk/newlocalplan. This consultation runs until Thursday 2nd April.

Advance warning – 7th May is election day

As well as the General Election on Thursday 7th May, we will also have elections for South Oxfordshire District Council and Crowmarsh Parish Council (which includes Crowmarsh Gifford, North Stoke and Mongewell). Voter

registration has changed, so there is extra publicity about how to make sure you are registered to vote in all three elections. The parish council has 9 seats for Crowmarsh Gifford and 3 for North Stoke and Mongewell: all 12 are up for election in May. If you might be interested in becoming a parish councillor, or just want to find out what is involved, please talk to me or any current councillor.

Medical Detection Dogs save lives?

The charity Medical Detection Dogs is training dogs in the detection by scent of human diseases and life-threatening health conditions.

The Cancer Detection Dogs work on clinical trials with universities and health professionals in the early detection of cancer, and the results are published in scientific journals. For example, our dogs are over 90% accurate in the early detection of prostate cancer.

The Medical Alert assistance dogs partner clients with life-threatening health conditions, acting as "early warning systems"; for example alerting before a hypoglycaemic attack causes collapse in a brittle Type 1 Diabetic person.

We are a small group of volunteers, the Oxon and Cotswold support group, supporting the charity by giving talks and running local fundraising events and street collections. We are looking for help with our fundraising. We need:

For more experienced cyclists, we offer a faster ride (same time, same place) on the third Sunday of each month.


You don't need to be a CTC member to join our rides: come and try out up to three rides with us before you join.

Carmel College



Mongewell Park House, the home of Carmel College, pictured in its heyday.

At the end of the Second World War, the RAF moved out of Mongewell Park house. It was then used as a Medical Rehabilitation Unit (MRU) until 1947 when the unit closed. At this time, most of the military Nissen huts and other buildings that were scattered in the grounds were removed.

In 1948 Kopul Rosen (1913-1962) and his wife Bella founded the Jewish boarding school of Carmel College. Rosen remained Headmaster until his untimely death in 1962 from leukaemia. Although a Jewish School, it also had a small number of day pupils who were not Jewish. The age range for pupils was 11 to 18.

In the 1960s a girls' school was built about a mile from the main site, but was never used for its intended purpose. It was later converted into a junior school for children up to the age of 13; they then moved to the main school. In 1968 girls were admitted into the main school, starting in the sixth form.

The school was divided into five boarding houses named Mansion (1st, 2nd and 3rd year male), Ridgeway (4th and 5th year male), Sherman (L6 and U6 male), Newnham (5th year female) and River Court (L6 and U6 female). These were the final names of the boarding houses, which had been changed several times throughout the school's life.

After Rosen's death in 1962, David Stamler

became headmaster until 1971. He was followed by Rosen's eldest son, Jeremy (1971-84), and Philip Skelker was then head until the school closed in June 1997.

In 1990 Carmel College topped a list of the 20 most expensive boarding schools. Its fees were £30,000 per year. It closed in 1997, mainly owing to diminishing numbers and financial problems brought on by the termination of the government assisted places by the Labour government.

The boathouse was designed by Sir Basil Spence and is Grade II listed; the concrete synagogue, dining hall and the amphitheatre were designed by local architect, Thomas Hancock, and are also Grade II listed.

The Mansion House was used by Agatha Christie as a basis for the mansion in her 1952 play *The Mousetrap*. In 2011, a short scene from *The Iron Lady* was also filmed within the Synagogue of Carmel College.

The grounds were sold to property developers for an undisclosed sum, but the sale was overturned by the Charity Commission following pressure from parents and former pupils who claimed the land was undersold.

What of the future? The site is now owned by Comer Developments, and they intend to build a number of houses for the upper end of the market.

The 2015 Wallingford 10k Thames Run will be run mainly on roads and paths, around Wallingford and Crowmarsh. The Thames Run is an established and increasingly popular event which attracts over 500 runners. This year, it will start and finish at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School.

Jewel Training charity fundraising

Jewel Training is based on Howbery Park, and the staff all live in Crowmarsh and the surrounding area. "Team Jewel" will be walking 25km along the Thames Path, from Cookham to Henley on Sunday 13th September. Each Team member has to raise at least £175 in sponsorship for our chosen charity.

