

Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum

The museum has opened a major new exhibition called Spy Oxfordshire. The exhibition will shine a light on previously unknown but fascinating local connections to the intelligence world. Oxfordshire intelligence officers were at the heart of the British war effort during the Second World War: from the commandos that knew no fear and wreaked havoc behind enemy lines, to the codebreakers, analysts, and "connectors of the dots" who provided Prime Minister Winston Churchill with unprecedented insights into the Nazi war machine.

While the exhibition will show that intelligence has a lot more layers to it than what we see in spy fiction, there will be plenty to catch the eye of 007 fans eagerly awaiting the release of *No Time To Die*. Spy Oxfordshire will feature some iconic film props and replicas on loan to the museum, such as the Walther PPK used by Sean Connery in *Dr. No* and original concept drawings for the PPK/S handgun with dermal sensors - used by Daniel Craig in *Skyfall*.

Artefacts from fictional espionage sit alongside their real-world counterparts, as Spy Oxfordshire will also unveil a collection of rare WW2-era gadgetry, including everything from Special Operations Executive (SOE) lapel and sleeve daggers to dummy pieces of coal used to conceal explosives.

Visitors will be encouraged to think about how everyone, even today, has a stake in the intelligence business. It is part of our daily lives, whether we like it or not, from what we read in the newspapers and the security measures we undergo at the airport to the use that is made by governments and private corporations alike of our internet searches, social media and even shopping habits.

The exhibition will run until 17th December. Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum currently opens Wednesdays to Saturdays from 11am to 5pm, and Sundays from 2pm to 5pm.

Past Times

The Proposed Oxford and Great Western Junction Railway

Wallingford's Branch line was opened in 1866 with the intention of carrying on across the Thames to Watlington, but this part of the line was never completed. As early as August 1842 Mr Stephenson, a railway engineer began to visit the area around Wallingford to conduct a preliminary survey of a proposed line that was to run from Oxford and form a junction with the Great Western Line near the Moulsford Bridge.

This proposed route would avoid the expense of crossing the Thames, and the route would be able to bypass Mongewell and avoid Wallingford completely, there being no railway station at Wallingford at this time. There was much opposition to this route, many people thought a second option for the line would start from Moulsford Station and would cross Cholsey Field (the route followed by today's line) and continue in a straight line to the west of the Workhouse, and then on to the River Thames crossing between Wittenham Wood and Shillingford Bridge. The route then crossed the Thames about a quarter of a mile from Dorchester and passed between the two Baldons, Chislehampton and Cowley before continuing to Oxford.

This was believed to be the best and cheapest route as it was expected there would be considerable opposition from the landowners at Mongewell, which could prove costly. It was intended the application would be presented to Parliament in November and if there was no opposition the line would be finished in twelve months. Luckily, the act was not passed, and Wallingford had to wait 24 years before the railway came to the town.

It is interesting to note that one proposal for the location of Wallingford Station was in the Market Place.



Present: Cllrs John Griffin, David Topliss, Stephen Sherbourne, David Rowley, Ken McCrea, Stuart Soames, Liz Ryall and Julian Park, County Cllr Mark Gray, Dr Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer) and Mrs Sue Rance (Clerk). and one member of the public for part of the meeting.

Apologies were received from Cllrs Fleur Stevenson and Andrew Johnson.

Finance

Payments agreed included £882 paid to Arrow Fencing for installing a new bench outside the Village Hall and repairing the bus shelter roof in North Stoke. £4,185.09 was paid to Came and Co. for the parish council's annual insurance premium. A donation of £200 to the Wallingford Volunteer Centre was agreed.

Planning

SODC has granted permission for P20/S2455/ FUL 27 Benson Lane Crowmarsh Gifford OX10 8ED. Detached dwelling (amended scheme to planning approval number P18/S2866/FUL)

The gate pillar at the entrance to Carmel College has now been repaired.

