

# The 134 Bus Service Temporary continuation

The Oxfordshire County Council decided at their meeting on 16th February to terminate all bus subsidy arrangements in Oxfordshire. This will remove the current subsidy paid to Go Ride to run the regular 134 service, the subsidy being due to terminate on 31st March. Go Ride had worked hard to prepare for a reduced 134 Service, with some fare increases, to ensure the continuation of an economically viable service from 1st April.

However there has been some improvement in the short notice of this implementation. Dave Harrison, Managing Director of Go Ride, announced:

"Go Ride CIC were formally notified on Tuesday 23rd February that Oxfordshire County Council have decided to extend the existing contract for service 134 until Wednesday 20th July. This is also the date for which notice has been given for the other remaining contracts held by the company."

The Council's offer of a contract extension will be accepted by Go Ride CIC. Therefore, the proposed changes to the timetable have been postponed and the current level of service will be maintained until the above date. It is now expected that the reduced commercial service will commence on Thursday 21st July.

We apologise for the recent spate of conflicting information, but we hope everyone can agree that this is good news at least in the short term."

The new timetable and fare structure will be reported in *Crowmarsh News* and will be on bus timetable notices.

Our thanks go to Roy McMillan of South Stoke who has been communicating with Go Ride on behalf of all the affected Parishes.

# Staff needed for the Police and Crime Commissioner **Elections**

On Thursday 5th May, elections are taking place across the country to elect new police and crime commissioners.

In order to ensure things run smoothly, SODC needs to fill a number of paid roles with enthusiastic and reliable people. For election day, the Council is aiming to recruit Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Verification Staff, and for 6th May a number of Count Staff. All these positions are paid (but of course for one day only).

Presiding Officers and Poll Clerks must be able to get to their designated polling station by 6.15am on 5th May and stay until after polls close at 10pm. Count Staff must be able to get to the White Horse Leisure and Tennis Centre on 6th May (times approximately 9am to 4pm).

### A Victorian Murder Enquiry in Crowmarsh

In 1856, William and Susannah Clarke lived at the "The Cottage" public house, located at Beggar's Bush Hill, Benson. Beggar's Bush Hill is on the road from Benson Airfield and the Swyncombe/Crowmarsh crossroads. William was described as quiet, plainly dressed, and middle aged (32). Susannah was his second wife and was much younger than him; their relationship was a stormy one.

Clarke walked with his wife along the path that ran past Crowmarsh Church and the grounds of Howbery Park to the main gate and arrived there at 2.30 on the morning of 27th December. George Wakefield, who lived in the Lodge House at Howbery (in 1856 the Lodge was inside the gates), said that Susannah Clarke seemed to be close to collapse.

George opened the gates to allow them in, but when he went to assist Clarke he realised that Susannah was in fact dead. The body was taken into the Lodge and George Wakefield ran to Wallingford to get a doctor and also to inform Susannah's mother.

Dr Buswell, surgeon assistant to Dr Barrett, of Wallingford, arrived at the Howbery Lodge at about 4am. There he certified that Susannah Clarke was dead. He also noted that there were a number of bruises to her face and body.

The inquest was held at The Bell, Crowmarsh on the following Monday. Dr Buswell, who conducted the post-mortem on Monday morning, gave evidence that he discovered that there had been considerable bleeding on the brain and between the scalp and the skull. He reported this could have been caused by violence or natural causes. He did not think a boot or a stick would have caused that type of injury.

James Saunders, the deceased's step-father, in giving evidence said he and his wife went into Wallingford with William and Susannah in the morning, where they went to the Green Tree and drank several glasses of gin and cloves. They then went to the Town Arms and drank four or five gin and peppermints. At 10

o'clock in the evening they parted with William and his daughter who were crossing the bridge on their way home. Susannah was very drunk.

William and Susannah were seen by Crowmarsh Church at about 10.30 by Sarah Godfrey as she crossed the road from the Church. She stated that Susannah was lying on the ground and that William was trying to get her to stand up. William Lovegrove stated that when he passed the Church Saunders was in the Churchyard.

Richard Smith, Crowmarsh's policeman, gave evidence that on Sunday he followed a track from the churchyard to the gate at Howbery, possibly caused by a body being dragged along so its heels or toes scuffed a furrow in the path.

