November brings us to the end of the church year when we not only think back to all that has been in remembrance but also look forward with hope to the future in anticipation of taking our place with the saints who have gone before us to our heavenly home. Everyone is welcome to join us at any of our services, but here is a rough guide of what you may expect.

For anyone who has lost a close friend or relatives, perhaps during COVID when funerals were necessarily quite restricted, the **All Souls'** service gives a chance to honour them by name by lighting a candle in this reflective evening service. Many find this acts as a useful step in their ongoing bereavement process.

For our **Remembrance Sunday** Service this year we again welcome members of the Oxfordshire Home Guard who will parade in honour of all who gave their lives in wartime, and especially Tom Jewitt. He was one of the first Local Defence Volunteers to lose his life as a result of a tragic accident whilst guarding the Cholsey Railway bridge over the Thames. We will rededicate the WW2 memorial now that the spelling of his name has been corrected. Please join us for this and then in church where the service continues.

Our candlelit **Advent Carol Service** followed by mulled wine and mince pies at Newnham, falls on the last Sunday of November. As this church is small and there may be COVID restrictions, let me know if you wish to attend. There is a minimum donation of £3 this year to cover costs and raise money for the Churches Conservation Trust who maintain this lovely church building.

Our **Family Services** are not just for families with children but for singles, couples and people of all ages as we gather as the church family for an informal service of praise and worship. It was wonderful to celebrate a Christening last month and the first Sunday of each month is the ideal service for these. All who are baptised are welcome to receive Holy Communion at our other Sunday morning services, with a blessing available for all who come to Christ.

### Benson Garden Club

From mealy cabbage aphid on broccoli to slugworms on delphiniums and cutworms on raspberry plants, Ray Broughton gave us a live, close-up view at Benson Garden Club's October talk, "Pests and Diseases". Members had been invited to bring along a problem leaf or cutting for Ray's inspection under his microscope, and there was a stack of bags and containers awaiting his attention. He examined each sample in turn and, as his microscope was connected to a screen, the audience could see the enlarged images of the plant structures and the damage they had suffered.

Sometimes the insects were still present and Ray was able to identify these creatures readily (for example, a winged aphid made an appearance). However, what was particularly impressive was Ray's detective work to identify those culprits long gone who had caused plant damage by examining their frass (insect poo) or the shape of the hole they had left (for example, a straight-sided hole suggested a cutworm had been at work). It was not all about pests though – in some cases Ray pinpointed the issue as a root problem or fungus.

By the end of the meeting he had worked his way through our somewhat embarrassingly large collection of plant problems. More importantly, along with the diagnosis, members were given safe treatment suggestions. For example, applying non-toxic sprays, blasting with jets of water and taking preventative action such as feeding hungry plants to reduce their susceptibility to pests. And when it was necessary to cut out affected parts, he stressed the importance of keeping the secateurs clean to avoid crosscontamination (tomato sauce was the suggested cleaning agent).

Our next talk on Thursday 4th November will be given by Martin Cook (7.30pm for 7.45pm start at our temporary venue, the Mill Stream Day Centre in Benson). Titled, "Digging for Gold at the Chelsea Flower Show," medal winner Martin will share with us the processes, highs and lows when building the three gardens he created at Chelsea.

We have a fantastic programme lined up for our members over the coming months and hope to encourage new members to join as well. As always, we welcome visitors to individual events as well. 



# Past Times The Bowdens of Crowmarsh

Charles Bowden came to Crowmarsh from Wallingford around 1868, when he took over the wheelwright business from Charles Clare, whose family had run a wheelwrights business in Crowmarsh since 1750s. John Clare ran the business until his death in 1839, followed by his son Joseph, he was succeeded by his grandson Charles, who bought what was part of Howbery Farm yard which is now occupied by Collier's. In about 1868 Charles Bowden moved to Crowmarsh from Wallingford and took over Clare's business. Clare moved to Marston and continued to have a carpentry business there, in Church Lane.

In October 1890 Charles Bowden was picking apples in his orchard when he lost his footing and fell heavily to the ground. He was a heavily built man and was totally disabled by the fall, he never recovered and he died in September 1891.




Charles Bowden circa 1875

At his father's death, Henry Bowden moved back to Crowmarsh from the High Street, Wallingford and took over, adding coach building to the business. Henry was born in Nettlebed in 1847 and was a keen rower, rowing in the fours for the old Albion Rowing Club in Wallingford. He was a member of the

Baptist Church in Wallingford, where he was superintendent of the Sunday School for almost 50 years. He was a member of Oddfellow's Lodge and was a former chairman of the Parish Council. He once allowed the Primitive Methodists to hold an open air prayer meeting in his yard.

During the 1st World War he applied for exemption from war service for his son Thomas, stating that in 1914 he had employed 20 men, but by 1916 he only had four workers left, and could not afford to lose one more. He was granted six months exemption for Thomas. Henry died in January 1939, aged 90 years. His son Edgar continued the business until his death in 1959.

The Collier brothers bought the premises in 1960 and have run it ever since.

# Coping with Universal Credit shortfall

This year, the month of September ushered in more ominous portents than chilly winds and dark nights: the Government reduced Universal Credit payments by £20 a week. This move could put many floundering people in a critical situation. Rising prices and the coming end of the pandemic furlough have joined other negative trends to put millions in serious debt, unable to pay vital bills and about to see life get even worse.

But, if you are in this position, remember that support and help are available and you need not suffer alone.

Take charge of your situation. Start by making a list of what you owe and add up what you need to pay out each month. This list puts your financial position clearly in front of you in black and white. Next, prioritise your debts. There is advice on the Citizens Advice website to help you do this: <a href="https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money">https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money</a> Some bills are more urgent than others. Rent or mortgage arrears, gas and electricity bills and Council Tax count as priority debts as there could be serious consequences if you don't pay them.

