Developments in Crowmarsh – have your say!

Two things to do – one urgent, one longer term:

- 1. Have your say on the South Oxfordshire Local Plan consultation until 5pm on 17th May please comment on the plan documents, especially the sites proposed for housing in Crowmarsh Gifford (see page 3).
- 2. Sign up to help with the Crowmarsh Neighbourhood Development Plan, which will set out how we want our community to develop long-term, including environment, housing, infrastructure and facilities. We will need all sorts of help (see page 17).

South Oxfordshire Local Plan – Consultation until 17th May

South Oxfordshire District Council is developing a new Local Plan that will shape the future of our district up to 2033. It identifies where housing, retail and employment land should be located and the infrastructure required to support this growth, such as roads, schools, health services and sewerage. The policies in the plan will help make decisions on future planning applications.

SODC has included two sites for housing in Crowmarsh Gifford (see the parish council planning notes) which together would mean 250 new houses. Look at pages 66 and 67 in the main document.

The plan is out for public consultation until 5pm on Wednesday 17th May – comment on the plan documents at www.southoxon.gov.uk/localplan (register with your name and address). Give reasons for your comments.

Hard copies of the Local Plan, supporting documents and comment forms are available during opening hours at the SODC office (address below) and in Benson and Wallingford libraries.

While grazing they stand on their hind legs, like humans, or eat sitting down. So far David Attenborough has not visited the grazing grounds, but it's only a matter of time before we'll see him on our screens talking in hushed tones to one of these magnificent creatures.

At the end of the day we are treated again to the roar of these machines as they return to their dens. On particularly noisy days, one can be forgiven if one yearns for the icy roads of winter.

Police and Crime Plan 2017 to 2021

This new Plan consists of five broad strategic priorities which are:

- 1. Vulnerability Managing demand on services through working together with a particular focus on mental health, elder abuse, hidden abuse, and the criminal justice experience for victims of domestic and sexual abuse.
- 2. Prevention and Early Intervention Improving safeguarding in both the physical space and virtual space including tackling cyber crime, road safety, peer on peer abuse, hate crime and female genital mutilation (FGM).
- 3. Reducing Re-offending Targeting and managing harm and risk with a focus on substance misuse, violence involving weapons and offender management including perpetrators of domestic abuse.
- 4. Serious Organised Crime and Terrorism Improving the local response including increased public awareness, promoting a 'dare to share' culture, and preventing violent extremism and the exploitation of vulnerable people.
- 5. Police Ethics and Reform Increasing the pace of change with a focus on improved support for victims, accelerated uptake of new technology, and improving the perceptions of police among young people.

The priorities and aims in the Plan will be addressed in greater detail through the delivery plans of Thames Valley Police, the Office of the PCC and other partner service delivery plans, particularly Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs).

The plan was developed using a broad range of information including the evaluation of research documents, analysis of crime trends, horizon scanning to identify future trends and consultation with partners including the police and local authorities.

It was also informed by the views of the nearly

5000 residents of Thames Valley, including over 1000 young people, who took part in the PCC's policing and crime survey in 2016.

Proposed New Play Area and Outdoor Gym in the Recreation Ground

Thank you to everyone who has already signed the lists, either at the school, the village shop or online, regarding their views on this subject. We have had a good response to date.

A group of interested local residents has met recently to discuss ideas and potential designs for this suggested improvement, bearing in mind the responses that we have had so far. We are keen to know what things children like most in a play area.



The highlight for Christians at the end of the month of May is Ascension Day, on 25th May, coming 40 days after Easter. This year, we will be celebrating with a special Communion service at St Mary Magdalene's at 8pm, to which all are welcome. In many countries, this is a significant event observed with a Bank Holiday, but it tends to go past unnoticed in this country, which is a shame. The Ascension is a central tenet of our faith - as the Apostles' Creed says: "He [Jesus] ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty". The significance of that is that right now, your prayers and mine can be heard at the throne of grace as Jesus "intercedes for us" (Romans 8:34).

Prayers can also be turned into action...
The third week of May also brings Christian
Aid Week (14th – 20th May) including the
house to house collection - so don't be
surprised if I or another volunteer come knocking at your door! This is the 60th Anniversary
of Christian Aid Week, which was originally set
up to support the many European refugees still
in camps 12 years after the Second World
War. Sadly, according to a UNHCR (United
Nations High Commissioner for Refugees)
report last year, the number of displaced
people is at its highest ever - the total at the
end of 2015 reached 65.3 million, or 1 out of
every 113 people on Earth - thus surpassing

even post-WW2 numbers, when the world was struggling to come to terms with the most devastating event in history.

