

#### Neighbourhood planning

Should Crowmarsh produce a neighbourhood development plan? If so, will you help to make it happen?

A neighbourhood development plan is written by local people, 'made' or adopted by the district council, and becomes part of the development plan that helps to decide planning applications. SODC strongly supports neighbourhood planning to help local people to shape the way their communities grow and develop into the future. They offer grant funding to employ consultants to oversee the process.

However, it would require a lot of volunteer effort for up to two years and the experience of neighbouring parishes has been mixed. Planning applications are expected in the near future on several sites around Crowmarsh Gifford but it's important to understand that a neighbourhood plan must conform to national and district planning policy and is not a means to stop or limit new development. A neighbourhood plan can guide development of the right type in the right place, according to local needs.

There is information and a "toolkit" on the SODC website at www.southoxon.gov.uk/ services-and-advice/planning-and-building/planning-policy/neighbourhood-plans.

The parish council still needs to be convinced that a neighbourhood plan would help Crowmarsh and that there would be enough people committed to carry it through.

Contact the parish council chairman or clerk if you are prepared to take part in a neighbourhood plan group or if you have any views on it. This will be considered at the next parish council meeting.

#### Letter to the Editor

Please be a Responsible Dog Owner

For some time I have been concerned at the amount of dog faeces that is left by dog owners when walking their dogs on footpaths and especially across fields, where for some reason it would seem there is no need to clean the faeces up.

Dog faeces is as high as third on the list of contributors to contamination and may contain parvovirus, whipworms, hookworms, roundworms, threadworms, campylobacteriosis, giardia, and coccidian. Unattended, these parasites will contaminate the water or soil, and can even cause infection in both pets and humans, especially children.

Contrary to popular belief, dog faeces is not a fertilizer and does not provide any benefit to the soil.

Cleaning up after your dog is a legal requirement under the dog fouling act where a fine of up to £1000 can be imposed. So please, be a responsible dog owner, pick up behind you and help keep our streets and countryside clean, especially from unnecessary parasites.

#### **Death of Colonel Charles Roberts**

When we visit Crowmarsh Church or as we just walk past, we give little thought to the headstones in the churchyard, those who are remembered on them or what they achieved in their lives.

To the east of the churchyard is a weathered granite Celtic cross with one name carved into it, that of Colonel Charles Roberts.

Charles Roberts was born in 1843 and had two sisters, Maria and Annie. He was a first cousin of Earl Roberts VC, one of the most successful commanders of the British Army in the 19th century. Charles Roberts joined the 93rd Foot (Black Watch) in 1861, later transferring to the 73rd Foot when it became the 2nd Black Watch.

He saw service in India and Canada and fought the campaigns in Burma and Assam. He also fought in the Afghan War of 1878-80, where he fought under the command of his cousin, General Roberts, and took part in the famous march from Kabul to Kandahar.

On leaving the Army in 1905 he purchased Bridge House in Wallingford. He was a member of the Town Council, and in 1909 became a Justice of the Peace for Berkshire. Although a bachelor he was fond of children and was known to rarely pass a child in the street without stopping to talk to them. He helped form the Boy Scouts movement in Wallingford.

When war broke out in 1914 he was the main force in raising the Wallingford Volunteer Training Corps, and was its Commanding Officer until his death in 1916. In 1915 he was asked by the War Office to train young officers in a camp in the north of Scotland. He drove himself to the camp, a distance of over 600 miles, and spent three months there. But he found the training too arduous at his age of 72 and was forced to return home to Wallingford. His health was broken and he died of bronchitis on 11th April 1916.

His funeral took place on a very wet Sunday on 16th April; it was held on a Sunday to allow the members of the Volunteer Force to attend.

The roads were lined by hundreds of people from Bridge House to Crowmarsh Church. The coffin was followed by his servants from Bridge House and the Wallingford Volunteer Training Corps, a group over 200 strong.

The number of people attending the funeral was so large that they filled the church and churchyard, even spilling into the road outside the church. A volley was fired over the grave, followed by the Last Post, then all the members of the Wallingford Volunteers filed past the grave to pay their last respects.

You may wonder why a man of 72 was given such a strenuous command. His cousin, Field Marshall Roberts, who was Commander in Chief of the Army, died while inspecting Indian troops on 14th November 1914 at St Omar, at the age of 82!

This year, we will be celebrating our Harvest Festival on Sunday 2nd October at St Mary Magdalene (11am). At one time, the majority of Crowmarsh's population would have been farm workers, even long after our most famous resident, Jethro Tull, had invented the seed drill in 1701.

We have historic reminders of past land use in some of our road names, like Howbery Farm and Home Farm, and our village still has an important global contribution to irrigation and farming through the research work of the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology.

Nevertheless, relatively few of us have any direct connection with farming and the world of agriculture. We may enjoy singing 'We plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the land,' but if we actually had to do it, most of us would be lost!

Our connection with the land tends to be more of a hobby for keen gardeners who enjoy the fruit of their labours on an allotment or vegetable patch. I have noticed a bumper crop of apples on the tree in the Vicarage back garden along with a bountiful supply of black-

berries along the river bank – so that's our winter crumble filling sorted.

For all of us, it is good to remember our reliance on the land and our inter-dependence on nature and the world around us - the labels on our food can be used as simple prompts for prayer, as we pray for the country of origin and that no-one has been exploited so that we have the food on our table – the Fair Trade label is a useful guide in this respect.

Whether we are directly involved in food production or not, at the heart of the Harvest celebrations is the recognition that we should all say thank you. Our Harvest Festival is an annual reminder that we offer the fruits of our labour back to God in thanks. The harvest tradition of giving to those in need underlines that the true response of gratitude is generosity – generosity towards those in need and generosity towards God who gives all things. So do not let harvest go by this year without showing that gratitude – and allowing the gratitude to spill over into generosity to others.

# What did Wallingford Castle look like?

For several years Wallingford Museum has displayed a dramatic artist's impression of what Wallingford Castle may have looked like (until it was demolished by Cromwell's orders in 1652!).

However, much documentary research in recent years, together with various archaeological digs has provided an opportunity to re-assess the layout of the Castle.

The overall impression of the size of the castle and many of its features are still valid but the documents have revealed several differences. Here are just a few:

- the main gateways were actually nearer the bridge
- a great drawbridge crossed the moat into the inner bailey which had many more buildings than are shown here
- the Keep was a more dominating feature of the castle
- the arrangement of the water defences was more complex