To help us on our way, we will be taking part in the international epilepsy awareness "Purple Day" on 26th March. We will have a stall in the Howbery Park Manor House near the restaurant where you can come along and take part in our "guess the weight of the cake" and "guess how many sweets in the jar" competitions. Please come and see us there between 12 and 2pm.

Jewel Training wanted to choose a charity to support and Julie Johns, Director, was looking for something that the Jewel team could do together. Julie says, "I discussed with my team which charity we could support and how, and Toni Taylor, my Operations Manager, suggested the Epilepsy Society."

Toni says, "My brother, Martin, suffered with epilepsy from the age of two, until his death when he was only 29. He experienced grand mal (or generalised tonic-clonic) seizures, which were not only debilitating for him, but very distressing to witness for our family as well. He spent a lot of time in hospital and attended regular hospital out-patient appointments, as well as being treated on a variety of drugs, throughout his life. I was often amazed at his ability just to stand up, considering the number of Mogadon, Diazepam, Triazepan and other drugs that he had to take each day.

"This meant that he missed a lot of school; he wasn't allowed to learn to drive; he never had a job. He died "status epilepticus" (a seizure which could not be stopped) just over 10 years ago, but epilepsy had taken his life a long time before that. If by walking 25km on the Thames Path, I can help to prevent just one family experiencing what we did, then it will be worth the blisters!"

Wallingford's Royal Castle Revealed

Wallingford Museum enjoyed record numbers in 2014 but is now looking forward to its 2015 season, which will bring a wonderful new special exhibition - 'Wallingford's Royal Castle Revealed'. It will display for the first time the fantastic results of fresh historical and archaeological research into the life and importance of one of the greatest royal strongholds of Medieval England.

This new research shows Wallingford Castle's importance as the third great stronghold of the Thames Valley - Tower of London, Windsor and Wallingford - wonderful new details of the life of the castle, its buildings, people and activities. It will bring to life the amazing details discovered in newly translated documents, revealing the daily life and the layout of the Castle.

This exhibition will complement a weekend of 'living history' on 27-28 June, when the English Civil War Society and Town Council have organised a 'Civil War re-enactment' at the Castle.

Alongside, to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the signing of Magna Carta there will be an additional display 'Magna Carta and All That!' highlighting Wallingford's role in the events of 1215, and why it is one of only four towns mentioned in Magna Carta. King John was at Wallingford Castle on several occasions during his falling out with the barons which led to Magna Carta.

There will be special events during this year including guided History Walks (11 April), a Night at the Museum (15 May), Family Archaeology Day (18 July), a Medieval Day (15 Aug) and an Agatha Christie weekend (18-20 Sept), culminating in a major history conference about Wallingford Castle in October. During the afternoon of Sunday 14 June, St Mary's Church bells will ring a special peal as part of the national commemoration of Magna Carta.

Children and War

Children's experiences of World War II in Oxfordshire

March's talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) will be by Liz Wooley. She will present 'Children and War - children's experiences of WWII in Oxfordshire'.

Oxfordshire escaped major bombing during World War II but the county's inhabitants were, nonetheless, heavily affected by the War. Preparations for possible attack and invasion altered the familiar landscape and everyday life in towns and villages was disrupted. Thousands of evacuees found refuge here and became part of residents' homes and schools.

Liz's talk looks at how the lives of Oxfordshire children – both those born in the county and those evacuated here – were affected by World War II. It is likely to prompt older listeners to recall and share their own wartime experiences, whether from Oxfordshire or elsewhere. The talk is presented in association with the Soldiers of Oxfordshire Trust, whose major 2011-13 exhibition, Children and War, examined war-time evacuation, boy soldiers, war toys and commemoration, from the Boer War to the present day.

Water Futures for Oxfordshire

Organised by South Oxfordshire Sustainability (SOS), at Cholsey Pavilion, 7pm, 20th March

We live in a seriously water-stressed area, one where climate change is exposing us more frequently to extreme weather events which continue to raise the risk of flooding and severe drought. In addition, there are proposals to radically increase the number of houses in the county, but will the water resources be sufficient now and in the future to meet the rising demand from the burgeoning population? More houses could mean changes

to the pattern of runoff due to the increase in hard surfaces, so enhancing flooding. Regulations and legislation are imposing additional restrictions on the use of water resources.