The decision to leave home and country as a refugee is only ever taken out of desperation for survival. It's better to die in a refugee camp than to die in a war – to risk your children's lives in a plastic dinghy and to leave everything you know behind. When the alternative is terror, bombs and bullets, almost anything is better. This is the terrible choice facing tens of millions of people worldwide - fleeing conflict and disaster, making dangerous journeys in search of safety. Indeed, the only thing that a refugee keeps is their humanity, but we are in danger of losing ours if we ignore their situation.

As the Christian Aid slogan says: "We've been there for refugees since 1945. We won't turn our backs now."

The Round Mounds project

From Medieval Mottes to Prehistoric Round Mounds

Dr Jim Leary will talk at the Wallingford Historical & Archaeological Society (TWHAS) about the project 'Extending Histories: From Medieval Mottes to Prehistoric Round Mounds' which is funded by the Leverhulme Trust.

His talk will discuss the results from this project, which aims to discover the history of monumental mounds in the English landscape. The project brings together evidence from detailed analytical earthwork survey, geoarchaeological techniques and a comprehensive dating programme to determine the date of construction, sequence of development and environmental context of 20 castle mottes from across England.

Late Neolithic round mounds, such as Silbury Hill near Avebury, are among the rarest and least well understood monuments in Britain. Recent archaeological work at the medieval Marlborough Castle motte, Wiltshire, however, has shown it to be a reused Neolithic round mound, comparable in date to Silbury Hill. Could prehistoric round mounds therefore be

more numerous and widespread than previously thought? Have many been hidden in plain sight for the past thousand years - incorporated into the fabric of later medieval castles? Such a link has not been drawn before, and yet, if true, could have considerable implications for the way we understand both late Neolithic round mounds and medieval castles.

We should learn more about the Wallingford Castle motte which has been dated between 1050 and 1150.

This talk will be held on Wednesday 10th May, 7.45 for 8pm, at St Mary's Church, Wallingford. Visitors (£4) are most welcome.

Music at St Peter's, 2017

The 32nd season of Music at St Peter's, Wallingford, starts on Saturday 13th May with the Sacconi String Quartet, an established favourite with St Peter's audiences - they have been here every year since 2005, sometimes giving more than one concert! Later in the year there's a viola and piano recital, a song recital with music by Beethoven and Schubert, a violin recital, another string quartet, a solo pianist, a piano quartet (expanded with a double bass for Schubert's "Trout" Quintet), and the season ends with the locally-based Thames Consort giving an all-Bach programme of choral music and concertos for violin and oboe. So it's a rich and varied mixture with both familiar and less well-known music to charm the ear!

Wallingford U3A

Our April speaker, Dr Jill Eyers, talked about "The Grave Trade", changing and recurring fashions in burial practices through the ages.

Modern scientific techniques are giving us more and more accurate information, but there is lots we still don't understand. Who were the 97 little newborn corpses buried together near Henley? Why? Very early man probably laid their dead to rest in quiet, magical woodland, but Neanderthal people put their dead in caves. Neolithic Man used burial chambers and constructed long barrows: the Egyptians

mummified their rich and famous. The Romans invented coffins, and our coffins and grave stones are very like theirs. The Vikings buried their dead in or near water, or cremated them. Christianity disapproved of cremation, but we now accept it again. The Victorians favoured sombre black horse-drawn carriages, that are becoming popular again. And quiet woodland burials are also becoming more common.

Dr Eyers asked whether funerals are for the living or the dead? Who knows? But we can relate to the CroMagnon people who buried a 16 year old who had died in childbirth. Her baby was carefully wrapped and buried in her arms.

The audience was so enthused by the talk that Chairman, Jim Fisk, had a bit of difficulty in stopping questions before tea began to get cold.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 6th April 2017

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Stephen Sherbourne, Nigel Hannigan, Ann Sharp, Fleur Stevenson, Stuart Soames, Andrew Johnson, David Rowley, Denise Hall and David Topliss. Plus Sue Rance (Clerk) and Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer).

Cllr Francesca Jones was representing the council at a meeting about a cycle race on 16th July (see Traffic & Transport) and attended at the end.

Apologies for absence were received from Cllr David Mannering and County Cllr Mark Gray. Three members of the public attended to talk about planning.

The meeting was preceded by a presentation on the proposals to develop land at Newnham Manor for 100 houses (P16/S3852/FUL) and the applicants and Oxfordshire Highways were questioned about the proposed junction on the A4074. The application is expected to go to the SODC Planning Committee in May.

Finance

Payments were agreed, including a £70 subscription to Oxfordshire Community First (formerly known as Oxfordshire Rural Community Council) who advise parishes on community matters including neighbourhood planning (see under Planning).

Grants were agreed to South and Vale Citizens' Advice (£250) and to North Stoke Parochial Church Council (£990) towards grass cutting in the churchyard and pound.

