

Go Ride Service 134

The future of your local bus service

Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) have just notified that Go Ride CIC have been awarded a three month contract to continue the existing 134 Wallingford - Crowmarsh - The Stokes - Goring subsidised bus service from 1st October until 31st December, with a possible extension of a further three months until 31st March next year.

OCC has just finished a public consultation on two cost saving options for subsidised bus services in the County:

- Either A completely stop all subsidies, thus leaving bus companies only operating commercial services
- Or B cut the existing overall subsidy by more than half, thus dramatically reducing current subsidised services or even eliminating some totally.

In November OCC's Cabinet will make a decision about which of the above options to implement and when to do this. Therefore whatever way you look at it, the news for our local service is bleak.

Your Parish Council, and each of the other Town and Parish councils on the route of the 134, has submitted its views to OCC's consultation, identifying that the 134 is a lifeline for many residents - young and old alike. This input may help a little to retain some semblance of a reasonable service and/or timetable if option B is chosen.

If option A is chosen – the outlook is grim. However, representatives of Wallingford Town Council, and Crowmarsh, South Stoke and Goring Parish Councils are working together to try and establish a plan as to how they could continue to provide a service in the event of OCC choosing this doomsday option.

The defibrillators in Crowmarsh – a reminder

There are two defibrillators in the village. They are located at the entrance to the village hall and at the entrance to the pavilion.

In the event of a suspected cardiac arrest, dial 999 in the normal way. If there is more than one person with the patient and the patient appears not to have a pulse, ask the ambulance controller for the code for the nearest defibrillator. Remember to take your mobile phone with you when you go to collect the defibrillator.

The machines themselves are fully automatic, so all you have to do is press a button and attach the pads to the person's torso as shown. The machine will assess the patient and only administer a discharge if appropriate. The machine will continue to monitor the patient until the ambulance arrives.

Past Times from David Beasley

Peace Celebrations in Crowmarsh, November 1918

There were celebrations for the end of what the *Berks and Oxon Advertiser* called "the German frightfulness" in Wallingford on 13th November 1918. Crowmarsh, not to be outdone, held their own celebration on the following Saturday evening, in the river meadow at the south side of the bridge.

It was a bright moonlit night but very cold, although this did not stop large crowds from the neighbourhood as well as Crowmarsh from turning out to express their joy at the return of peace.

In a very short time, Frank Wilder wrote a humorous programme for the evening. The organising Committee was raised on Thursday afternoon and consisted of Mr Clarence Dodd (who was also the MC), Messrs Walter Percy and Frank Wilder, Henry Bowden, Macfarlane (gardener at Howbery Park), Rogers, Cook and Calderbank.

The rather macabre programme commenced with the hanging of the Kaiser, the Crown Prince, and Von Tirpitz. The hanging took

place from a scaffold erected on an old wagon. After the hanging a large barrel of tar that had been placed beneath the wagon bearing the gallows was set alight. The effigy of "Little Willie" was soon consumed by the flames but "Big Willie" (The Kaiser) and Von Tirpitz took some time to be cremated. The cheering as the effigies were burnt was thought to be heard all over Wallingford.

The fire was stocked up and an ox was roasted, arranged by Mrs Walter Wilder. All visitors were asked to bring their own knife, fork and plate. Unfortunately the fire was so large that the ox was consumed by the fire so none was available to be served that night!

The fact that everyone went hungry didn't seem to dampen their spirits. The Volunteer Band played well into the night, rockets were fired throughout the night, and many villagers didn't return home until 2am, happy but hungry.

There was a collection for two wounded men from Crowmarsh, which raised £2-10s.

If it hadn't been for the advocate being there and stepping in, I think I might



have ended up having completely the wrong type of treatment for me."

Writer and historian Tony Hadland, based in Oxfordshire, returns to The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) with a further talk ... "What my DNA test told me!"

After years of wondering whether it was worth-while, Tony took a comprehensive DNA test. His aim was to prove (or disprove) a family tradition that his great-grandmother, Mildred Gill, was of Spanish descent. The test confirmed a cover-up going back several generations, but also threw up fascinating information about his Oxfordshire agricultural labourer ancestors, possibly linking them to the spread of agriculture from the Fertile Crescent.

Tony is a Fellow of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors; a historian specialising in local, family, recusant and cycle history; honorary president of the Moulton Bicycle Club; and chairman of the Oxfordshire Local History Association.

He has made numerous appearances on radio, particularly in recent years on BBC Radio Oxford, and has also appeared in documentary films and on regional TV.

