

Changes at Agrivert

Agrivert, the company which operates the large green digesters opposite the turn to Preston Crowmarsh have had a change of ownership. At the end of November they were taken over by Severn Trent Green Power, and the site will be rebranding imminently. Whilst the former directors of Agrivert are no longer employed by the company, all other personnel will continue in their respective roles and the site will continue to operate in the same manner.

The site treats household food waste to produce 2.4 megawatts of electricity, and operates at 97.4% efficiency making it one of the most efficient of its type in the country. Household garden waste will also continue to be treated at the compost site which is located behind the digesters.

Past Times from David Beasley

A Children's Pageant at Crowmarsh

On the evening of Wednesday 21st June 1910, a large gathering assembled on the lawn of Rose Villa, Crowmarsh, to see a performance given by the local branch of the "Young Helpers' League". Permission to use the lawn had been given by Mr and Mrs Newton.

The theme for the performance was "A Pageant of Planets", which, it was explained, was a slight representation of the solar system. It was written and arranged by Mrs Dawson-Clark of Abingdon. The children had been rehearsed in their various parts by the Mayoress of Wallingford, Mrs S L Hawkins, and Miss Stewart-Dyer.

Each child represented one of the planets, the moon and Hailey's Comet. The costumes were thought to be very pretty and the overall colouring very effective. Each planet introduced itself with a few explanatory verses, then took its place on the lawn that had

already been made out with circles that represented their orbits. Despite having to speak their words in the open air the children could be plainly heard. E Cottle's performance as Hailey's Comet was thought to be very moving and the audience - despite a collision with Mars - requested an encore of his part. Many of the audience enjoyed the pageant but thought it was very short.

The performers were as follows:

It's hard to imagine large crowds attending a pageant of this type today, but they were simpler times in 1910.

Old and young alike can enjoy 'hands on' activities, discovering the secrets of garden archaeology and tracing the passage of time through photographs and objects, all of which reflect the changing face of Wallingford.

This 'Family Friendly' exhibition will run throughout the museum, with a sheet to guide people round with a number of 'hands on' things for children.

Bluestones and white bones: the origins of the people buried at Stonehenge

On Wednesday 8th May, Prof Rick Schulting will talk to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) about 'Bluestones and white bones: the origins of the people buried at Stonehenge.'

Stonehenge has long inspired the imagination. Much work has been done on understanding (or speculating on) how the stones themselves were moved, whence they came, and what the monument meant to its creators. Far less attention has been paid to those creators themselves.

The cremated remains of more than 50 individuals were placed in the Aubrey Holes at Stonehenge, making it one of the largest Late Neolithic (ca. 3000-2500 BC) cemeteries known in Britain. The Aubrey Holes were excavated by Colonel Hawley in 1919-1926, who, unusually for the time, had the foresight to rebury the cremations on site, albeit commingled in a single pit. Nevertheless, bones of at least 25 separate individuals could

still be identified. These were recently used for radiocarbon dating, and a small fragment of what was left over from that process was used for strontium isotope analysis. This is a method that provides insights into where people lived, following the adage that 'you are where you ate'.

Rick Schulting of Oxford's School of Archaeology will present the intriguing results of the strontium isotope analysis of the remains, which suggested there were strong connections between west Wales and Wessex, extending beyond the transportation of stones, to the movement of people, from a project that was recently nominated for Current Archaeology's 2018 Research Project of the Year.

This talk will be held at St Mary's Church, Wallingford, 7.45 for 8pm. Visitors (£4) are most welcome.


Henley and District Philatelic Society



A belated Happy Easter everyone! May is one of the most joyful seasons in the church as we continue to celebrate Easter for 40 days until Ascension Day on Thursday 30th May when we welcome the rest of our Wallingford Churches Team to a special evening celebration Eucharist. We then enter a 10 day wait to bring us to 50 days, giving the festival named Pentecost (or Whit Sunday) when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

Easter is the season of new beginnings, of new life out of death, of hope out of despair. May 12th-19th is also the time for Christian Week: one of their slogans is "We believe in life before death" - this applies especially for the poorest in the world who are most affected by climate change.

Just making resolutions and commitments for future targets without immediate action to make them achievable is no longer acceptable.

I hope Easter will help us consider the bigger picture, with the hope of life for eternity both on this planet as well as in the heavenly realm.

Wallingford U3A

A message must have got about that our April speaker, HH David Eccles QC, was worth hearing because he played to a packed house. And he was, indeed, brilliant: deadly serious yet very funny, and provocative; he challenged us to think about some of the contradictions that judges have to resolve as part of "A Judge's Life".