Consultation on planning applications

P20/S2748/FUL Crowmarsh Pavillion, Bellamy Way, Crowmarsh Gifford OX10 8FN. Internal alterations, new window/door openings, extension of external walkway and paved areas. The Parish Council is the applicant.

P20/S0545/FUL New house at the Woodyard, Constitution Hill, Mongewell. As amended by drawings accompanying email from agent received 21 September 2020 and accompanying revised tree information and planning statement. OBJECT because Mongewell is an unsustainable location for new

housing with no services, the site lies outside the designated infill area in policy CRP1 of the pre-submission Crowmarsh Neighbourhood Plan, there will be a loss of woodland and biodiversity, and potential traffic danger of a new vehicle entrance at the bottom of Constitution Hill.

District Councillors' report

SODC has launched a new website - https://www.southoxon.gov.uk.

To give people another chance to have their say on the Local Plan (but only on the inspector's main modifications), the Council is carrying out a six-week consultation which runs until Monday 2 November. The modifications relate mostly to building design and active travel plans. See southoxon.gov.uk/ newlocalplan.

SODC is now making adjustments to their 4-year strategy in response to the recent Corporate Plan consultation (932 responses and many thousands of comments). The theme which scored the highest in the eyes of the public was to "protect and restore our natural world", and anyone who watched David Attenborough's recent "Extinction" documentary would doubtless agree that this should be the top priority.

County Councillor's report

County Councillor Gray emphasised the importance of sticking to the rules and guidance on social distancing as COVID-19 cases are rising again. The county council wishes to encourage walking and cycling and has re-marked some cycle lanes and bus stop parking areas, half funded from central government in the first tranche of Active Travel funding. Central government has decided to concentrate on towns and cities for the second tranche, so there will be no more money coming to South Oxfordshire at present.

Environment and recreation

The playground and outdoor gym have had two Zoono biomisting sanitiser treatments to help to protect the local community. Other places have used this system, but please continue to use the sanitiser pumps, maintain distance and follow all current guidance.

Fresh Air Fitness has changed the bike in the outdoor gym. The roundabout needs remedial work and the base of the wooden train is to be repaired by Arrow Fencing in November.

The new planter in The Street has been damaged by a vehicle. Cllr Sherbourne has carried out interim repairs and it has been planted with pansies and spring bulbs and will be replaced in the spring with a half barrel. Another half barrel will be placed at the junction of The Street and Benson Lane, opposite the Queen's Head. Grundons have donated 50 native daffodil bulbs. Some will be planted on the corner of Lane End and The Street; ideas for other suitable locations are welcome.

Only one contractor has quoted for pruning the hedge at Home Farm, which will be done in late November.

Traffic and transport

The council agreed to support Bix and Assendon Parish Council in asking the police to address the problem of speeding motorcyclists.

There is now an hourly Sunday service to Henley via Nuffield and Nettlebed (X38). Buses to Henley now run through Crowmarsh Gifford (not around the bypass). This means that X38 buses to both Henley and Oxford use the stop outside the church. Timetables at bus stops have been updated or see the website https://www.thames-travel.co.uk/routes/x38x39x40. Face coverings and distancing are required on all public transport.

Traffic using the vehicular access to Newnham Green off the Old Reading Road needs to take extreme care as this road is used by pedestrians, particularly children and parents at the beginning and end of the school day.

Strategic priorities

The parish council's top three strategic priorities are:

- A toucan crossing on the A4074 Portway.
- A pedestrian crossing in The Street near The Bell.
- Improvements to the pavilion.

Other priorities being investigated or worked on include; improving the Watery Lane bridleway, speed indication and traffic management in North Stoke, possible crossing in Benson Lane, active travel (walking and cycling) and provision of electric vehicle charging points, and achieving a community use of the former council office site.

Glanville Associates have been commissioned to carry out a survey for a pedestrian crossing in The Street near The Bell.


