

Oxfordshire County Council looks for £50m savings

Oxfordshire County Council has launched a public consultation on options for saving money. It has already saved or has firm plans to save nearly £300m since 2010 but believes it needs to find another £50m of savings over the next four years. "The government is rightly reducing public spending to tackle the national budget deficit, which means we have to make some difficult decisions about council services," says council leader, Cllr Ian Hudspeth.

As well as receiving less money from government, the council faces rising demand for services – particularly for vulnerable adults and children at risk of abuse and neglect. Already about half its budget is spent on 2% of the population of Oxfordshire, and that proportion is set to rise to three-quarters of the total budget as a result of a growing aging population.

The council is consulting the public before taking the decisions and delivering a balanced budget on 16th February 2016. Talking Oxfordshire, the council's budget consultation, started on 20th October, when all the savings options were published on the council's website. It will close on 30th November.

There will be three public events with an independent chair alongside the leader and chief finance officer to provide residents with a chance to find out about the council's budget position and have their say. Comments will be collated as part of the feedback process.

The events are 7-8.30pm and remaining dates are:

- 2nd November Banbury Town Hall
- 5th November Regal Centre, Wallingford

Hard copies of the budget consultation documents will also be available in every library.

Past Times from David Beasley

The Crowmarsh Riots of 1824

The Quarter Sessions held for the borough of Wallingford, before Job Wells Mayor of Wallingford, Charles Peers and four other Borough Justices, on Thursday 13th January 1825, started at eleven in the morning and didn't close until ten o'clock that night. Only one case was heard.

Most of the prisoners were men from Crowmarsh. The young men (described as dissolute and depraved) had for some time each night visited Wallingford and caused a disturbance of the peace by the violence of their behaviour. After nearly two weeks of flouting the law, they were arrested, and all were found guilty.

Charles Crook and Richard Messenger were convicted of stealing money from the Wallingford Bridge Toll House. Crook was sentenced to seven years' transportation to Australia. Messenger was sentenced to three months' hard labour in Reading Gaol, also to be whipped once (it was his first offence). Crook was only 16 years of age, but a hardened criminal who had been convicted and imprisoned several times.

John Marks and John Prince were both convicted of stealing a sack of barley, from William Toovey, of Newnham Murren, to whom Marks was a servant. Marks was sentenced to six months' hard labour in Reading Gaol and Prince to three months' hard labour. John Cooper was charged with stealing John Child's hat, and sentenced to one month's hard labour.

Robert Francis, Charles Blissett, Caleb Wheeler, Richard Scudds and Gabriel

Seymour were all charged with assault and riotous behaviour. They received sentences ranging from six to three months, all with hard labour.

The riot committed by the above and over 100 other young men from Crowmarsh and surrounding villages occurred on the night of 5th November 1824. A Wallingford farmer and three of his servants were harvesting his haulm (bean or grass stalks) when they were assaulted with folds, stakes and stones and badly injured. A constable who tried to stop the riot was also injured. A number of windows were broken at the farmer's house by the mob.

The Mayor hoped by sentencing the ring leaders so severely it would deter the rest from causing trouble again. This seems to have been successful as there was little trouble over the next year.

Charles Crook (born 1809) was transported to Australia along with 147 others on the convict ship, *England*. He sailed on 26th April 1826 and reached New South Wales on 18th September. He was issued with his Certificate of Freedom in January 1832 before settling in a town called Bathurst, New South Wales. There he married Mary Ann Smith in June 1835.

The couple raised eight children, and it seems Charles never forgot his family in England, as all his children were named after his brothers and sisters. After finding work on a farm he made enough money to buy a farm of his own. He died in January 1883, in the Australian town of Orange, New South Wales, having never returned to the land of his birth.

In 1590 Queen Elizabeth I appointed Thomas Bodley as Head. In 1602, the much improved Library re-opened in its existing building. It now holds over 12 million books, and is one of our greatest institutions.



District Councillor's Report

Our Country Pubs

Many of our village pubs have closed in recent years for a variety of reasons. The village pub is more than just a boozer - it's an important part of the community; it's a meeting place for neighbours, our local restaurant or shop and some have even served as a Post Office.

We need to protect our rural pubs. Recently, we've had a number of planning applications to turn village pubs into other things, like houses or flats. Where appropriate we have refused those applications. Three applicants have recently appealed against our decisions to refuse their applications at The Lamb at Satwell, The Crown at Nuffield and The White Lion at Crays Pond. I'm happy to report that each time, the government's planning inspector has backed our original decision to refuse the application.

We support the need for more houses in the district, but we're very clear that this should not come at the expense of the community facilities that make our villages home.

Capital Grants

You can apply to us for a minimum of £1,000 and up to 50 per cent of the cost of a project for non-profit organisations or if you have a project that is going to benefit our residents.

We have a guide to help you work out if your project is capital or not, but as a general rule if it's to improve, completely replace or create a new facility it's probably capital. However, we don't fund vehicle purchases.