He emphasised the absolute necessity of the Independence of the Judiciary, a principle established by Magna Carta in 1215, although he did point out that a judge now has to accept the verdict of a jury even if he thinks that it is mistaken. He sketched the Court hierarchy: District Court, Circuit Court, High Court - all answerable to the Court of Appeal. Judges, appointed now by the Judicial Appointments Committee, with Royal Warrant, and not "employed" either by the Crown or by the Ministry of Justice. They "hold office".

So the EU recently decided that Judges are "Workers" and are therefore legally entitled to receive a pension! Judges must retire at 70, which is interesting, because jurors can go on until 75. Judges are important figures in Public Life. They have to do their homework, preparing for trials, drafting papers, directing juries, summing up. They are not politicians, they are highly-qualified expert lawyers.

They are certainly not "enemies of the people", as one newspaper's disgraceful front page recently suggested. It is shocking that in our increasingly spiteful times judges now need security protection in, and sometimes out of, Court.

HH David Eccles gave us a wonderfully entertaining and interesting afternoon. We are grateful that he found time to come to speak to us, and hope he might come again.

Help boost for Universal Credit claimants

Citizens Advice has designed a new service to help you and speed things up if you are claiming Universal Credit for the first time but having problems with the application. The "Help to Claim" service became available in England from 1 April 2019 over the telephone, face to face, and online through "webchat" and Internet content.

We can advise on your eligibility, set up an email address or Universal Credit account, fill in the initial application form, get access to a computer, or arrange advance payments. We can also help you by ensuring that the right evidence is submitted with your form. And if you only need minimal help with your application, Citizens Advice can provide tips if you get stuck. As part of its normal service, Citizens Advice also supports people who are already receiving Universal Credit.

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 4th April 2019

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, David Rowley, Stephen Sherbourne, Andrew Johnson, Francesca Jones, Stuart Soames, Liz Ryall, Fleur Stevenson and David Topliss, Sue Rance (Clerk) and Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer), County Councillor Mark Gray and District Councillor Sue Cooper.

Apologies were received from Councillor Denise Hall. It was noted with regret that Councillor Patricia Millar had resigned.

Highway matters

The meeting began with a discussion of the proposed Toucan crossing at Portway, with County Highways officers Ian Marshall and Jason Sherwood. This crossing of the A4074, although bound up with the proposed housing development at Newnham Manor, had been a priority for the Parish Council for many years and there is a lot of support for it in the community. It was resolved that the Parish Council will submit another formal request to OCC for the crossing.

The officers confirmed that the County Highways are in favour of the Toucan crossing here in principle, whether or not it is funded by the Newnham Manor development. It was noted that the twin crossings are positioned in order to allow sufficient distance for deceleration and to provide a bus stop. OCC have liaised with SODC planning officers who are happy with the proposals as submitted with the planning application (Revision D, dated 25.09.18). The Section 106 legal agreement being drawn up with the developers also includes the plans for the crossing.

Of the Section 106 developer funds for the Newnham Manor development, should it go ahead, £100,000 will be earmarked for transport services, £17,192 for transport

infrastructure, e.g. new bus stops, real time bus information, £5,000 to extend the 30mph limit on the A4074 and £1,240 for a green travel plan to encourage residents to use environmentally friendly travel wherever possible.

Matters arising from the previous meeting

SODC had accepted four of the Parish Council's suggestions for street names at the CABI development: Elizabeth Road, Halifax Road, Hasthorpe Road and Shuttleworth Close.

Finance

Payments made in March were approved. The new grass cutting contractor, Landscape Group, Oxford, have done the first cut at the recreation ground.

The meeting reviewed and approved the council's Financial Risk Assessment (with one minor amendment), Financial Regulations (with two minor amendments) and Publications Scheme (without amendment).

It was agreed to give North Stoke Parochial Church Council a grant of £660 for grass cutting at North Stoke Churchyard and the Pound.

The Finance Officer had reviewed the asset list with Mr Strange and taken off small items valued at less than £100.

Allotment invoices are being delivered in April. There have been two enquiries about the vacant plots. District Councillor Cooper suggested that people sentenced to community service might be available to clear overgrown allotments for cultivation.

District Councillor's report

A vote of thanks was made to District Cllr Cooper for having the roadway cleaned on Wallingford Bridge. Cllr Cooper reported that the planning policy team has summarised the many public comments made on the Local Plan 2050 to be sent to the inspector.

