South Oxfordshire District Council elections on Thursday 4th May

On Thursday 4 May, residents will go to the polls to choose local councillors who will make decisions on important issues, such as where we should focus our efforts locally to help tackle climate change, where and how new housing gets built, how we ensure there's enough affordable housing, and much more.

Important: To vote at a polling station on 4th May, you must bring valid photo ID with you. This is a new Government requirement. Find out what ID you can use on the SODC website or at electoralcommission.org.

In Benson and Crowmarsh ward we can vote for two candidates. The candidates for these two seats are:

- Cooper, Sue (Liberal Democrats)
- Flux, Gary John (Conservative Party)
- Powell, Andrea Jane (Green Party)

Parish Council elections

There is no Parish Council election on 4th May. The nine parish councillors elected without a contest are: John Griffin, Andrew Johnson, Andrew Nesbitt, Julian Park, David Rowley, Elizabeth Ryall, Stephen Sherbourne, Fleur Stevenson and Julia Streete.

There are still three vacancies on the Parish Council as no nominations were received for North Stoke and Mongewell ward. This means the Parish Council can co-opt people to these places, so if you are interested — especially if you live in North Stoke or Mongewell — please contact the parish clerk (details on page 11).

Past Times from David Beasley The Hiltons of Mongewell

Cecil Henry Hilton (pictured below) was born in 1894, the son of Henry and Ellen Hilton of Mongewell. Henry Hilton and Charles Anderson from North Stoke were both gardeners at Mongewell House, and they each lost two sons in the Great War.

Cecil lived at Lakeside Cottage on the banks of the large lake in Mongewell, along with his three brothers, Harold, Ernest and Herbert, and their sister Rosie. In 1901, Rosie was a teacher helper at North Stoke School and later became a teacher there.

Cecil joined the North Somerset Yeomanry around 1912 and served in the 1st Battalion of that regiment. He was with them when they went to France in late 1914. On 11th July 1916, his regiment attacked Trones Wood, where Cecil was severely wounded, and he later died from his wounds. He is buried at Meaulte Cemetery in France (see opposite).

Cecil's brother Harold (Henry's eldest son) who was born in 1891 worked as a gardener in Westbury, Wiltshire. He joined the Wiltshire Regiment and fought in Egypt, where he was killed in action on 10th April 1918. Both brothers' names are remembered on their father's headstone in Newnham Murren churchyard.

The Vicar writes ...

May 2023 brings a significant historic moment in our nation's history as King Charles III is crowned in a ceremony that will be remembered for generations to come, drawing crowds from around the world as well as dignitaries and other world leaders. Most of us will be glued to the TV, although others will want to experience the atmosphere first hand. Indeed, my wife Lesley-Anne will be there as one of the volunteer Street Pastors! I'll be active ringing bells at Wallingford and Brightwell and we will have a very special celebratory Family Service on the Sunday.

There is something about the tradition and place that transcend our usual eras of time: Westminster Abbey has hosted every coronation since William the Conqueror in 1066, despite the Reformation, the Civil War, Agricultural and Industrial Revolutions that have transformed almost every other area of our society. Indeed, the most ancient tradition of anointing with oil dates back to the first kings of Israel around 1000 years before Christ, who Christians understand as the fulfilment of that line as the Messiah, "the anointed one", and our permanent King under whom King Charles will reign (hence the cross on top of St Edward's crown).

But institutions also adapt to survive and this coronation will blend tradition with modernity, with various elements of the ceremony updated to reflect the changing times, such as the inclusion of more diverse voices and perspectives. There will be prayers and blessings in different languages, reflecting the multicultural nature of modern-day Britain.

The coronation of King Charles III will be a time for reflection and celebration. It is an opportunity to honour the legacy of Queen Elizabeth II, who had seemed to be a constant presence in the lives of many people. It is also a time to look to the future, and to embrace the new era that King Charles III's reign will bring. We pray that it will be a time of celebration, unity, and hope for the future of our country.

Road closures

Regular travellers will already know that Oxford's Botley Road is closed until the end of October (and again between March and October 2024) while the railway bridge is demolished and replaced as part of Network Rail's £161 million investment in expanding Oxford station, with a new platform and western entrance, and an improved and safer road layout for buses, cyclists and pedestrians.

Closer to home, the road works at Benson to install a light-controlled crossing on the A4074 are scheduled to be completed by 19th May.

Benson Garden Club

Benson Garden Club's talk on 30th March was given by Michael Holland, a writer, lecturer and author with a 25-year career at the renowned Chelsea Physic Garden in London.

From his series of talks, "Tales from the Fruit Bowl", the one he gave to us was titled "Saucy & Spicy" and focused on the Solanaceae (nightshade) plant family. Comprising around 2,300 species, the Solanaceae family is found on all continents except Antarctica and covers a wide diversity of plants, from petunias and tomatoes to peppers and deadly nightshade.

Whilst some of these plants are very poisonous, many have become dietary staples, such as the potato, which was originally from South America and has been cultivated for around 2,500 years.

We learnt a host of surprising facts. The tomato's Latin name translates as "edible wolf peach", suggesting something to be wary of eating, but by the end of the 16th century they were known as love apples. Green bell peppers, from the genus Capsicum, are simply less ripe and less sweet than the red, orange or yellow versions that they will ripen into. While the Scoville scale, invented in 1912 to measure the heat of chillies, is familiar to many food lovers, perhaps less well known is that the hottest part of a chilli is the white flesh, not the seeds. And deadly nightshade, which is extremely toxic when eaten, is also used for medicinal purposes.

We have now finished our series of speakers, and will re-start in October, with our first one by Charles Dowding on the "No Dig" method.



