### Jewson delivery lorries

Crowmarsh Parish Council's Parish Transport Representative (Francesca Jones) met the Manager of Jewsons, Mr Steve Busby recently to discuss lorry deliveries and parking.

Mr Busby thought the situation had generally improved in recent years, but he will continue to monitor the situation and he urged local people to call into Jewson's compound immediately (rather than after the lorry has gone) to report to his staff any lorries parked on the pavement, blocking access to the pavement, across private drives or in in the bus layby.

All delivery lorry drivers have instructions not to turn into or park in Thames Mead, so please report straightaway any that do. A member of staff will go out immediately to request the drivers to move on and return later.

Lorries due to arrive before 10 am are required to book a delivery slot: Jewsons try hard to encourage delivery vehicles to follow this procedure and not to arrive early. Mr Busby will follow up any infringements reported to him.



# Past Times: The Trial of Edward De Mornay

Edward De Mornay was a local landowner in Victorian times. He and his brother Alfred bought the Howbery Estate from W S Blackstone in 1858, selling it to Mr Williams-Wynn, a Welsh solicitor, in 1867. The two brothers went on to live at Col d'Arbres Farm (now Coldharbour Farm), which they purchased on the death of Robert Mayne Clark.

Edward and Alfred De Mornay acquired quite a reputation for taking legal action. They took both Wallingford and Henley Councils to court on a number of occasions, but on 10<sup>th</sup> May 1868 the tables were turned against Edward De Mornay, when one of his employees took action against him.

Mr John Kettle, a 61-year-old agricultural labourer, worked at the time as Edward De Mornay's carter, for 11 shillings (55p) a week. The court case in May 1868 heard how, in October 1867, Kettle was attacked by Mr De Mornay while working for him. Such was the sympathy for Kettle in Crowmarsh and the surrounding area that a public subscription had enabled him to take his case to court. On the day of the hearing, the courtroom was filled to capacity by a noisy crowd of Kettle's supporters.

The court heard that one of Kettle's duties had been to water Mr De Mornay's horses each morning. On 8th October 1867, however, one of the horses, 'Poppett', wandered away while Kettle was leading the other three by the halter. 'Poppett' ambled through a gate and into Mr De Mornay's garden, but on entering the garden to fetch the horse, Mr Kettle received two or three violent blows to the head. They were inflicted on him by Mr De Mornay, who sprang at him with a riding whip. Kettle staggered away, bleeding, but De Mornay, not satisfied, struck him several more times. Kettle stayed at work for two more hours, shocked and bleeding, before he went home to recover.

The following day, Edward De Mornay told Kettle that he had deducted 5 shillings (25p) from his wages, because Kettle hadn't fed his horses the previous night. Kettle assured him that he had done so, in the early evening, but that as Mr De Mornay only went into the stables to look at 10pm, the horses would have

eaten everything. This was not accepted by De Mornay, however, who refused to pay Kettle his full wage.

Arron Grainger, a shepherd, Clara Bitmead, a shepherdess, and Joseph Griffin, a carter's boy, were also employed by Edward De Mornay. On the day of the trial they all felt so strongly about Kettle's treatment that they stood up in court and gave evidence against their employer, even though he was known to have a short temper.

Mr Boyton (a Wallingford surgeon), confirmed that he had found three wounds on Mr Kettle's head after the incident, all about 1 inch (25mm) long. Although Edward De Mornay told the court that the blows he had given Kettle were 'very light', the judge found in Kettle's favour. De Mornay was fined £10, which was awarded to Kettle (a sum that would normally have taken him 5 months to earn). De Mornay was ordered to pay all costs, no doubt to the great satisfaction of onlookers at the time.

### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 7th September 2017

Present: Cllrs John Griffin (Chair), Stephen Sherbourne, Nigel Hannigan, Denise Hall, Stuart Soames, Fleur Stevenson, David Topliss, David Rowley, and Francesca Jones; Sue Rance (Clerk), Yvonne Peet (Finance Officer)

Apologies for absence from Cllrs Andrew Johnson and David Mannering

### Matters arising from the August meeting

Overhanging trees at Wallingford Bridge have been trimmed. An A4074 traffic survey will be done in the 30mph zone. Display boards will be purchased for use at the neighbourhood plan exhibitions.

