## **Past Times**

In the 1960s near Blenheim Farm in Crowmarsh parish, was a bungalow and grounds known as Formakin Training School. It was an animal training centre and was run by Mr. John Holmes and his wife. His animals appeared on the stage, in films and television, and even on the radio.

Mr. Holmes bred and showed corgis. He also wrote several books on dog training claiming that training dogs was easy, but the owners were always more difficult.

His animals also starred in films. He had a black cat who earnt him over £700. A female spaniel named Flush earnt him over £3,000 appearing in films such as The *Barretts of Wimpole Street* in 1934. A Pekinese cat called Mandy appeared in a film called *Kill or Cure* in 1962, while a pair of pet badgers, which John kept in his living room, appeared with Anthony Newley.

## Free Covid-19 Testing kits

To help reduce Covid-19 risks to everyone at school, their families and contacts, the Parish Council would like to highlight and encourage, parents and others in households of school children to use the free twice-weekly home testing kits for those without symptoms.

Home test kits can be delivered to your door, so you can test yourself and your family without leaving your home. You can also get the lateral flow test kits from pharmacies - which would be quicker.

It is understood that 1 in 3 people do not have any symptoms but can still pass it on.

#### To order home test kits online

You can order 1 pack of home test kits containing 7 tests for home delivery. Your tests should arrive within 2 days. For more information go to <a href="https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests">www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</a>.

Do not use a rapid lateral flow test if you have coronavirus symptoms, get a PCR test and self-isolate.

## **Help with long-term Covid**

Over a million people in the UK are suffering from Long Covid, the accepted term for Coronavirus that lasts more than four weeks.

And, sad to say, more than 70,000 people in this country have had Covid symptoms - fatigue, breathlessness, numbness, pain or partial hearing loss - for over a year.

If you are one of those affected, you should know that PIP (personal independence payments) may be available. PIP is financial support for those who have an illness, disability or mental health condition, making it hard for them to do everyday tasks or get around. Income, savings and employment status don't affect your PIP eligibility, and PIP can supplement any other benefits you might be receiving.

## Benson Garden Club

Benson Garden Club's April Zoom talk, 'All things Tomatoes', was given by John Overvoorde from Delfland Nurseries.

Taking the format of a question and answer session, our wide-ranging queries covered the full tomato growing cycle. Amongst other things, we learnt that you should start sowing your tomatoes indoors in mid-February (14th February was given as a memorable date); once the fruit on your tomatoes are the size of peas you can increase the watering regime, but up to that point you should keep them fairly dry; and never water tomatoes on a damp or humid day as it splits the fruit. Companion planting and how to avoid tomato diseases were also covered, and choosing a blight tolerant variety such as "Mountain Magic" or "Crimson Crush" was recommended.

Our next Zoom talk on Thursday 6th May, 'Everything Fuchsia', will be given by Kristopher Harper (7.30pm connect for 7.45pm start).

Back in 2009, Kristopher established the James Lye Fuchsia Collection as a hobby to preserve, research and archive the legacy of James Lye, a Victorian fuchsia hybridiser from Market Lavington in Wiltshire.

This collection was recognised by Plant Heritage as a National Plant Collection in 2012. Due to the popular demand for young plants from the Collection, and enquiries about other fuchsia cultivars, Kristopher went on to establish 'Harper & Debbage' to facilitate the growing and sale of fuchsias.

He has also been a Silver medal winner at the RHS Hampton Court Palace Flower Show for an exhibit of fuchsia. So Kristopher comes with a set of impressive credentials to speak about the fuchsia genus.

### PARENTS AND CHILDREN TOGETHER

Parents And Children Together (PACT) wants people to commit to exercising for 31 days for its Move Every Day in May challenge.

In last year's challenge, a participant hulahooped their way through May and one family used a mixture of online fitness programmes and walking to enjoy the springtime.

One of last year's participants said it was a "Thoroughly enjoyable challenge for a great cause."

All proceeds will be used to help to build and strengthen families through PACT's adoption and adoption support services and its vital community projects Alana House and Bounce Back 4 Kids.

Last year PACT found permanent and loving families for 84 children waiting for adoption while Alana House community project worked with approximately 169 women with multiple disadvantages.

The Bounce Back 4 Kids programme supported 48 children aged five to 11 who have been affected by domestic abuse.

To register for Move Every Day in May costs £15 but participants may choose to raise sponsorship from friends and family.

Children can take part for free along with a registered adult and only pay for a lovely medal (£2.50). All participants will receive a certificate and medal.

#### Allotments

A revised tenancy agreement for the parish council's Botany allotments will be sent to tenants with the invoices for the coming year: there are two names on the waiting list. It was noted that there are six people on the waiting list for the Emery Owen allotments.

### **District Council Report**

South Oxfordshire is second in the table of "top recyclers" across the country, with 64% of household waste being sent for recycling.