The Council's publications scheme was reviewed and approved with some minor updating. This lists what information we publish and how the public can obtain it.

SODC Planning Committee meeting, 29th March

The Chairman and the Chair of Planning attended the South Oxfordshire District Council Planning Committee meeting at Didcot Civic Hall on 29th March. The Committee considered application P16/S3608/O: Outline planning application for up to 150 dwellings together with associated access, public open space, landscaping and amenity areas: land to the east of Benson Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8ED. The planning officer had recommended approval, but after a full discussion, the Councillors voted unanimously to refuse the application.

South Oxfordshire District Council Local Plan

SODC have now published the latest draft of their Local Plan for public comment (until 5pm on 17th May). This plan will set out the scale and distribution of new development up to 2033. As part of this they are exploring the level of development they consider appropriate in the market towns and larger villages over the next 16 years.

As we do not have a Neighbourhood Development Plan, SODC has proposed two site allocations for housing in Crowmarsh Gifford on our behalf to help deliver the expected housing requirement (see pages 66-67 of the draft plan).

One site (Policy H8, page 66) is land to the east of Benson Lane, expected to deliver a residential development of approximately 150 dwellings, representing an extension to the existing community, including relevant land-

scaping to minimise the impact on the Chilterns AONB. This is the same as the application refused at Planning Committee on 29th March (P16/S3608/O).

The other site (Policy H9, page 67) is land to the south of Newnham Manor: a residential development of approximately 100 dwellings, representing an extension to the existing community, with a new parking area to meet the needs of Crowmarsh Gifford C of E Primary School. There is a current planning application for 100 houses on this site, with access off the A4074 (P16/S3852/FUL, see discussion above).

It was resolved that the Parish Council will make representations to SODC to have the land to the east of Benson Lane, where permission has now been refused, removed from the Draft Local Plan. Local residents are encouraged to send in comments on the draft of the Local Plan, particularly on this site and the other allocation. (See article on page 3).

Neighbourhood Plan

Following the planning committee meeting on 29th March and the attempt by the district council to include sites into the draft Local Plan on the Council's behalf, Crowmarsh Parish Council has resolved to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish.

A grant from SODC will be sought and a working party / steering group will be set up. We will need to engage the entire community to make a plan that best suits the whole of the parish. Volunteers will be needed to help with this over 18 months to 2 years and it will be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting on Thursday 18th May at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School, starting at 7.30pm, so please come to that if you can.

Environment and Recreation Committee

Cllr Johnson reported that new laminated signs are now in place at the Recreation Ground. One quote has been received for LED lighting at the Pavilion (approx. £600) which should result in significant savings in the long term.

A site visit to the nature area for all councillors

is planned for the summer. It is planned to continue spraying the nettles but to consider other ways of dealing with them in future.

The new sub-committee for the playground project will meet on 20th April at the home of Cllr Johnson, starting at 7.30pm. Chalgrove and Watlington Parish Councils will be asked for advice on fundraising and contractor. Two quotes have been received and a third is expected. Cllr Rowley has details of good examples of playgrounds in other areas and community consultation that can help in obtaining grant funding.

There has been a resurgence in bookings for football recently.

Cllr Hall reported on the problem of dog fouling and will investigate the purchase of more signs and the legal requirements involved.

Traffic and Transport Committee

Cllr Francesca Jones had represented the council at a meeting about a national road cycle race on 16th July. North Stoke is on the main route as are Cox's Lane and Park View, and short-term road closures are planned in and around the parish. Details will be reported when they are known.

Correspondence

Clirs Rowley, Hall and Sharp will represent the Parish Council at the annual RAF Benson reception on Thursday 25th May.

Other business

- Cllr Soames reported that tree work is needed at North Stoke Village Hall and a grant may be requested from the Parish Council towards the £640 cost.
- Cllr Sharp reported that Berinsfield Community Business planned to cut the grass at the recreation ground on 7th April and the verges would be cut in the next week.
- Cllr Rowley recommended that sustainability should be a priority as part of any Parish Council project.

Next meeting

The next meeting will be held on Thursday 11th May, at North Stoke Village Hall, starting

at 7.30pm. This is the Parish Council's Annual Meeting where councillors will elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman for 2017-18. As usual, all are welcome.

The Annual Parish Meeting for all electors will be held on Thursday 18th May at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School, starting at 7.30pm. Mark Dickinson of Thames Water will be invited, plus the local neighbourhood police team. Cllr Soames suggested we also invite a representative of the traffic police to discuss speeding in North Stoke as well as the A4074 and The Street in Crowmarsh Gifford.

Cllr Johnson will give a presentation on the play area project. There will be an introduction to the Neighbourhood Plan for the parish and a call for people to get involved. The Clerk will provide tea/coffee and biscuits.
