New zebra crossing

Thank you for your patience while the traffic lights were in place for the construction of our new pedestrian crossing in The Street. The parish council funded this, including the resurfacing of the road, and we hope that it will help to make life safer for everyone in the village, including children going to school.

Along with the recent pavilion improvements, this crossing has been paid for to a large extent out of the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) that the parish council receives from every new house built in the parish.

New 20mph speed limit

You will have noticed "20" signs appearing in Crowmarsh Gifford and North Stoke. Where the speed limit used to be 30 it is now 20mph.

This is being implemented by Oxfordshire County Highways at the parish council's request on all the residential streets in Crowmarsh Gifford and North Stoke and is another measure to improve safety, but we are also looking into more physical measures.

Community Speed Watch

There is now a Crowmarsh Community Speed Watch group. The intention is to monitor the speeds of traffic at set locations within the parish, with particular focus on motorcycles and other noisy high performance vehicles.

People driving at excessive speeds or behaving in a dangerous and anti-social manner will have their vehicle details recorded and submitted to Thames Valley Police, who will decide the most appropriate way to deal with those responsible.

There are currently three approved sites where the CSW team will operate. All are on main roads where there is a 30mph speed limit. One is on the A4130 Henley Road and two are on the A4074 Portway. Additional sites can be added with the police's approval.

If you are interested in joining the CSW team we would welcome more volunteers. Please contact the Parish Clerk (email crowmarshparishclerk@gmail.com) if you are interested, or if you can suggest additional sites within the Parish where there are particular problems with speeding vehicles.

BunkFest weekend, 1st to 3rd September

Museum opening hours have been extended during the BunkFest, and on Sunday 3rd September the museum is offering a free special guided walk around the town, starting at 11am from the Museum. No booking is necessary but donations are welcome.

Agatha Christie weekend, 8th to 10th September

Wallingford Museum is fully involved in the Agatha Christie weekend and has a special exhibition 'At Home with the Queen of Crime' that takes you behind the scenes to Agatha's home life, featuring photographs of her at Winterbrook House and memories of local people who met her. Read her handwritten letters revealing her love of pantomimes and her gradual frustration as her health declined.

Special opening hours for the weekend: Friday 8th 2– 5pm, Saturday 9th 10.30–12.30 invited guests only, 12.30– 5pm open to all. Sunday 10th: 9.30 –10.00 for guided walk sales. Open to the public 10am– 5pm.

On Saturday at 2.30pm and on Sunday at 10am and 2pm there will be a guided walk of Christie's Wallingford lasting about 1½ hours. The expert guides will help you discover the

town as it would have been when 'Mrs Mallowan' lived and shopped here between 1934 and 1976, and how it later became the 'Causton' of Midsomer Murders. Beginning at the Museum in the High Street it leads through the town as far as Winterbrook House to glimpse Agatha's home from outside. (Anyone wishing to continue the Agatha Christie trail to Cholsey will be given directions). The walk returns to the Market Place, detouring along the Saxon fortifications for those who wish to explore a little farther. £10 per person. Booking advised at www.wallingfordmuseum.org.uk but pay at the museum on the day (card or cash).

On Saturday 9th at 19.30 in the 'Who Dunnit' challenge you can use clues to find your way around the museum's nooks, crannies and exhibits, and learn more about Agatha Christie while detecting the answers that will solve the murder! Booking essential on the museum website: £5 for adults and children over 12.

House detectives: history behind the door

The museum's 2023 exhibition is proving popular. The houses in this exhibition have been chosen to reflect the changing development and use of houses in Wallingford, from the mediaeval period to the 20th century. On your journey through the museum you will discover how we became house detectives and how you could become one too!

Past Times from David Beasley

The Tale of the Sleepy Dog

On the night of 13th December 1852, Crowmarsh suffered from a mini crime wave.