The Finance Officer reported that all allotment invoices have now been paid. Cllr Soames said that a decision will be announced in November on a grant from WREN for refurbishment of North Stoke Village Hall: the Parish Council has agreed to pay the 10.75% which WREN requires for administration costs.

Quotes will be obtained for felling the diseased ash tree in Jethro Tull Gardens. We have agreed to replace the tree with three trees on the edge of the green area, but the type of tree to be planted has not yet been decided.

### **Finance**

The parish council's insurance premium and external audit fee of £360.00 had been paid.

Cllr Sherbourne reported that the Botany Gardens play area grass has not been cut at all this season. The Finance Officer will discuss this with the contractors, Berinsfield Community Business.

A financial report to 31st July showed that parish council income was £27,614 including the first precept payment of £19,101; expenditure was £12,173. The annual financial return has been approved and will now be posted on the parish

council website and on noticeboards following the successful conclusion of the audit.

It was agreed to consider requests for grants at the October meeting.

### **Planning**

Decisions: The Council noted the following decision from SODC:

P17/S2363/FUL (Full Application): Change existing garage into a ground floor, one-bedroom annexe, Sycamore House, 12 Lane End, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8DG. PERMISSION GRANTED.

Applications: The Council agreed its response to SODC on the following applications:

P17/S2944/HH (Householder) & P17/S2945/ LB (Listed Building): Change of heating system from oil-fired boiler to an air source heat pump. The Grange, The Street, North Stoke, OX10 6BL. RECOMMEND APPROVAL.

Lawful development applications: The Council noted two applications (no views are accepted on these applications, which are decided on factual evidence):

P17/S3067/LDP: New vehicle gate with similar height and same location. Southern Gas Networks AGI Offtake, A4074, Ipsden (in Crowmarsh parish), OX10 6AF.

P17/S3195/LDP: Formation of habitable room in roof-space with rear-dormer and gable buildup. 176 Crowmarsh Hill, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8BG.

Appeal decision under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act:

An appeal to the Secretary of State against SODC's decision to refuse the CABI application P15/S3387/FUL was determined on the basis of a public inquiry. The appeal is ALLOWED and planning permission is GRANTED for demolition of existing buildings and creation of a new headquarters for CABI, erection of 91

dwelling houses, comprising open market and affordable housing, provision of open space, landscaping and parking, and other associated works at CABI International, Nosworthy Way, Mongewell, OX10 8DE.

South Oxfordshire Local Plan 2033

SODC will publish its final draft of the Local Plan on 11th October 2017 and will invite a further round of public comments, which will be submitted along with the plan to the government. The plan and comments will then be considered by a planning inspector at a public examination next year. The Local Plan is the document that explains how the council will address the need for housing in the district until the year 2033, including helping Oxford City's unmet housing need. SODC is planning for approximately 22,500 homes in the whole district over the next 22 years. However, in view of comments by the Parish Council and residents, SODC has reduced the number of houses allocated in Crowmarsh Gifford to 110. Previously proposed housing sites in our parish have all been removed from the Local Plan, to allow the forthcoming Neighbourhood Plan to allocate sites. A number of neighbourhood plans across the district are also supporting the need for additional housing by allocating sites in other towns and villages.

### **Neighbourhood Plan**

An exhibition about the Neighbourhood Plan was planned by the Steering Group on Saturday 23th September in Crowmarsh Village Hall repeated on Saturday 30th September at North Stoke, between 10am and 4pm.

### **Environment and Recreation Committee**

### Play area action group

Planning permission will be required for the proposed children's play area before we can apply for a grant from SODC's community fund in Aprill. Four quotes have been received and it was agreed that planning permission should be applied for now, based on one of the designs.

Cllr Rowley recommended providing access to two toilets at the pavilion for people using the play area and recreation ground. This could be facilitated (without giving access to the rest of the premises) by the use of a Smart Lock with a code and timer, plus a door closer.

Mr Chris Strange is researching the options. Disabled access would have to be addressed. The Finance Officer will consult the council's insurers in case it might affect our cover.