The approach road to Oakley Wood recycling centre has attracted a lot of fly tipping, including tyres: the waste team has been alerted. Cllr Ryall reported that there have been many incidents of fly tipping on local farmland. The matter would be discussed at the next meeting of the Grundon Liaison Group. Fly-tipping could perhaps be reduced if more tyres were easily recycled to be used for road building.

County Councillor's report

Cllr Mark Gray reported that £2 million of growth fund money has been awarded for the Didcot Garden Town project. It is proposed to widen the link road from Didcot to the A34 interchange, provide two additional bridges over the Thames and a bypass for Clifton Hampden. The chairman requested improvements to the foot/cycle link path between Didcot and South Moreton where the surface is broken and no longer suitable for cycling.

A strategy to support older people is being developed by a number of agencies.

The OVO Energy Women's Tour – an elite international cycling road race – will be coming through our parish on Wednesday 12 June. In collaboration with the District Councils, 'blue badge' fraud is being investigated.

County Councillors have voted on the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway: all councillors opposed the scheme and asked for proper consultation on the principle of building this road. The climate change emergency motion was also unanimously supported by councillors.

Cllr Johnson and Cllr Gray will attend a site meeting at Stephens Field with county and district council officers on Friday 12th April to look at parking problems, signage and access to the Riverside Park and the recreation ground.

Cllr Topliss reported that one of the steps down to the riverside from Wallingford Bridge has been damaged for a long time and is in need of repair.

Planning

There were no decisions from SODC affecting our parish.

Responses to SODC on applications:

P19/S0702/FUL: Conversion of outbuilding to dwelling with associated parking and land-scaping. Oakridge, Nuffield Lane OX10 6QQ: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

P19/S0869/HH: Proposed ground floor front extension and porch. 9 Meadow Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8BH: RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

Neighbourhood Plan

The meeting of the Steering Group has been delayed because SODC has not signed off the Statutory Environmental Assessment (SEA): this has seriously affected the likely delivery date of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Environment & recreation ground

Update on playground and gym project

The Play Inspection Company had approved the playground for its official opening. The safety fencing would stay in place until the opening at no cost. No quote had yet been received for grass cutting at the playground. Where grass seeding has been done by the zip wires it has not yet begun to grow, so those areas will be fenced off and signs put in place.

Arrangements were in place for the opening and a vote of thanks was made to Cllrs Johnson and Rowley and all who have helped with the project, including Mrs Michelle Reynolds for all the publicity.

Traffic and transport

Cllr Jones is unable to continue as Parish Transport Rep, even though it was noted that this does not have to be done by a parish councillor.

Refresh Pro will send a quote for cleaning the wooden bus shelters. They will need to clean

each whole shelter and then seal the wood. Following the litter collection in March, it was agreed to ask Howbery Park Estates to supply a cigarette bin at the bus shelter on Benson Lane outside Howbery Park.

There have been complaints about inappropriate car parking on the grass verge at Home Farm and in the bus shelter opposite. This causes an obstruction and will be reported to the neighbourhood policing team.

Other matters

Cllr Sherbourne reported that Slade Legal is being consulted about the change of trustees for Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall. Fundraising is being planned for the extension.

Next meeting

The next meeting will be on Thursday 9th May at North Stoke Village Hall starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

The Annual Parish Meeting for all electors will be held at Crowmarsh Gifford Primary School on Thursday 16th May at 7.00 for 7.30pm. It was agreed to invite the Area Commander based at Abingdon Police Station as well as the police community support workers. The Chairman will invite a representative from RAF Benson, where 32 (The Royal Squadron), formerly The Queen's Flight, will be returning for about seven months while the runway at RAF Northolt is repaired.

Local elections

Elections for district councillors are to be held on Thursday 2nd May.

There will be no elections for parish councillors here because there were not enough nominations. The eight councillors who are re-appointed without an election are John Griffin, Andrew Johnson, David Rowley, Elizabeth Ryall, Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames, Fleur Stevenson and David Topliss.

This leaves four vacancies, which may be filled by co-option after the May meeting. The Parish Council will be looking for four new

members, so please think about whether you could join us. We are all volunteers and meet one Thursday evening each month to decide on local matters and try to support and improve our community. It would be good to have more representation from Mongewell and North Stoke. If you want to know more, please contact the clerk or the chairman or come along to the Annual Meeting on 16th May at the school and talk to us there.