Thieves entered the premises of George Absolon, a farmer, living at The Old Gardener's Arms (now a private house) on the corner of Benson Lane and The Street and had stolen two shirts, two chemises and five pairs of stockings which had been left on the line in the enclosed court at the back of the premises. What was strange was that Mr Absolon's dog, a very large, fierce one, was sleeping in the yard, but he did not bark at any time. It was thought that the thieves were

known to the dog: in fact they left a candle and matches next to the dog without waking him and were therefore thought to be familiar with the premises.

About an hour later the same gang broke into the cottage where one of Mr Charles Hedges' servants lived and stole a pair of shoes (nearly new) and 3lb (1.5 Kg) of cheese.

After a delay of two days, Superintendent Moran from Wallingford Police Force was finally informed. He had a reputation of being the Sherlock Holmes of his day and had a fine record of arrests. He rushed over to Crowmarsh and visited both crime scenes, but for once his powers of deduction deserted him and he was unable to solve these two dastardly crimes. But he did suggest that Mr Absolon replace his dog, which was duly done.

What happened to the somnolent dog is not recorded!

Thames Path closure

The District Council has written to the Environment Agency expressing concern that repairs to the pedestrian bridge across the Thames at Benson weir will not be completed before 2026.

Diversion signs and maps are in place during the closure, but Bygone Boating based at the Benson marina are running a passenger ferry service across the river daily between the Riverside Café and Benson lock while the bridge is closed. This will normally run from 9.30am to 6pm, but it is a good idea to call 07375 677823 before setting off on your walk to check that the ferry will be running.





Parish council notes

Parish council notes

Crowmarsh Parish Council met on Thursday 3rd August 2023 at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall. Those present were Councillors John Griffin, Stephen Sherbourne, Julia Streete, Andrew Johnson and Julian Park, District Councillor Andrea Powell and four members of the public. Cllr Andrew Nesbitt has resigned from the council.

Councillor Julian Park took notes as Parish Clerk Sue Rance, Finance Officer Yvonne Peet had sent apologies for absence.

Public comment

A resident noted that closure of the village shop had been a loss to the community and proposed that a community larder be started, using food sourced by the SOFEA organisation in Didcot, who distribute surplus food from supermarkets. There is a similar scheme already in Cholsey. A meeting has taken place and a parish councillor will be asked to join the group to work up a detailed proposal for consideration.

A resident asked for her letter of objection to the development proposal at 6 The Limes, already sent to SODC, to be noted.

Matters from the previous meeting

A reply from Bloor Homes about locating a new dog waste bin at French Gardens was awaited.

Cllr Bloomfield had been asked for a contribution from his County Councillor Priority Fund towards resurfacing of The Street as that was being done alongside the new crossing that the parish council was paying for. The chairman has contacted him again.

Oxfordshire Highways are investigating the removal of the misleading 30mph signs on the A4074 that were erected because of the construction access to the French Gardens development.

Finance

Payments were agreed including £722.66 for mower repairs, £30 for Chiltern Society membership and £369.60 for new pads for defibrillators.

Planning

Decisions by SODC

P23/S1960/DIS 6 Wallingford Road, North Stoke OX10 6BD. Discharge of condition 4 (Tree Protection) under application reference number P22/S4382/HH (Proposed cart shed). Discharge of conditions: details agreed

P22/S4164/FUL Land east of Reading Road Wallingford OX10 9HG (Cholsey parish). Change of use of land to informal private leisure use; to include an area allocated to the open storage of non-motorised boats and the siting of a trailer storage shed (Retrospective). Refusal of planning permission

P23/S1668/N4C Blackbarn Farm, Church Lane, near Ipsden OX10 6AE. Re-use of 340sqm of farm buildings for Class E purposes. Prior approval agreed.

Consultations

P23/S2464/HH 6 Elizabeth Road, Mongewell OX10 8FQ. Single-storey rear extension. No objection, but SODC was asked to consider the impact on the immediate neighbours at 4 and 8 Elizabeth Road and potential loss of rear garden space, which tapers away from the house.

