

# The Oxfordshire Comet goes into orbit

Oxfordshire County Council has launched a new bookable transport service, called the Oxfordshire Comet. It has been created to allow people without suitable access to public transport to make the journeys they want.

The new service operates as a membership scheme that individuals and groups will need to register with before making their first journey.

The Oxfordshire Comet uses vehicles that normally take children to school and adults to day care centres. Because we already own these vehicles, we only have to cover running costs, meaning we can keep costs down for passengers.

It can be booked for any type of trip – to meet friends in town, travel across the county, attend an appointment or pop to the shops. It's been designed so that it is easy to book, with a pre-paid account that can be set up on the phone.

The service is for Oxfordshire residents who don't have access to suitable public transport. It is also open to wheelchair users or those with mobility issues. The service can be booked by individuals, groups, schools, organisations and local communities.

The Oxfordshire Comet can do one-off journeys, regular and group trips. The Comet can also run regular community routes in areas where local people may not have suitable access to public transport. We are already in discussions with a number of parish councils and other groups over the setting up of such routes. A fund of £200,000 has been set aside that parish councils and other organisations can apply for to trial the Comet service for an initial period.

The 16-seater Comet vehicles are fully wheel-chair and pushchair accessible.

#### **Incident at Wallingford Toll**

The 25th August 1869 was a fine day and George Hearmon the Toll Keeper, at Wallingford Bridge Toll House (where the stone seats are today on Wallingford Bridge) was on duty that afternoon.

The Reverend George Day, Rector of Brightwell Baldwin, riding with his son in a dogcart, approached the Toll House from the Crowmarsh side of the bridge. He found that Hearmon's cart was blocking part of the road; he claimed later in court that the wheel on Hearmon's cart touched his pony's nose and made the pony back off a pace.

This evidently angered the Revd Day so much that when asked to pay the 1d (1/2p) toll he refused and getting out of his cart, struck Hearmon in the face. Retribution was swift and Hearmon knocked the angry Reverend down,

at which point Day's son joined in. Hearmon stood his ground, knocking Day down a second time. There were a number of witnesses who separated the two pugilists.

Mr Hearmon summoned the Revd Day for assault. Five witnesses appeared, all giving evidence that Day struck Hearmon first, but that Hearmon was aggressive when asking for the toll to be paid.

Henry Hawkins, the Chairman of the Bench said it gave a bad impression when Clergyman were seen brawling in the streets, and he would impose a fine of 2s 6d (12½p) with £1 15s (£1.75) costs.

It's interesting to note that Revd Day was the fourth person Hearmon had taken to Court for evading the toll or assault.

## Back where they belong

On 6th August, a simple ceremony of re-interment was held in a field at Coldharbour Farm. It was where, in November 1993, farmer Jack Edwards informed Wallingford Museum staff that a lead coffin with human bones had been found in one of his fields. The coffin was identified as Roman and the Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society excavated the grave and recovered and recorded the burial.

Excavations on the site then took place in subsequent years and a total of 25 burials were identified, some of which had been ploughed out and damaged. The burials were aligned roughly north-south and a few grave

goods were found, including a fine bone comb, coins and a complete pot. The coin evidence showed they were late 4th century burials. They could have been a family group, perhaps from a high status farmstead – which has yet to be found.

Now the bones have been returned to lie in peace. In keeping with Roman funeral practice, a short eulogy was given and the deceased were offered a libation of wine, salt and olive oil before being carefully covered up.

The Society wishes to record its thanks to the Edwards family for their help and interest. Some of the Roman items found at Coldharbour can now be seen at Wallingford Museum.





Good news – your Parish Church is now open again every day. Everyone is welcome to pop in and have a look around this ancient building with its original Norman features, characterised by the round arches.

It can be rather dark inside, and we are hoping to provide automated lighting soon — in the meantime, if you do need to turn the lights on then please do remember to turn them off again when you leave.