... and Castles of the Thames Valley: new research Conference

The most recent research on Wallingford's history will be made public at this sixth conference organised by The Wallingford Historical and Archaeological Society (TWHAS) in conjunction with Wallingford Museum.

The last eight years have seen major advances in understanding the importance of Wallingford's role as a royal Saxon and Medieval stronghold. TWHAS has undertaken new documentary research, as well as being actively involved in the Burh to Borough Project, led by the Universities of Leicester, Exeter and Oxford, including taking over completion of the project's Urban Test Pitting programme. A new publication with the latest research will be available at the conference: Wallingford: the Castle and Town in Context.

The latest documentary work has finally revealed Wallingford Castle in its rightful place among the great royal castles of the Thames Valley, so TWHAS are delighted to have brought together a group of eminent speakers, each of whom has been involved in new research concerning these significant royal strongholds.

The conference will be held at the Methodist Church Centre, St Leonard's Square, Wallingford on Saturday 24 October, from 9.45am to 5pm. For anyone wishing to visit the site of Wallingford Castle there will be a brief guided tour led by Judy Dewey.


The event's cost is £30 per person – this includes a buffet lunch, and refreshments during the day.

Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting

Access from The Street to Bellamy Way will be discussed again at the next meeting. A reply to the Parish Council's letter had been received from Lister Wilder to say that landscaping work will be carried out in December.

Grass Cutting: Cllr Hannigan would contact Scofell about areas that had not been cut recently. Cllr Sherbourne was thanked for his plans to replant flower tubs. It was agreed to purchase violas and compost and to review in the spring. Volunteers would be needed to move and plant the tubs.

Cllr Hermsen would help to make the Crowmarsh News into a smaller file for posting on the website.

Finance

Payments were approved; income and expenditure were broadly in line with budget. The financial risk assessment and financial regulations will be reviewed at the next meeting.

A grant of £3,300 was agreed to North Stoke Village Hall to pay the full cost of a new boiler, on condition that this does not set a precedent for future applications.

St Mary Magdalene Church in Crowmarsh Gifford requested a grant towards a new notice board: a grant of £500 was agreed.

Oxfordshire Minerals and Waste Local Plan: Part 1 – Core Strategy. Consultation on Proposed Submission Document, August 2015

Oxfordshire County Council proposed to submit the Minerals and Waste Local Plan Core Strategy to the Secretary of State for independent examination. First they must publish the Core Strategy for a further round of consultation, so it published the proposed submission document and other documents on 19th August. The period for making representations ran for 6 weeks from 19th August to 30th September. The Core Strategy is available on the Council's website at: http://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/cms/content/minerals-and-waste-core-strategy.

Correspondence

Household waste recycling centres strategy: consultation is under way with the aim of saving £350,000. It is proposed to reduce the number of recycling centres to three or four and cut the opening hours of the remaining centres. There will probably be only one site to the south of Oxford. The consultation runs until 5th October. It was agreed that this potential loss of amenity should be publicised in order to encourage residents to comment. County and District Councillors will also be making representations on this issue.

Sue Ryder requested a link on the Crowmarsh website to some of their events. It was agreed to put their address on the website but this would not set a precedent for future charity requests.

CABI asked to make a presentation to the Parish Council at their October meeting. Councillors agreed to a presentation on the proposals once a planning application has been submitted.

County Council report

County Councillor Gray reported that the Dial a Ride service is to be cut. It is hoped to replace it locally with a community vehicle which could be adapted for wheelchairs and

driven by volunteers. Cllr Jones suggested that it would be sensible to work with the Wallingford Volunteer Centre. The county council may be able to make some funding available if town and parish councils are also willing to contribute. Cllr Sherbourne suggested there might be local company sponsorship.

Cllr Gray reported that the reduction in children's centres will be going out to consultation: this will be a major topic for County Council discussion.

District Council report

District Councillor Pullen reported that discussions are still taking place with the council's insurers about the future of the SODC offices in Crowmarsh. Kerbside collections of small electrical items and textiles are to be introduced from next week. Didcot shopping centre is to be expanded with some more retail units. A directory of local charities is being compiled by Oxfordshire Community Voluntary Action. SODC are monitoring Avalon Kennels for noise.

Reports from outside bodies

Cllr Mannering volunteered to represent the Council on the River Users' Group 3 (RUG3). The RUG3 minutes are on their website at http://www.riverusergroups.org.uk/sandford-to-cleeve.php.

Additional items to be discussed at the next meeting

Progress on new litter and dog bins, with additional suggestions from councillors. The Clerk will circulate a map showing the location of dog bins and winter salt/grit bins.