When all the evidence was heard, William Clarke was arrested and charged with manslaughter. Bail of a £100 was set, Clarke paid half and there were two sureties of £25 each, so he was allowed to go home.

The trial was held in March in Oxford. The evidence was a repeat of the inquest, except that two experts both gave evidence to the effect that the blow to the head could have been caused by a fall, which was thought most likely.

At this point the Judge stopped the trial. He told the Jury that it was very likely that Clarke's wife died from a fall and there was no evidence to show that Clarke had caused her death by any violence. It was therefore quite impossible for the jury to come to a conclusion that the death of Mrs Clarke was caused by any violence by Clarke.

The Jury found the prisoner not guilty, and he was discharged a free man.

# The history of cartoons in British arts and politics

Environmentalist, historian, gardener, and avid collector Steve Head, from Cholsey, returns to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) with a further talk. He is an entertaining speaker, and the timing of this talk is most apt to coincide with the opening of the special exhibition at the Museum - '300 Years of Cartoons!'

Steve will be giving a special talk on the history of cartoons in British arts and politics. He will trace the evolution of cartoons from their medieval origins, through the great Golden Age in the eighteenth century, when cartoons were a major political force, on to the eras of *Punch*, *Private Eye* and now *Viz* magazine. The talk is designed to complement the exhibition of Steve's own collection which will be on show at the Wallingford Museum during 2016.

# House burglaries and home security

We have unfortunately seen an increase in dwelling burglaries on our area in recent weeks. House breaks are normally very rare in this area so I do not want to alarm you, but to make you aware of simple steps you can take to protect your property. Remember: burglars don't need brains, just an opportunity.

#### Doors and Windows

Ensure you have good window locks and use them. Make sure you deadlock the doors and that your doors are fitted with good locks. Get into the habit of double checking doors and window locks before going to bed.

#### Timer Lights

Use timer switches on lights and radios when you are not at home. Burglars will think twice if they think somebody might be home.

#### **Alarms**

Burglar alarms are a really good deterrent to the opportunist burglar.

#### Garden Gates and Fences

Ensure garden gates are locked and that you cannot reach over and unlock the gate.

Consider fitting Prikka Strip (plastic spikes) on top of tall gates and fences. Flimsy trellis is good as it breaks easily and burglars do not like this as there is a risk of cutting themselves and leaving DNA behind. Prickly plants also act as a deterrent. Also please do not leave any tools or items in the garden that could be used to break windows or force entry to your property.

#### Garages and Sheds

Ensure you have a solid garage door and keep it locked. Consider upgrading the locks on your garage door. Ensure sheds are locked with a high quality padlock and that the clasps are fitted with non-return screws. Consider fitting a shed alarm which can be purchased for approximately £20.00.

#### Crime Prevention Surveys

Local Police Community Support Officers can attend your address and carry out a survey for free. To arrange this, please email sue.harris@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk

If you look at the Thames Valley Police website (www.thamesvalley.police.uk), you can find a section entitled Crime Reduction which offers really good advice on home security.

#### Looking Out for Suspicious Activity

If you see someone in your street who you think is acting suspiciously, try to get a good description of them and a registration number and description of any vehicle they are using. Don't hesitate to phone us either on 999 if you think a crime is being committed, or 101 (non emergency number), and we can stop check them and find out what they are doing. Remember your instincts are normally right. If something does not feel or look right, it probably isn't.

# **District Councillor's Report**

#### **Council Tax Good News**

Here at SODC Officers and Members have been working to get the maximum value for money and we are now in a position to honour our election pledge not to raise our element of the Council Tax. So, for 2016/17, this will remain at the same level as the current year.

#### **Policing**

We continue to work with Police and Crime Commissioner, Anthony Stansfeld, to get the best value for money possible whilst maintaining and improving standards. Following the Home Office's change in its funding proposals, as announced by the Chancellor in the Autumn Statement, the Budget proposals for the coming year have been revised and are now in the scrutiny process.

For Thames Valley policing, one area of significant concern is the growth in cybercrime. Whilst this is a national issue, we all need to be vigilant, and an initiative has been launched which will help our residents. We urge all Councils and the public to be aware of the Cyber Crime Awareness initiative and to visit Cyber STREETWISE at www.cyberstreetwise.com/ and we ask you to do everything you can to spread the work.