The church was originally closed because of petty vandalism, but the best way of preventing this is to have a steady stream of visitors, so please do help us keep an eye on the building and report anything remotely suspicious.

Whilst the building is of historical interest, we hope that you will also find it to be an oasis of peace and calm in which to stop, reflect and pray. Knowing that generations of villagers have worshipped here for over 800 years brings a certain sacredness to the space where we can turn our minds to things eternal, putting our immediate worries and concerns into perspective as we turn to God.

In Celtic spirituality, there is a concept of a "thin place" where heaven and earth come

close together and the line between them blurred so that our Creator God can be sensed in his creation.

Such "thin places" are not limited to mountain tops, the Holy Land or other far-off destinations at the end of a pilgrimage – indeed, the message proclaimed by Jesus and his followers is that "the Kingdom of God is close at hand". In his teaching on prayer Jesus encouraged us, saying "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). Well, for those who were knocking, the church door has been opened!

If you would like to join with others in more formal times of prayer, we have recently begun to say the traditional short service of Evening Prayer every Sunday at 6.30pm. This is in addition to the modern version of Morning Prayer which we use every Friday at 9am. Alternatively, if you are unable to join us but would like to share your prayers, then we have a book on the table near the church door in which you are welcome to leave a prayer request. We will light a candle for those mentioned as we pray for them at our main 11am Sunday service.

## **District Councillor's Report**

# Birthday celebrations for our Queen's 90th year

We offered our Town and Parish councils a grant towards any community events they were holding to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday. 71 out of 86 parish and town councils in our District took us up on the offer and we distributed over £50,000 towards these events. If you took advantage of this, I hope that you and your community had a really great time!

#### **Planning Matters**

We have been working with our Planning Officers to produce a simple guide on how members of the public should reply to Planning Permission Consultations. We are hoping that this will help people respond, and improve their understanding of what does and does not constitute a Material Planning Consideration. The guide can be obtained from our Planning Team.

#### July Town and Parish Forum

We held our Town and Parish forum in July. Events like this help us to stay in touch with town and parish councils and keep them up to date with the work we're doing. At the July event we provided updates on our bid for district-based unitary councils and progress on our local plans. We also took the chance to talk to councils about our new corporate plan.

These events are an important opportunity for dialogue and in future, we aim to hold two of them each year, instead of just the one.

#### Golf club lands in the rough

Following the destruction of 29 protected pine trees in the North Stoke conservation area we successfully prosecuted Thames Valley Golf Limited, owners of the Springs Hotel and Golf Club. The company was fined £8,000 and ordered to pay over £1,500 costs.

If you believe that there have been violations, please let the Enforcement Team know so that they can investigate and take appropriate action.

# Five Councils update - Changes from 1st August

The first of our services to be handed over to Capita and VINCI on 1st August has been completed. The only exception to this is that we're going to put back the launch of the new system for people to pay for their car parking by phone by a month, until 1st September. A benefit of doing this is that it gives us bit more time to let people know the change is taking place, but in the meantime people can continue to use the existing RingGo system as normal.

#### Devolution/unitary councils update

We need to understand how the recent changes in the government may affect our proposals for devolution and local government reorganisation. Following discussions with civil servants, we've now had a very clear message from central government that devolution proposals should have broad support across all tiers of local government in the area they would cover. We don't currently have this in Oxfordshire so we've collectively agreed to again explore whether we can reach a set of proposals we can all sign up to.

This is likely to take a little while so don't expect anything to happen publicly for a couple of months. We've postponed publication of the PWC and Grant Thornton studies, and plans for consultation are now on hold.

#### Cutting down on council tax fraud

Last year our fraud investigators helped to prevent more than £410,000 in council tax discounts from being fraudulently claimed across the South and Vale Districts, and they also recovered more than £160,000 that had already been paid out to illegal claims. If you have concerns that someone may be carrying out a fraud, please do report it so we can look into it. It's your money that they are claiming!