P23/S2439/FUL Jasmin, Horbury, Dunworth, Mary's & Guys Mews, The Street Crowmarsh OX10 8EJ. Installation of five air source heat pumps, each serving one dwelling. There was some question about noise from units as properties are very close together. No objection: this is in line with the council's climate policy.

P23/S2179/HH 6 The Limes, Crowmarsh Gifford. The consultation has been extended. A letter of objection to the front extension has been received from a former occupier of this property referring to the impact on the street scene and the history of the Limes. After discussion, it was agreed to add to our earlier comments by urging the planning authority to consider these points seriously when coming to their decision.

District Councillors' report

The report had been circulated and was discussed. £4 million had been received from the government to help house refugees. The council had written to the Environment Agency

and the government to protest that the closure of the Benson lock footbridge, part of the Thames Path national trail, was expected to last until 2026.

Parish councillors were encouraged to respond to the OCC Strategic Active Travel Network consultation for cycle and pedestrian routes/infrastructure by 6th August.

The district councillors' grant fund is open for applications via an online form.

A planning application has been submitted for new council offices opposite Didcot station, but there was still no update on the former council offices site in Benson Lane. It was suggested that the council should put forward again their desired outcomes for the site as comments on the joint district local plan.

There was no report from the County Councillor.

Environment and recreation

There was an update on the final stages of the pavilion improvements, which need to be finished before we can receive the last tranche of SODC grant funding. It is hoped to complete all the outstanding items quickly so the payment can be received and the project finalised.

The area for tree planting on the recreation ground needs to be decided. It was agreed to consult Matt Gulliford, the tree officer at SODC, about protection for the saplings.

It was agreed to obtain a parish noticeboard for the Cala Homes estate (CABI) and it is hoped to purchase a similar one to the other noticeboards in the parish, the location to be agreed with Cala Homes.

Traffic and transport

The Community Speedwatch trial on 1st August went well and it is hoped to repeat the exercise each Monday with a team of three. Initial indications are positive. Cllr Sherbourne will write an article for Crowmarsh News and ask for volunteers.

A meeting with Superintendent Lewis Prescott -Mayling of Thames Valley Police to discuss speeding issues and other concerns had been held on Monday 17th July. Neighbouring parish councils and other interested parties

attended and a number of follow-up actions were agreed.

It was noted that the Rights of Way officer is pursuing the request for tarmac to be laid by OCC Highways on the lower end of footpath No. 2 between Benson Lane and the French Gardens estate.

Strategic priorities

Construction of the new pedestrian crossing in The Street started on 24th July and is progressing, due to be completed in August. The council agreed to consult parishioners again in the autumn about our next set of strategic priorities.

Next meeting

The next parish council meeting will be at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 7th September 2023, starting at 7.30pm. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

DraughtBusters

One lasting effect of the pandemic is the feeling that we need to look after each other and our community a bit more. Sustainable Wallingford's response to that is to work with Cholsey Environment Champions on a new project for the winter months called DraughtBusters. Key objectives are reducing energy use, bills and CO₂ emissions.

What is a draught buster? It is someone who has been trained to identify and fix draughts in a home. We have training organised for 7th September at 7.30pm in Cholsey Pavilion. Further training dates will be organised.

Most common draughts will arise from badly fitting windows and doors, rectified in the main by applying suitable draught excluder, plus for doors and letterboxes, brush strips. If you are interested in helping your community and are handy with a screwdriver, volunteers are needed to take this project forward. Volunteers will work in pairs. There is no cold-calling involved in this project. Home owners / occupiers will come to us, responding to information sent out to local agencies, community groups and magazines.

Volunteers will need to have a basic DBS check, currently costing £18 from the government's website https://tinyurl.com/5n79x667. Pending a successful funding application, we will be able to reimburse this cost.

Also needed is an administrator to be the liaison between those wishing to have their homes draught proofed and the teams carrying out the work. Pending a successful funding application, this post could be paid.