#### Grants

The next window for grants opens in February. It runs from 1st February to 1st April 2016 for decisions by 10 July 2016. We have made changes to this process to make it easier to apply for Grants and obtain the funds to support projects; we hope that our communities will make full use of the opportunity this presents. The Working Group has met to determine the way we will handle the funds available following the withdrawal of the Council Tax Reduction Scheme, and an announcement on this will be made in the near future.

#### The Council's Home

As the anniversary of the fire at Crowmarsh passed, there was a great deal of speculation

in the press about the location of our new, permanent home. Work on this continues and for the time being, all we can say is that it is very unlikely that we will be returning to the old site. On the basis of progress to date we expect an announcement during May or June this year.

#### **Planning**

We've just set up a new register for people interested in building their own property. This will help us get an idea of how much local interest there is in self-build, which will help us write our planning policies. Whilst we're not currently aware of any plots of land that are available for self-build, the register will help us match people up with suitable plots of land should they become available in the future. This can be found on our web site; you just need to search for 'Custom Build Register'.

The planning inspector has approved our Community Infrastructure Levy schedule subject to a few minor amendments and this will go to cabinet early this year.

Work continues apace across our District on Neighbourhood Planning with more communities starting work on a plan, and we will continue to provide the best support that we can with this piece of work.

#### **Didcot Garden Town**

Didcot and the surrounding areas are set to get major infrastructure funding to help with the delivery of 15,000 new homes and 10,000 new high-tech jobs in both our District and the Vale.

Housing and Planning minister, Brandon Lewis MP visited the town to announce that our joint bid for Garden Town status for Didcot was successful; this will pave the way for improvements like a northern perimeter road for the town and the 'Science Bridge' over the railway line into Milton Park, as well as improvements to existing areas of Didcot.

#### **Armed Forces Covenant**

We have a significant military presence in our District, not only with RAF Benson, but also with Services Family Accommodation in Didcot

for Dalton Barracks in Abingdon, and residents from St David's and St George's Barracks across the border at Bicester, and RAF Halton and Air Command (formerly Strike Command) in Buckinghamshire. Whilst I was Chairman of the Council I signed the Armed Forces Covenant at a ceremony in County Hall on behalf of The Council a few years ago and we

have commenced work on a 'refresh' to our approach to meeting this commitment.

## Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 4th February 2016

Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Nigel Hannigan, Francesca Jones, Stephen Sherbourne, Andrew Hermsen, Ann Sharp, David Mannering, Andrew Johnson, Mo Fillmore, Fleur Stevenson and Stuart Soames; Sue Rance (Clerk), Melanie Malcolm (Finance Officer); County Councillor Mark Gray (part of the meeting).

#### Matters arising from previous meeting

The council had contacted the police about inappropriate parking and this will be followed up by contacting the vehicle owners.

An updated emergency plan is due with changes reflecting that sandbags and accommodation can no longer be provided at the SODC offices in Benson Lane.

A letter from a resident about air quality had been circulated with the minutes. As part of the Wallingford Air Quality Management Area there are a few diffusion tubes in Crowmarsh. See https://oxfordshire.air-quality.info/ for the data on air quality for the area either side of Wallingford Bridge. Consultation on SODC's plans is at www.southoxon.gov.uk/lowemissions – please take part by 25th March.

#### **Finance**

The accounts at 31st December showed £51,000 in the current account, £91,000 in reserves and £2,849 in the Unity Trust account. Operating costs (including expenditure on the recreation ground and pavilion) were below the budget. More details will be available in April after the end of the financial year. The Council intends to earmark funds for specific projects and Cllr Johnson is collating members' responses so a decision can be made on priorities.

Cllrs Soames, Sherbourne, Hannigan and Griffin will review the grass-cutting contract, agree the specification and seek quotes for the coming season.

A grant of £100 was made to Enrych Oxfordshire (formerly Ryder Cheshire Volunteers). This local charity supports adults with physical disabilities, enabling them to access a variety of activities by providing each with a dedicated volunteer.

#### **County Councillor's report**

County Councillor Gray reported on Section 106 developer contributions available for improved access facilities near to the Wilder site and bus stop improvements, which might help with the northbound bus stop in North Stoke (see Traffic & Transport below). The Chairman reported that Arrow Fencing has quoted £1050 + VAT for a wooden bus shelter in Benson Lane, plus the cost of painting. It was agreed to research the possibility of funding this from S.106 money.