Parish council notes

Crowmarsh Parish Council met at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 6th April. Present: Councillors John Griffin (Chair), Stephen Sherbourne, Julian Park, Stuart Soames, David Rowley, Julia Streete and David Topliss, plus Parish Clerk Sue Rance and District Councillor Andrea Powell.

Finance

Payments agreed included monthly salaries and expenses, dog bin emptying, refuse collection, allotments insurance, church floodlighting and £504.00 to the contractors Ashburton for the initial grass cut, including Newnham Murren churchyard.

A grant was made to North Stoke Parochial Church Council of £900 towards the cost of grass cutting at North Stoke Church and the adjoining pound.

The parish council approved the lowest quote, from SCM, to replace the guttering and downpipes at the Pavilion with black coated aluminium at a cost of £16,000.

Two companies have submitted quotes for a new pedestrian crossing near the Bell and these will be considered at the May meeting.

Major application

Reserved matters applications are expected soon on the Newnham Manor site. A detailed layout and design for the proposed 'school land' off Old Reading Road has been submitted as part of pre-application discussions with SODC planners.

District Councillor Powell will make further enquiries about parish council representation on the management committee for the development.

District Councillors' report

District Councillor Andrea Powell presented the report, which had been circulated.

A climate emergency action plan is being drawn up.

South Oxfordshire was again second in the country for recycling in 2021-2022.

A pilot electric car club scheme is starting in Wallingford and other Oxfordshire towns. The

parish council also hopes to participate in a scheme to provide public EV charging points locally.

Thames Valley Probation Service is running a Community Payback Scheme where offenders do unpaid work including graffiti removal, refurbishing parks and playgrounds, painting and decorating community buildings, and clearing rubbish. It aims to combine a strong punishment with changing offenders' behaviour and making amends to the community. SODC's Community Safety team is interested to hear of any projects that may benefit from this type of work.

There was no report from the county councillor.

Environment and recreation

Cllr Rowley gave an update on the pavilion project. The contractor, SCM, had been taken over, but it was hoped that this will not seriously affect completion of the project. There is still some engineering work required to the balustrade on the external ramp.

Representatives of the three main funding bodies, SODC, FCC and the Parish Council, will be invited to perform an official opening on Saturday 17th June. Refreshments will be served from the new servery and Mr David Beasley will present an exhibition of historic Crowmarsh photos in the main hall.

Cllr Rowley will consult the Environment and Recreation Ground Committee about the need for additional dog waste bins. Cllr Soames reported that an additional bin is needed in North Stoke.

Traffic and transport

The Chairman had an unexpected telephone call from the outgoing Chief Constable, but it was felt that this was not an appropriate response to the council's concerns about speeding and motorcycle noise. Sadly, a further accident had occurred on the A4074 recently and a pedestrian had died. A further strong letter will be sent to Thames Valley Police and copied to neighbouring parish councils. Cllr Sherbourne is circulating information about Community Speedwatch.

The Sunday Thames Travel buses to Oxford and Reading are to be cut back to an hourly

service. There is currently a reduced adult fare of £2 for any single journey until the end of June and residents are encouraged to use the buses whenever they can.

Local elections

District Council elections will be held on Thursday 4th May. There are four candidates for the two vacancies. Note that photo ID will be required when voting at a polling station. [See page 3]

There will be no parish council election on 4th May since exactly nine nominations were received for Crowmarsh Ward, equalling the number of places.

No nominations were received for North Stoke Ward, which also includes Mongewell, but the parish council can co-opt people to fill these three seats at the 11th May meeting. Please contact the parish clerk if you are interested in being considered.

We thank Cllr Stuart Soames who is standing down from the council for his long service representing North Stoke.

Next meeting

The next parish council meeting will be the Annual Parish Council Meeting, at which the chair and vice-chair are elected. This will be held on Thursday 11th May 2023 at North Stoke Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. Grant requests and co-options to the council will be considered at this meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting for all electors will be held on Thursday 18th May 2023 at Crowmarsh Pavilion, starting at 7.00pm – everyone is welcome to come and hear reports and to ask questions of your parish, district and county councils.

Pavilion grand opening

The grand opening of Crowmarsh recreation ground pavilion's new facilities will take place on Saturday 17th June at 10.30am.

The Parish Council's Environment and Recreation Committee has been working for 12 months with builders SCM and project architect Michael Simpson to redevelop the north-eastern part of the Pavilion.

The improvements include new public toilets, accessible from outside, a small drinks and food servery opening onto a paved and landscaped outdoor dining terrace with new benches, an outdoor table tennis table and, inside the pavilion, a new small meeting room.

We are particularly proud of the disabled toilet and baby-changing facility, which can be accessed from the new outdoor terrace via a gently sloping ramp. See the graphic below.

The project received an award of £73,016 from SODC's capital grants programme and £67,238 from the FCC Communities Foundation, which gives grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund, as well as £75,000 plus contingency from Crowmarsh Parish Council.

At the grand opening on 17th June, there will also be a special exhibition of historic village photographs in the main hall, kindly brought together by local historian David Beasley, author of our regular Past Times column.

North Stoke open gardens

On Sunday 11th June, from 2.00pm to 6.00pm, several residents in North Stoke have kindly offered to open their gardens to the public. They include some particularly large gardens with river frontages, two that border the springfed lake, and some interesting cottage or more modern gardens with delights to discover.

There will be an opportunity to meet the owners, to ask questions about plants, wildlife and the village, before relaxing with tea and cake in the Village Hall. There will be plants on sale, and if time permits, a visit to our historic village church may be an added interest.

Cost: £6 on the day, cash or card (children under 14 free), tea and cake £3. All proceeds will go to the upkeep of our beautiful, historic Village Hall, which dates from 1911.
