Past Times with David Beasley

Newnham Murren Churchyard

On a beautiful autumn afternoon my wife and I walked to Newnham Murren Churchyard. Walking around I noticed a disturbing number of people I knew buried there, a comforting observation. But there are also some people buried there who are now forgotten but ought to be remembered.

When you go into the churchyard on the left is a cross dedicated to the Hilton family, who lived at Number 2, The Lakeside, Mongewell. Henry Hilton (below) is buried here, and two of his sons are commemorated on the headstone. Both were killed in the First World War, Harold in Palestine in 1918 and Cecil died of his wounds in 1916. Cecil is buried at Meaulte Cemetery in France, where his headstone is unusual as the Portland stone it is made of is heavily coloured red. Henry never got over the loss of his two sons and died in 1919. Henry Hilton's son-in-law, Thomas Adams, was killed in March 1918. Thomas was married to Daisy Hilton, the sister of Harold and Cecil, who was an assistant teacher at Mongewell School.



Over on the west side of the churchyard, near the brick wall, is a large granite gravestone to George Inverarity Walsh, although his father Thomas Prendergast Walsh's details take up most of space on the stone, even though Thomas is not buried there. George's father was a Colonel in the Indian Army, and his grandfather fought in the Rifle Brigade at Waterloo. George was gazetted to the Leicestershire Regiment in 1888 and served with them for 20 years in Bermuda, Canada, the West Indies and South Africa. He fought in the Boer War 1900-1901 when he was mentioned in dispatches and received four campaign clasps on his South African medal. He was a member of Crowmarsh District Council and he paid in full for ten gas lamps along The Street to commemorate the Coronation of George V in 1911.

George (below) was only 46 years old when he died. The funeral was a simple one: there was none of the pageantry of a military funeral. The coffin was borne by men employed on the estate to the church and later to the graveside. He left a widow, two daughters and a son, who ran in the 1924 Olympics.



All of the graves there have a story to tell. This is only the story of two of those who are buried there, one from each end of the social scale.

Dear Friends,

There is great excitement among St Mary's Magdalene's congregation, friends and supporters.

The Church is closed!! However, after many long years of trying, at long last work began on 8th September to create a servery and toilet facility within the Church building, and is proceeding well. There is no definite date for the completion, but hopefully very early next year.

There have been some very interesting developments during the excavations along the south wall, and several 17th and 18th Century remains have been uncovered, which will be reverently reinterred in the Churchyard.

Much effort from the congregation and villagers has gone into getting this far, but it is good to remember the words of Psalm 127: "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it:" Which is a powerful reminder that human effort alone isn't enough: true success and protection come only when God is at the centre of the work.

Meanwhile our services will continue in the Pavilion and you are all welcome to attend. We are grateful for the parish council for giving us permission to use this venue and we feel that the community is being very supportive.

This support was shown in the success of our summer fund raising occasions: the concert at St Mary's Wallingford, the two history walks at Wallingford Castle and the table-top sale at last month's Community Café. Look out for future events at the Community Café and a date for the annual Quiz and Chips.

As Autumn arrives and nights shorten we remember all that God gives us in different seasons, and particularly in the Harvest season, and give thanks.

Parish council notes

Crowmarsh Parish Council met at Crowmarsh Gifford Village Hall on Thursday 4th September 2025. Present were Councillors Stephen Sherbourne (Chair), Fleur Stevenson and David Rowley, Parish Clerk Sue Rance, Finance Officer Yvonne Peet, District Councillor Andrea Powell and four members of the public.

Finance

Monthly payments were agreed including £278.40 for the annual playground inspection. The budget will be reviewed at the end of September. The Council's standing orders were reviewed and approved unamended. It was agreed to continue with our current insurers.

Planning

P25/S2210/LB 15A Benson Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford OX10 8ED. Repointing of the north, east and west elevations of the north wing, etc. Removal of non-original 1990s kitchen and replacement with a modern kitchen, etc. Listed Building Consent.

P25/S1886/LB Rectory Farm House, Church Lane, North Stoke OX10 6BQ. Retrospective application for alterations to Rectory Farmhouse and Barn. Listed Building Consent.

Consultations

P25/S2612/HH 26 Park View, Crowmarsh Gifford, Wallingford OX10 8BL. Replacement of shed with pre-fabricated garage outbuilding. Councillors declared an interest as the applicant is a former councillor.

P25/S2534/LDP 2 Lane End, Crowmarsh Gifford, Wallingford OX10 8DG. New garden room replacement for existing conservatory. Recommend approval.

P25/S2184/HH Mongewell Byre, Constitution Hill, Mongewell OX10 8BS. Proposed rear single extension and side 1.5 storey extension. No strong views.

Major developments

The Newnham Manor development legal agreement is still awaiting signature by the county council and Cllr McLauchlan will be

asked to chase this again.

There has been no news from the new owners of the Jewson site, which is now very untidy.

County Councillor's report

Cllr McLauchlan's report had been circulated. On Monday 8th September, the CEO of Oxfordshire County Council, Martin Reeves, is visiting Crowmarsh and other local parishes. The visit will focus on speeding and highway safety issues.

District Councillors' report

The District Councillors' report had been circulated and Cllr Cooper reported that designs for the Benson Mobility Hub will go out to consultation on 17th September.