The first speaker, Richard Harding (Centre for Ecology & Hydrology), will enlarge on the water resources problems facing the county, discussing the current pattern of climate and what climate scenarios show the future holds. The Core Strategy and SMHA targets for housing would be considered and what land use changes the new houses might result in which would impact flood generation. The consequences of legislation could be touched upon.

The second speaker, Graham Scholey (Environment Agency) will discuss Agency actions and plans to deal with the current concern over flooding. Then the discussion would turn to the impact of future more extreme patterns of climate on the physical, chemical and biological responsibilities of the Agency to combat them. The effects of legislation could be mentioned.

The third speaker, Steve Tuck, (Thames Water) will outline Thames Water's present responsibilities – the population served in terms of water supply and waste water together with the regulatory pressures coming from the EA and OFWAT. The speaker may then take a glimpse into the future and outline how Thames Water is planning to cope with a more febrile climate, an increasing demand for water and a larger volume of waste water. The impact of legislation and regulations would be considered.

The meeting would be a contribution to the UK celebrations of World Water Day on 22nd March.



All about Style Acre

Style Acre is a Wallingford based charity, providing supported living and day opportunities for people with learning disabilities throughout Oxfordshire.

At Style Acre's heart is the commitment to helping people with learning disabilities make their own choices about the lives they want to lead and respecting them as individuals. The charity works in partnership with individuals and their families to achieve this.

This year, Style Acre is celebrating 20 years, although the charity's story really began 30 years ago in 1985, when a house called Style Acre in Brightwell-cum-Sotwell was bought to provide residential care for 19 people with learning disability.

Ten years later in 1995, the owners wanted to retire and families of people supported bought the home, creating Style Acre, the charity.

During this time, Style Acre was an early pioneer of 'person-centred' services, where people were enabled to make their own decisions about their lives as much as possible, at a time where the objective for many providers was to provide a safe and caring environment, but one where people had little choice or control over their lives.

As Style Acre's person-centred approach evolved, it was felt that the people should live in their community, rather than in a home and, with the right support, could learn skills to live more independently. So, in 2004, Style Acre sold the home in Brightwell and bought a number of ordinary houses in local towns and villages, enabling the people it supported to live with their friends. In 2004, Style Acre supported 20 people; today, dedicated carers support 70 people in 30 houses, enabling and facilitating the lives of those they support in dynamic and varied ways.

Style Acre ensured those it supported could participate in a range of activities by providing a day service. Now, Style Acre's 'day opportunities' supports over 120 people at two centres in Wallingford and Didcot. They support people with a full range of learning disability – from

those needing 1:1 support and with complex needs, to people who can live independently. Both offer recreational and social opportunities, teach a wide range of skills such as 'Independent Living', and help people find volunteer work opportunities and community involvement. This year, responding to requests from families and professionals in north Oxfordshire, Style Acre will open a new service for people with mild to moderate learning disabilities in Banbury, providing supported living flats in the floors above the building.

Along with a charity shop in Wallingford, Style Acre opened a Tea Room in Blewbury in 2011 and in 2014, a market garden in Wantage, providing work experience for the people it supports.

The charity has also developed an awardwinning project, 'Technology for Independence', ensuring people have access to technologies that will enhance their lives and increase their independence.

Style Acre has an excellent reputation within the learning disability community and Social Services; it is forward-looking and committed to developing new services where there is a need. Never complacent, Style Acre is continually looking for ways to improve the lives of the people it supports. People with learning disabilities and their families choose Style Acre, because it goes that extra mile, striving to enable people to reach their full potential.





Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 5th February 2015

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames, Faye Cheeseman, Francesca Jones, Andrew Johnson and Fleur Stevenson, plus Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer) and Susan Rance (Clerk).

Apologies: from Councillors Anne Lowes, Stephen Brown, County Councillor Mark Gray and District Councillor Kristina Crabbe.

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Three trees have been planted in Jethro Tull Gardens.

Councillors have been deeply shocked by the fire at SODC and Chadwicks and the clerk will write to the Chadwick family.

Finance

Payments of £726 and £1014 have been made to Arrow Fencing for new posts at the Recreation Ground and for work on the play area which was recommended by ROSPA in their safety inspection.

The accounts to 31st January were presented. Income from the pavilion had increased by £400. Income from the solar panels is now received every six months (previously quarterly). The Finance Officer will research the breakdown of administration costs for the next meeting.