South Oxfordshire and the Vale of the White Horse have agreed to develop a joint Local Plan through to about 2040/41, which would mean significant cost savings and makes sense in working together on issues such as the development of Didcot, affordable housing and environmental policies.

Wallingford Medical Centre has advised that they are not interested in moving to the former SODC office site. The parish council will continue to be consulted on uses of this site.

## **Decisions by SODC**

**P20/S3849/HH** 84 The Street, Crowmarsh Gifford. First floor extension on top of ground floor utility room to increase size of bathroom (amended to provide a pitched roof) – Planning Permission.

#### **Consultations**

**P21/S1073/FUL** The Gates, Carmel College, The Ridgeway, A4074. Retention of northern set of gate posts and walls as constructed. The parish council endorsed the conservation officer's view on the brickwork, but otherwise had no strong views.

**P21/S1045/HH** Watersview House, Mongewell Park. Outdoor Swimming Pool. Recommend approval.

**P21/S0526/HH** 7 Meadow Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford OX10 8BH. Replacement of 'ranch style' boundary fence between the property and the highway with a 1.9m high close-board fence to improve sound insulation from the highway and privacy. No objection, subject to protection of trees.

## Discharge of conditions

**P21/S1005/DIS** The Springs Golf Club, Wallingford Road, North Stoke OX10 6BE.

Discharge of conditions 9, 15, 16, 17, 19 & 25 on P20/S1589/FUL. Condition 17 relates to the highway works to connect to the footway along Wallingford Road and does not include a crossing, merely dropped kerbs. As one of the benefits we expected from this development was a pedestrian crossing, the parish council agreed to lodge a strong objection and copy it to Oxfordshire Highways Officer Lee Turner and County Councillor Mark Gray.

#### Neighbourhood plan

The neighbourhood plan is under examination by Andrew Ashcroft, who also examined the Wallingford and Benson plans. He has visited the parish and raised a number of questions, most of which have been answered by making modifications to the text.

The one outstanding question relates to Historic England's concern about the impact of the employment land allocation on the listed buildings at Howbery Park.

This will be addressed by commissioning an expert on listed buildings to write a report: the cost will come out of the remaining grant money from SODC.

#### **Finance**

A donation of £660 was agreed towards grass cutting at North Stoke Church. Expenditure included £684 for grass cutting at Newnham Murren churchyard,

£1,020 for structural design relating to improvements to the pavilion, £235.20 for replacement basin taps at the pavilion and £148.80 for financial software.

### **Environment and recreation**

With government restrictions easing, outdoor sport is permitted and the outdoor gym has reopened. The play area remains very popular. It was agreed to continue using the same contractor to cut the grass in the nature area under a management programme to increase biodiversity.

The Landscape Group has started grass cutting around the parish although a resident has reported one area that has been missed.

Progress is still needed on the plan for surface improvements in Watery Lane, which is a bridleway link to the Ridgeway Path.

Electrical contractors have removed the uneven paving slabs between Mongewell and the A4130 Nosworthy Way underpass and would resurface the path here. There was concern that someone had felled several mature trees and cleared vegetation on land near the underpass.

### **Traffic and transport**

Cllr Johnson expressed concern that speeding motorcycles are a problem again during fine weather and asked that police attend to monitor the situation on Portway.

Bix and Assendon Parish Council had asked Oxfordshire Highways for traffic calming measures to address this and the Clerk will ask what progress has been made. Training for communities on speed cameras is to be introduced. The Clerk will order stickers to promote the '20s plenty for Oxfordshire' campaign.

Oxfordshire Highways Officer Lee Turner will be asked to visit to discuss crossings in The Street, Benson Lane and in North Stoke and implementing parking restrictions at Stephens Field.

Parish Transport Representative Amanda Griffin has responded to the consultation on Oxfordshire's vision for their next Local Transport and Connectivity Plan.

#### **Chilterns Conservation Board**

There is a vacancy for a parish council representative to be elected to the Chilterns Conservation Board. There are three candidates and the parish council has one vote. After discussion it was agreed to vote for Sue Rowland from Rotherfield Peppard (who was subsequently elected).

### Virtual Meetings

Permission to hold council meetings online will end at midnight on Thursday 6th May and central government has refused to extend this, despite requests from NALC and other bodies. In response to the COVID-19 situation, with reference to the government's "roadmap" for easing lockdown, it was agreed that it is not yet safe to hold a physical public meeting indoors.

The council therefore resolved to give the Clerk, Chairman and Vice-Chairman delegated authority to make decisions that cannot reasonably be deferred on behalf of the council, after consulting all councillors by email.

Any decisions made under this delegation will be recorded and published. The delegated authority will end when the first face-to face meeting of the parish council is held, which might not be until July.

#### **Next Meetings**

The Annual Parish Council Meeting to elect a Chairman and Vice Chairman has to be held in May, so there will be a brief online meeting on 4th May for that purpose. Indoor meetings will resume when it is possible to do so safely with members of the public present.