The County Council is inviting bids from local councils to take responsibility for certain areas of work under the 'Oxfordshire Together' scheme. The Parish Council already receives a grant for grass cutting in the parish but could apply for more if the area of work is extended. Other areas could include road sign cleaning, footpath maintenance, serving letters on residents whose hedges are overgrowing the pavement, but not maintenance of roundabouts. Cllr Gray suggested a renewed effort to recruit a crossing patrol officer, possibly with enhanced pay. If anyone is interested, please contact the parish clerk or chairman.

Oxfordshire County Council will set a budget on 16th February. Children's Centres and Day Centres are at risk of cuts as well as libraries. Cllr Gray reported that, even if council tax were to be increased by 10%, there would still be a need for substantial budget cuts.

Cllr Gray attended a meeting to discuss the

future of the 134 minibus service between Wallingford, Crowmarsh Gifford, North and South Stoke and Goring: 900 journeys per annum are made by Crowmarsh residents. In the short term, the hourly service is to continue between 8am and 4pm – between 9 and 3 on Saturdays (see article from the operators GoRide).

A satellite subsidy of £350 per annum is available for households in areas where better broadband is not available. This is a government grant and residents need to apply individually to Oxfordshire County Council.

# **Telecommunications cabinet in North Stoke**

BT Openreach plans to install a new telecommunications cabinet outside No. 7, Wallingford Road, to expand broadband accessibility in North Stoke.

# Planning Application P15/S3387 – developer contributions

The case officer dealing with planning application P15/S3387 (new headquarters for CABI, plus 91 dwelling houses) has asked the Council to comment on S.106 contributions (the money from developers for community facilities). There would be a contribution of £90,798.34 for "Community": this should go towards highway safety improvements such as a safe crossing of the Portway. There would be £20,319.82 for play equipment and £27,744.37 for maintenance: this should go to replacing and extending play provisions at the recreation ground.

These discussions do not mean there is any change in the parish council's position: we remain opposed to this planning application, for all the reasons set out last month.

# Recreation Ground & Environment Committee

Cllr Mannering has joined the Recreation Ground committee. Charges have been increased for adult football teams. Plans are in hand to develop a basketball area. The children's play area could be improved with the provision of a safety surface instead of bark chippings. The play area is inspected annually by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents.

On 15th February, Scofell will begin planting extra trees in the nature area. Crosscut will carry out work on willow trees near the river at a cost of £520. It is hoped to improve the lighting in the car park. The floodlight is now on a timer and plans are in hand to replace the pavilion's fluorescent lighting with much more efficient LEDs.

#### Traffic and transport committee

A meeting has been held with the police and county councilor about speeding traffic and safe crossing arrangements on the A4074 Portway. Mr Kirkwood of the County Council's road safety team has visited the site since and his report is awaited. The hope is to install a pedestrian crossing controlled by traffic lights, with additional road safety features such as white gates at the entrance to the village, larger speed-indicator signs and if possible more frequent police speed traps.

Cllr Soames reported that the northbound bus shelter in North Stoke is dangerous and needs attention: the access is very muddy and poses a danger to users. Arrow Fencing will be asked to suggest a way to improve the situation quickly. Ideally this bus stop should be re-sited opposite the southbound stop.

#### Queen's birthday celebrations

Celebrations of Her Majesty the Queen's 90th birthday are being planned for the weekend of 11-12 June. Look out for details of local events in Crowmarsh Gifford, Mongewell and North Stoke.

#### Litter blitz

The parish council is organising a litter blitz in Crowmarsh Gifford. For safety reasons, the picking would only be done along the village streets, not the main A4074. Proposed dates are Saturday morning 5th March (part of a national "Clean for the Queen" initiative) and Sunday afternoon 20th March. Volunteers are very welcome and SODC will provide equipment – see notice for details. We hope Cubs and Beavers and possibly the school may be able to help.

#### Street cleaning

Although some street cleaning has been carried out near the bridge, much more is needed, especially in the layby opposite St Mary Magdalene Church and in Cox's Lane and Meadow Lane. Cllr Griffin will contact Biffa again and will ask for the Parish Council to be notified in advance of any cleaning so that residents can be given time to move their vehicles.

#### Report from outside bodies

Cllr Sherbourne, our rep on Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall Committee, reported that the children's Christmas party was a great success. It is planned to make this an annual event.