Get in touch with the companies to whom you owe money. Not everybody feels confident about doing this but the organisations expect such calls and they might be able to help by letting you pay smaller amounts over a longer period or even take a temporary payment break.

The government-backed Breathing Space scheme could also give you extra time to pay. See our website for details or <a href="www.gov.uk">www.gov.uk</a> If you are eligible, you could get 60 days during which your creditors can't contact you, take any action against you or add interest and charges to your debt. A Citizens Advice adviser can check your debts to see if they are covered by the scheme.

If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call the Citizens Advice debt helpline on 0800 240 4420. It really helps to make personal contact with somebody who understands. You can also call our Adviceline free on 0808 278 7907 (Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm) or try our webchat (click on "chat with us online about debt").

#### Matters brought forward

Noise from motorcycles: With neighbouring parishes, we are asking John Howell MP to arrange a meeting with the Police and Crime Commissioner, Matthew Barber, who has not replied to our letter, although the MP and the Police Community Support Officer have acknowledged the copies sent to them.

The traffic speed survey close to the crossroads in North Stoke has been completed. The Clerk will send the results to OCC Highways.

Cllr Soames will contact BT to ask that they arrange to repaint the North Stoke telephone box, which is listed and in the conservation area.

Cllrs Griffin and Sherbourne had a site meeting on 16th September with the OCC rights of way officer and the Ridgeway National Trail officer to discuss improvements to Watery Lane. Signs are suggested in and near Wallingford to highlight Watery Lane as the link between the town and the Ridgeway.

#### **County Council matters**

County Councillor Felix Bloomfield was absent, but had sent a report.

OCC take over responsibility for civil on-street parking enforcement from the police from 1st November 2021. They have appointed

Conduent Parking Solutions to provide the Civil Enforcement Officers and the message is 'Observe the lines and avoid the fines'.

Five trials of 20mph zones are under way across Oxfordshire. Communities will be looked at on a case-by-case basis, but the parish council was invited to put forward areas within our parish where we would like to see the new lower speed limit to benefit highway safety.

Councillors agreed that a 20mph speed limit in North Stoke village and in residential roads in Crowmarsh Gifford would be beneficial. It was also considered that The Street in Crowmarsh should be restricted to 20 mph.

Cllr Griffin will be meeting OCC leaders with other parish councils online to discuss their strategic plans as they affect communities like ours.

#### **District Council matters**

As part of the council's Active Communities strategy, the Move Together team has been busy since the project launched in July, helping residents who haven't left their homes during the pandemic, accompanying them on walks and talking about the support available to help them get active again.

The cabinet has approved a policy for planting trees on South Oxfordshire District Council land (see <a href="https://www.southoxon.gov.uk/south-oxfordshire-district-council/planning-and-development/wildlife-trees-and-landscape/trees">https://www.southoxon.gov.uk/south-oxfordshire-district-council/planning-and-development/wildlife-trees-and-landscape/trees</a>). There is also information on tree preservation orders and a guide to planting trees for community groups. Following investigation, tree preservation orders (TPOs) have been reinstated at Lane End. Trees in a conservation area (most of North Stoke village) are also protected, even if not subject to a TPO.

Extraction and processing of sand and gravel including the construction of new site access roads, landscaping and screening bunds, minerals washing plant and other associated infrastructure with restoration to agriculture and nature conservation areas, using inert fill -Recommend refusal: intrusive development having a harmful impact on the River Thames, setting of the listed boathouse and gallery at the former Carmel College, the Chilterns AONB, and the Thames Path national trail. including loss of amenity for users of the river and the Thames Path. Possible hydrological impact on the river and its baseflow, so the Environment Agency must be consulted. This is a repeat of an application already refused by OCC for the same extraction plus a marina.

#### Neighbourhood plan

The Neighbourhood Plan was 'made' at the Referendum on 2nd September. From that date we became eligible for 25% of all CIL

funding from new housing developments. Full Council of SODC voted to keep our Neighbourhood Plan as part of their Local Plan at their meeting on 7th October.

A copy of the made version of the Neighbourhood Plan will be available on both the SODC and Crowmarsh Parish Council web sites once the final editorial checks are agreed and signed off. A hard copy of the made plan will be lodged for public inspection at a location yet to be announced.

#### **Finance**

A donation of £250 was agreed to Home Start South Oxfordshire, who support local families.

Payments in October included purchase of a new cooker for the pavilion, £480 for the internal audit, £1680 for remedial work on the horse chestnut tree at the entrance to Thames Mead, £3255 consultation fee for double yellow lines at Stephens Field and £4259.52 for new LED floodlights for the tennis courts.

#### **Environment and recreation**

CCTV installation has been completed at the pavilion. Installation of the final camera had been delayed while an asbestos survey was carried out but no asbestos had been found. The new LED lighting on the hard court area is a great improvement.

The horse chestnut tree at the end of Thames Mead has been pruned and stabilised as agreed. Cllr Sherbourne will obtain a sack of daffodil bulbs from Grundons as in previous years. Tree planting on the riverside meadows should go ahead this year and a meeting is planned with the Earth Trust and the Wallingford Wildlife Group.

Details were discussed of the proposed community lunch on Sunday 5th June 2022 to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

#### **Traffic and transport**

Two residents will be joining the Traffic and Transport Committee, which is currently working mainly on motorcycle noise, speed

management and pedestrian safety.

Civil parking enforcement will be introduced from 1st November (see County Council section). The double yellow lines will be removed from the lay-by opposite The Bell at the request of the residents so it can be used for parking.