#### New grants scheme

We've launched a new revenue grants scheme - any non-profit organisation can apply, like a charity or local village committee. The grants are from £10,000 to £100,000 over four years and can be used on revenue

spending – so things like rent and rates, salary costs, and marketing and publicity.

We're launching these grants to help us meet our new corporate objectives, including investing in the district's future and building thriving communities. Applications are open until 15th September this year. Contact the grants team on 01235 422405.

### Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 11th August 2016

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Francesca Jones, David Mannering, and Ann Sharp; Sue Rance (Clerk) and Mel Malcolm (Finance Officer)

Apologies were received from Councillors Stephen Sherbourne, Stuart Soames, Andrew Hermsen, Fleur Stevenson, Andrew Johnson and County Councillor Mark Gray.

Sadly, Mel Malcolm is leaving the area in September so we need to recruit a new Finance Officer. We thanked Mel for her excellent work managing the parish council accounts and advising councillors on finance matters.

#### Matters from previous meeting

Grass Cutting Contract: Cllr Sharp has contacted Scofell about problems with the grass cutting contract and ordered additional cuts in some areas where it was particularly poor. The grass cutting arrangements are now working although standards are not as high as desirable everywhere. This has been a difficult year due to starting late and wet weather in June. Consideration will be given to going out to tender early next year, possibly using more than one contractor for the different areas that require different machinery. A sub-committee will be convened to negotiate this.

Cllr Sharp will obtain a quote for cutting the hedge at Home Farm. Roadside vegetation at Crowmarsh roundabout also needs cutting.

The County Council has approved the employment of a school crossing patrol officer at the corner of Old Reading Road and The Street. This is being funded by the Churchill Lollipoppers' campaign.

#### **Finance**

July payments were agreed. The Finance Officer reported that grass cutting invoices are now correct. Arrow Fencing have done some repairs at the recreation ground. It was agreed to continue with the contract for emptying dog bins, although no new bins will now be provided as litter bins can now be used because all of it goes for incineration. Lids with bins are preferable and litter bins can get overfull. Dog owners are reminded to pick up after your dog and not to leave bags on trees and fences.

Proposed bus shelter in Benson Lane: a quote of £1050 has been received from Arrow Fencing to erect a bus shelter opposite the village hall and it was agreed to proceed with this.

#### **Planning**

Neighbourhood planning

There was an inconclusive discussion about neighbourhood development planning and this matter will be considered at the next meeting.

A neighbourhood development plan is written by local people, 'made' or adopted by the district council and becomes part of the development plan that helps to decide planning applications. SODC strongly supports neighbourhood planning to help local people to shape the way their communities grow and develop into the future.

However, parish councillors were not convinced that it would help Crowmarsh; many felt it would require a lot of volunteer effort and the experience of neighbouring parishes has been mixed. After discussion it was agreed to proceed with this work. It was agreed to apply for a grant from South Oxfordshire District Council towards this. A further application could be made for grant funding if we decide to refurbish the children's play area.

Cllr Mannering has posted notices about booking the hard court and will advertise this facility in *Crowmarsh News*.

#### **Traffic and Transport**

Peter Brett Associates had reported on their survey and initial design for a proposed pedestrian crossing of the A4074 Portway.

Notes on the recent Parish Transport Representatives' meeting have been circulated. These county-wide meetings will continue for the time being but the County Council is no longer providing resources. Grants may be obtained to provide home to college transport for outlying villages.

Thames Travel has issued a leaflet on all changes to bus services. The buses from Cholsey to RAF Benson (136) and Wallingford to Henley (139) now come through Crowmarsh Gifford. Full details are at www.thamestravel.co.uk.

It is now possible to book County Council minibuses (with drivers) for use during the day when they are not required for school transport. Cllr Jones will advertise this in *Crowmarsh News*.