### Replacement noticeboards

Cllr Jones reported that eight parish council noticeboards, including one in the bus shelter in North Stoke, are in need of replacement. Cllr Soames proposed a board with a lockable portion for official notices outside the village hall in North Stoke. Cllr Jones will report back at the October meeting with quotes.

### **Traffic and Transport Committee**

The size and number of lorries delivering to Jewsons are still causing concern, as they create an obstruction to traffic, pedestrians and bus users, particularly during the morning rush hour. Cllr Jones has visited the manager of Jewson to discuss the inappropriate parking and congestion created by their suppliers.

Jewson has apologised for the problems caused and has commented that suppliers should not turn into Thames Mead. Jewson will contact the suppliers involved and has requested that any further incidents be reported to them. It was noted that some public parking also creates an obstruction at their gate and that Jewson would be prepared to pay for parking bays to be marked out. Cllr Sherbourne suggested that clearer marking of the bus stop and the area in front of Jewson's gate would be more useful, but the surface needs repair.

It was noted that the 136/139B Sunday bus service has unexpectedly stopped running. This is the Thames Travel bus that serves Cholsey, RAF Benson and Henley. In October the weekday service will be cut back. The transport rep, Cllr Jones, has asked Thames Travel for notice of future changes and deplored the sudden cut to the Sunday services.

### Correspondence

Details of forthcoming charges for recycling certain items at household waste centres.

### **District Councillor Pullen's report**

The CABI planning appeal has been upheld.

The current SODC round of grants closed on 6<sup>th</sup> September.

District Councillors Pullen and Bloomfield each have £5,000 grant money available for specific local projects.

The LEADER fund has £75,000 for the rural economy and community.

No announcement has yet been made about the future of the former SODC office site. However, SODC is most likely to move to new permanent offices in Didcot. There is no further news on a unitary authority for Oxfordshire. Plans are in hand for Didcot Garden Town.

The route for the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway has not yet been decided. There are three options for a southern route and one northern one. Improvements are planned for the A34.

The Local Plan provides for 3,000 houses in Chalgrove, 1,500 in Berinsfield and 3,000 in Culham. However, allocations in Crowmarsh Gifford will now depend on the forthcoming Neighbourhood Plan.

### Represenatives on outside bodies

North Stoke Village Hall

Cllr Soames reported that the village hall refurbishment has now been completed with the help of a lottery grant. CPR and defibrillator training will be held in the near future: there are 20 potential candidates for this training.

Vacancy for Trustee

Cllr Griffin proposed and Cllr Soames seconded that Cllr Sherbourne be appointed as a trustee of the Wallingford Bridge Estate Charity, to represent the Parish Council. This was agreed and the Clerk will inform the charity.

#### Other business

A steering group will be appointed to manage the neighbourhood plan process.

Cllr Jones reported that significant changes in data protection will take effect with new legislation on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Further data protection training may be needed. It was agreed to consult Cllr Johnson initially, who managed the council's registration as a data controller.

The Employment Action Group, a charity, is now running the children's centre in Berinsfield.

The new Berin Centre opens on 8<sup>th</sup> September. One of their services is to help people who have difficulty applying for jobs online. They have funding for the next two years.

Cllr Sherbourne has purchased new children's defibrillator pads which he will fit soon.

The Regal Centre has closed for 18 months because of safety concerns. Regular users are having to find alternative premises.

### **Next meeting**

The next meeting will be on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October at North Stoke Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

### Bus timetable cuts

Some bus users may be aware that Thames Travel stopped running their 136/139B Sunday services to Cholsey, RAF Benson and Henley on 3<sup>rd</sup> September, with little or no advance warning. Some timetables at bus stops might still not have been updated.

Monday to Friday and Saturday 136 timetables remain unchanged. However, cuts to these services are planned in October:

- The inter-peak Monday to Friday service will reduce to hourly;
- Later evening journeys will be withdrawn;
- There will be an hourly Saturday service, with a reduced period of operation: the service will start later and finish earlier:
- There will be a gap in the Saturday service to allow for driver breaks.

Thames Travel will release more details shortly.

Meanwhile, Going Forward CIC has expanded its services to include a limited Tuesday service between Wallingford, Ewelme and Watlington.

As with all local bus services, it's a case of "use them or lose them"!