The Council reviewed our annual internal audit and internal accounting controls and agreed that these are effective systems. There have been no changes in accounting controls since last year. Cheques are not being spot checked against invoices at present, but it was agreed to introduce a new system (as used at

Cholsey) when the new accounting system has been introduced. The Finance Officer will obtain two quotes for the audit.

The pensions' regulator has told us that the council needs to start considering workplace pensions. The council is not obliged to provide a pension in view of the small number of hours worked by the staff and the amount paid, but we agreed to write formally to our three staff members to ask if they wish to have a pension.

A procedure for backing up Parish Council Data was agreed, to be used by the Clerk and the Finance Officer.

Review of allotment holders

The allotment holders' list has been updated. There are currently no vacant plots and no waiting list. One unused derelict plot has been partly cleared but still has tree stumps on it, which could be removed if the plot is needed. The Council agreed to renew our membership of the Allotments and Gardens Society, which provides us with insurance cover.

Grants and donations

A donation of £50 was agreed to Home-Start Southern Oxfordshire and a donation of £100 to the Wallingford Volunteer Centre.

Planning

It was noted with regret that SODC's Planning Department offices had been totally destroyed in the recent fire: they are making valiant efforts to get back to normal working.

P14/S3333/HH (Householder): Front porch extension and additional side window opening for new cloakroom. 31 Robert Sparrow Gardens, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8DQ: PERMISSION GRANTED.

Parish Council responses to SODC were agreed as follows:

P14/S3055/HH: Amended details. Remove existing rear extension and replace with new timber framed extension with increased footprint, (as amplified by Shadowing Report accompanying e-mail from agent received 20th December 2014). Church Cottages, Church Lane, North Stoke, OX10 6BH: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P14/S4073/HH: Part-retrospective application for extensions to accommodate enlarged kitchen/dining area, home office and studio, (amendments to approved application P14/S1177/HH), 39 Thames Mead, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8EY: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P15/S0059/HH: Three-storey rear extension with third storey in roof space. 10 Jethro Tull Gardens, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8DS: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

Planning correspondence

The District Council planning committee will consider these applications at a meeting on 11th February 2015 in the Fountain Conference Centre, HR Wallingford, Howbery Park: P/14/S3055/HH and P14/S3056/LB, Church Cottages, Church Lane, North Stoke, OX10 6BH, proposed removal of existing rear extension and replacement with new timber framed extension with increased footprint, (as amended altering the roof material).

Environment and Recreation Ground Committee

Plans to turn two unused changing rooms at the pavilion into meeting space were discussed.

There might be different ways to improve the facilities but the cost will need to be assessed against the possible benefits. A site visit will be held before making any decision.

Traffic and Transport Committee

Cllr Jones had circulated notes on the Parish Transport Representatives' meeting held on 16th January. Details of the county council's budget cuts will be finalised on 17th February. Local public transport tendering is now in process and will be presented to the Cabinet on 19th March. There are likely to be some cuts in rural bus routes. New school pupils will have to go to their catchment school to qualify for school transport subsidy.

Age UK is recruiting volunteer drivers as over 6000 people are no longer eligible for ambulance type transport to hospital appointments.

Traffic calming on Portway A4074

Local people have reported again that there is a serious problem for traffic emerging from Cox's Lane. There is no doubt that speeding is a problem here on the main road and it is wide which encourages traffic to travel faster.

Cllr Sherbourne has been liaising with OCC on possible traffic calming options. A digital speed camera facing in both directions would cost around £40k but it is important that the police would provide the necessary support for such a system. Cllr Sherbourne will liaise with County Councillor Gray, the police and OCC Highways to ascertain whether a camera is an option and carry out a feasibility study.

District Councillor's report

District Cllr Crabbe had submitted a written report on the current thinking about future plans for the SODC offices. The insurance assessor's findings are awaited and a decision about whether to rebuild or redevelop the site will be made in the light of this. Meanwhile the District Council is looking at interim accommodation options in Milton Park and Abingdon.

Representatives on outside bodies

The Parish Council agreed to nominate Mr John Bellamy as a trustee of the Wallingford Bridge Estate Charity for a further four-year term.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held

at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 5th March, starting at 7.30pm. A date for the Annual Parish Meeting will be considered at that meeting.