Environment and recreation

The environment and recreation ground committee will meet on 15th September. As recommended by the suppliers, an additional layer of grass matting to provide extra protection will be laid under the large climbing frame and slide, which is currently out of use.

The seasonal tuck shop run by Andrew Nesbitt and Chris Strange over the summer has been popular and covered its costs.

Overgrown vegetation is being dealt with in various locations.

Strategic priorities

Three quotes had been received for replacement bus shelters: and the council agreed to accept the lowest, from Arrow Fencing. Three shelters would be ordered: one for outside the church, one at the end of Thames Mead and one opposite Home Farm. New shelters for North Stoke would be considered at a later date.

Traffic and transport

The council welcomed the recent police speed checks on Portway. The County Council is working towards reducing speed limits on main roads in the parish to 50mph and in some stretches 40mph.

Cllr Stevenson reported frequent instances of motorists failing to stop at the pedestrian crossing in The Street, despite the beacons and clear signage. Parents would like a school crossing patrol but that was not possible.

Drivers must always give way to anyone on a pedestrian crossing.

Cllr Sherbourne will continue to chase OCC to replace the obsolete vehicle-activated speed sign in North Stoke, and to permit installation of a post for a second such sign on the northbound side of Wallingford Road.

Next meeting

The next parish council meeting will be held at North Stoke Village Hall on Thursday 2nd October, starting at 7.30pm. Members of the public are very welcome to attend as always.

There are still several vacancies on the parish council. To find out more, please contact the Parish Clerk or speak to any councillor. We really need a wider diversity of membership, particularly residents of Mongewell and North Stoke and generally younger people.

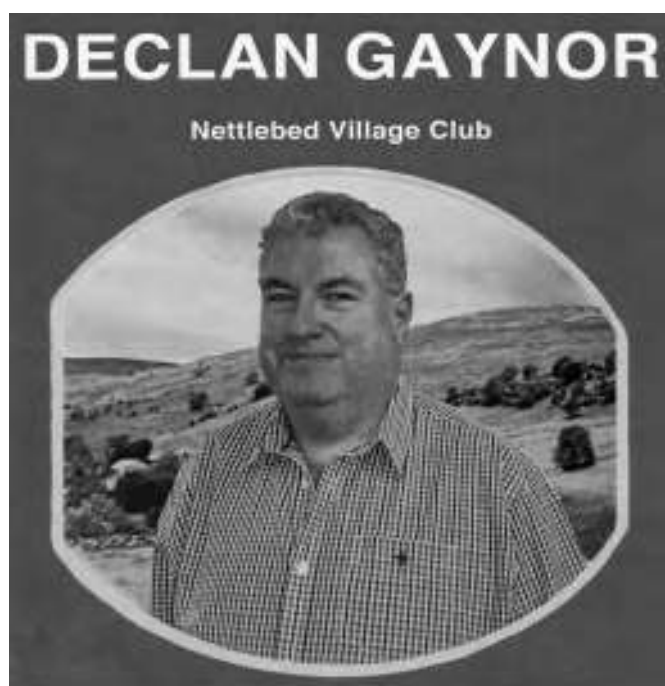

Community police visit

Date for your diary: our neighbourhood policing team will hold a "Have your say" session at the Community Café on Saturday 13th December at Crowmarsh Village Hall.

It's that time of year when the trees will be changing colour, the air is getting colder and fresher, and we can't help thinking of warm drinks, cosy clothes and playing in the crunchy leaves. It can be tempting to cut back all the dead and dying vegetation in our gardens and green spaces, but it's worth considering that many of these woody stems will become perfect winter homes for insects as they enter hibernation and can create areas of beauty in our homes and communities.

In Oxfordshire, the hedgerow species we generally recommend planting (for their capacity to provide for both people and wildlife year-round) include Blackthorn, Spindle, Common Buckthorn, Guelder Rose, Wild Privet, Cherry Plum, Dog Rose and Hazel.

Hawthorn berries have traditional use in heart-strengthening natural medicines but are also a vital source of food for caterpillars, moths and migratory birds. Spindle has vibrant autumnal pink colours and the leaves turn from a deep green to a beautiful red.

The native white, crack, pussy, osier and goat willows are a familiar sight along the Thames and tributaries. Willows provide shelter for birds, mammals, including bats, otters and water voles. Their leaves are the larval foodplant of the Purple Emperor, Large Tortoiseshell and Comma butterflies and their catkins the earliest sources of food for bees.

Trees are an important, stable long-term source of food for bees and other pollinators, providing thousands of flower heads all in one place. Plant a variety of tree species selected to benefit bees and other pollinators, with species that flower at different times of the year to provide nectar, pollen and nesting sites as well as offering a haven for other wildlife and cleaning the air and water and storing carbon. www.wildoxfordshire.org.uk/guidance/tree-planting-guidance

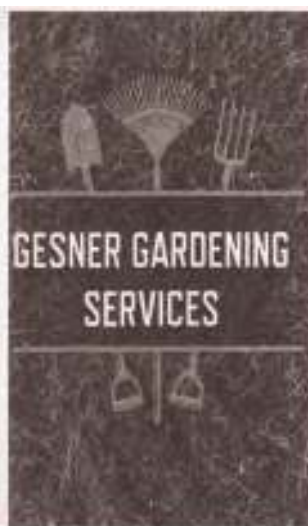