Elderly and Vulnerable Neighbours

Winter is fast approaching and cold weather on its way so please check on elderly relatives and those living alone. Find out if they are keeping warm and ask if they need anything, especially when it's difficult to get out in adverse weather. Mill Stream Day Centre in Benson is a registered charity and its objectives are to give relief to elderly and handicapped people within the areas of Benson, Ewelme, Berrick Salome, Roke and Crowmarsh. It provides general charitable services and is run by a friendly team of volunteers. Tea, coffee, lunch and activities including exercise classes, card playing, bingo, and fortnightly films are all provided and free (except lunch which is £4). Do you know someone who would enjoy a visit perhaps once or twice a week? Or maybe you would like to find out more about helping with volunteering or fund raising. You will be very welcome.

Funding Available For Rural Businesses

In just four years Southern Oxfordshire LEADER Project handed out more than £1.2 million to projects aimed at supporting the rural economy. We've now set up an Oxfordshire wide LEADER Scheme with £1.5 million on offer for rural projects until 2020. We're looking for rural businesses, farmers, foresters or communities with projects that fit one or more of these themes: growing, selling, eating more local food; vibrant villages; reviving the River Thames and associated waterways; unlocking the potential of woodland.

There was no County Council or District Council report

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Access path from The Street to Bellamy Way: After a check of the County Council Rights of Way map and further checks and discussion with the freeholder it was agreed that there is a public right of access to neighbouring properties.

Grass Cutting: the Crowmarsh Hill end of the footpath to Park View is still not being cut. Scofell will be reminded that this should have been added to the specification in July. The Cubs will help to plant flower tubs and Grundons will supply a sack of bulbs.

We are still awaiting a response from the SODC Waste Team about proposed new dog waste and litter bins.

Finance

Payments were approved. Income and expenditure were slightly lower than the budget. The fact that SODC is no longer in the village has contributed to a slight drop in pavilion and recreation ground income. The Tennis Club

has moved to Benson.

The Parish Council's financial regulations were reviewed and approved with minor amendments. The Financial Risk Assessment was reviewed and approved. The council's insurance policy has been renewed. Insurance will be reviewed at the November meeting.

Roles and responsibilities

The Parish Council currently has two subcommittees: Recreation & Environment (chaired by Cllr Johnson) and Traffic & Transport (led by Cllr Jones as our Parish Transport Rep).

Cllr Mannering will join Cllrs Johnson, Soames and Griffin on the Recreation Ground & Environment Committee. Cllrs Sherbourne and Sharp will join the Traffic & Transport committee.

Cllr Mannering is our representative on the Thames River Users Group (RUG3).

Cllr Soames is the representative on the North Stoke Village Hall committee and Cllr Sherbourne on the Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall committee.

Cllr Johnson and Mr John Bellamy are the Parish Council representatives on the Emery Owen Charity. Sean Clayton-Chance is the contact for the Emery Owen Trust allotments. Mr Bellamy also represents Crowmarsh Parish Council on the Wallingford Bridge Estate Charity.

Cllr Jones leads on our emergency plan, which needs a review now that SODC is not available as a place of refuge. Cllr Hermsen will take over from Cllr Jones as our rural broadband champion.

Telecommunications (for information only)

Two new Telecommunications Cabinets are planned, adjacent to No. 1 Thames Mead, Crowmarsh Gifford and The Street, and adjacent to No. 1 Old Reading Road, Crowmarsh Gifford, as part of BT Openreach's expansion of broadband accessibility and the government's Digital Britain policy.

Recreation Ground & Environment committee

The committee met on 28th September. A report on the play area has been submitted by RoSPA: the necessary action has been completed.

Following a complaint made by a resident, an extra fence will be erected behind the cricket net. Two lights in the car park have been replaced.

A tree survey has been carried out on the riverside trees and the results are awaited. It is hoped that some tree planting can be carried out in the nature area. Scofell are willing to do this and have also sprayed the nettles.

The committee is considering provision of a basketball practice area: this is being researched. Oxfordshire Playing Fields Association guidance states that the basketball net must be at least 20 metres from the nearest house.

Excavation has taken place on the south side of Wallingford Bridge as flood compensation for the new access road from Stephen's Field to the riverside park. Work has not yet started on the road.

The deadline for participating in the OCC consultation on the household waste and recycling centres is 5th October. The proposals are to cut sites from the current seven to three or four. The Oakley Wood site is vulnerable to being cut. Councillors were encouraged to respond and an article has

been published in Crowmarsh News.

Traffic and Transport committee

Cllr Jones has responded to the consultation on bus subsidies. Cllr Gray is looking into a possible replacement for the Dial a Ride service. This will be discussed further at a future meeting. The Chairman has written to the police about traffic problems and a reply is awaited.

Additional items to be discussed at the next meeting

- Concern was expressed about possible asbestos exposure at the SODC offices and a possible increase in vermin. The Clerk will email District Councillor Pullen and enquire whether there is any further news about the future of the building.
- Cllr Hermsen suggested that space could be made available on the website or Facebook page for residents to report incidents of burglary. He will speak to Cllr Stevenson about this.
- A tree survey is needed of the ash tree at Howbery Farm. Cllr Johnson will inform Cllr Griffin of the cost of the recent tree survey.
